AN OVERLY DEFENSIVE STRATEGY
LEADS TO STAGNATION

While in these times it's hip to play it cool, on the crap table of Diplomacy you either lay your money on the line or make room for a high roller. Sitting around protecting your goodies usually results in a neighbor growing too strong for you to take on later.

The fact is that once a couple of your neighbors get together in a fighting alliance that swings, they are not likely to break-up a good thing when there are enemies around to fight. In the ultimate, while you sit watching their action, you're going to be their next prey.

Imagine first the position of Germany in a French/Russian alliance against England; Germany is squeezed. With a French/German alliance against England, if Russia doodles in Scandinavia, he will shortly be pounced on by Germany while France moves East against Italy. The result is similar when Russia and Germany blast England, or in an English/Russian alliance against Germany: France is vulnerable.

Maintaining an equality of power with your neighbors requires you to jump when you see two of them about to axe a third. Your choices of action are one or a combination of the following:

1. Break-up the detente.
2. Gobble a goodly piece of the victim.
3. Help the victim.
4. Make gains elsewhere.

These maneuvers may be delicate. For example, you may appear to be helping the victim, but only to the point where he is indefensible against you. Then give him the coup de grace.

Beware of attacking a good ally unless you have an equally good one to move with afterwards. And don't just lunge out against an ally, create some provocation so you are not totally without justification -- later you may need his help, and lubricating the shaft facilitates relations in Diplomacy, too.
