### HOOSIER ARCHIVES DEMONSTRATION GAME (The Old and New Lions Game, 1973BI)

For our third demonstration game, I think we have assembled an even more outstanding cast than either the Grudge Game or Aces Game. It certainly ought to be more balanced and interesting. Among its stars are two old veterans to our demonstration games, two expert players of long standing, two rapidly rising new stars, and even the game's inventor himself. It should be a fascinating game to watch and learn from.

To increase the spectator interest, the game will run under a strict two week schedule except for Spring 1981 which will have a three week deadline to allow for initial negotiations. To further speed the pace of the game, we are starting a new system where the players will be asked to submit conditional spring moves along with their winter builds. This system was recommended by our expert analyst, Doug Beyerlein, since there are usually not many variables to consider during the winter season. Incidentally, Doug's running game analysis should be quite educational as he is an outstanding player and was a veteran of the past two Hoosier Archives games. We may even have commentary from time to time from Brenton Ver Ploeg, the winner of the Aces Game and the top man in many rating systems. So follow along with the experts.

Last but not least, a press release war will be aided and abetted as usual by Queen Suzanne. We already know that the forever-thwarted Laborkid has a score to settle. Will he be put down for the third time in a row?

An introduction to the players follows. Phone numbers follow the name, and addresses appear in the mailing list that follows. Positions were determined by chance with Queen Suzanne enticing little Prince William, alias the Son of HA, to grasp little colored cubes out of a box. He had quite a time! (Poor William--already his daddy has his doing Pippy projects....CA)) Incidentally, the winner of the game will receive possession of, and have his name engraved on, the traveling Hoosier Archives trophy. Whoever wins twice gets to keep it, Edi. So go to it!

#### OLD AND NEW LIONS GAME (1973BI) Winter 1980

AUSTRIA: Arnold Fagts. (714) 833-9542. Arn is one of the new stars on the Diplomacy horizon today. Due to his recent record, he has already moved up to 9th place on the latest FDOD Rating List and placed on the 2nd board of the latest Archives Publishers Poll (APP). He is also one of the hobby's greatest tacticians and is well known for his articles and work on stalemate positions.

SWITZERLAND: Edi Uirsan. (914) 226-4908. Edi needs no introduction. He is the only player in postal Diplomacy history whose win total numbers in double figures. One of those was the Grudge Game. His excellence as a player is documented by being at the top of the Caldwells Point Count Rating List and the latest Beyerlein Player Poll (1977).

CANADA: Michael Riccaora. (416) 777-7000, Ext. 184. Mike is putting together one of the fastest winning records in the history of the hobby. He has won 3 games

in about the same number of months, the last being a real blitz with Austria in only 5 game years. He is already 4th on the BROB Rating List and is at the top of the 2nd board in the latest APP.

GERMANY: Randy Bytwerk. (312) 475-5741. Randy has been well-known as an outstanding player for the last couple of years. He ranks high in almost every rating system, some examples being: 2nd on the BROB Rating List (he was the first player to crack the 90% barrier), 4th on the latest Rogue's Gallery, and 10th on the ODD Rating List.

ITALY: Len Lakofka. (312) 275-7150. Len is one of the original veterans of the Hoosier Archives demonstration games. He is well qualified to play, too. His 4 wins have made possible such honors as 3rd on the latest Average CPCRL, 4th in the latest EPP, and 5th in the Average Rogue's Gallery List. Len also GM's more games than I care to count!

RUSSIA: Peter Rosamilia. (201) 679-4475. Although not as active of late, and therefore probably not as widely known as his ability warrants, Pete is a lion of a player. The fact that he is on the 3rd board of the CPCRL shows that he has a goodly number of wins to his credit. And the quality of those wins are amply attested to by the fact that Pete is 5th on the ODD Rating List.

TURKEY: Allan Calhauer. (312) 482-8644. It's quite an honor to have the inventor of Diplomacy as one of the players in this game. Allan's only finished postal game started nearly 10 years ago and it went down as one of the early greats. Allan nearly won it playing Germany, the board's most difficult power, in spite of the fact that a husband and wife team were playing Russia and Austria.

FIRST STANDBY: Eric Verheiden. (503) 549-3771. Eric is another rising newcomer on the Diplomacy scene--so new in fact that only one of his games has finished play. Nevertheless, Eric has established himself as a giant of a tactician and article writer as the article in this issue attests to. We will be using the old Grudge Game system again, where Eric makes moves for every country every turn to prevent "NMR" in case of a miss.

SPRING 1901 ORDERS are due not later than noon (9:00 A.M. for phone calls) on Saturday, 12 May 1973. It should be noted that no Hoosier Archives will come out before then. While the players are getting their extra week to negotiate, I will be taking law finals. Trade, anyone?

#### BULK MAILING OF HOOSIER ARCHIVES?

As the mailing list in this issue attests to, the paid circulation of Hoosier Archives is very near the 200 mark. Actually, the total circulation has been averaging over 200 since nearly the first of the year due to samples being sent out in response to "new blood" inquiries, etc. Maybe you can imagine the chore it is to lick over 200 stamps each issue! Anyway, because of all this we are thinking of taking advantage of one of the few bargains the U.S. Postal Service still has to offer. If one is willing to sort and bundle his own mail, he can mail 200 or more identical pieces of printed matter at "bulk Rate." He can also buy a "permit imprint" for \$15.00 that gives him the right to print his own postage symbol instead of using a stamp. Then for a \$30.00 annual bulk mailing fee, he has the right to pay quite a bit less than 3¢ for every piece he mails. In our own case, I figure we could mail Hoosier Archives for about 6¢ an issue for the rest of the year. This would save us a lot of work and might even enable us to nearly break even on Hoosier Archives, and the archival base that it requires, for the first time.

Do any of you readers out there have any great objections to us doing this? I have been assured by the postal service that this method of mailing takes only a little longer than 1st class. Unfortunately, however, I will have to commit myself to the tune of \$45.00 plus ordering new imprinted Hoosier Archives back covers before we will know this for sure. Of course, this wouldn't interfere with the play of the demonstration game in any case since they will continue to get their Hoosier Archives air mail.

INTO THE ARCHIVES NO. 63

Charles Reinsel's article, "Statistics of the Postal Diplomacy Gameboard" in Hoosier Archives #91, has borne fruit. What follows is a highly thoughtful development along those lines by one of the hobby's greatest tacticians, Eric Verheiden.

RELATIVE TACTICAL VALUES OF THE DIPLOMACY COUNTRIES  
by Eric Verheiden

Recently, a number of articles have been published on the statistics of Diplomacy, principally Charles Reinsel's series, "The Statistics of the Postal Diplomacy board." While Reinsel's numbers do indeed form themselves into very attractive tables, exactly what they are all good for has not as yet been adequately explained. One problem which might conceivably be tackled with statistics is determining exactly how good the various countries are in relation to one another, at least in a general way. To do this, one should first decide exactly what makes up a good country.

Two obvious criteria are an abundance of available supply centers and a lack of opposing units. All other things being equal, an initial advantage in home supply centers should confer a corresponding advantage in a game, as will increasing numbers of units as the game progresses. Next comes a more difficult problem, determining what simplifying assumptions can be made so as to make the problem solvable. It will be assumed that all countries expand in a uniform manner, their units moving in an expanding circle from their home supply centers. Further, the opposition at any point is proportional to a weighted sum of enemy home centers according to distance from the front, multiplied by a factor which assigns an equal share of all non-absorbed neutral centers to each home center.

With that in mind, the following table has been compiled. Please note that the defensive factor is equal to the number of occupied centers at each stage of expansion divided by the number of exposed border spaces.

The figures for distances above 4 are included mainly for completeness only, since a country should win by that point, without having to expand further.

Finally, for each distance from the home supply center, form the quotient of the opposition factor and the total number of supply centers occupied at that point. Form

the sum of these quotients for each country to the point where 18 centers are occupied. For the special case of Russia (with 4 home centers as compared with 3 centers for every other country), multiply the sum by 3/4. Dividing all the sums by the Russian sum, the relative opposition factor is obtained.

The upper figures (ROF) are the relative opposition factors; the lower figures (RWT) are formed by taking the win total for each country and dividing by the Russian win total, as found in the Calhamer Point Count Rating List in Hoosier Archives #104. The lower the number in each case, the better the country. As can be seen, Austria, England and Russia do about as well as might be expected; France and Turkey do somewhat better; both Germany and Italy do considerably worse. This may be accounted for in part by factors not taken into consideration, for example, the fact that Italy, although usually a sea power, is given two armies at the start of the game instead of two fleets. Certain advantages in defensive position, in particular with Turkey (compute the defensive factors at different stages of expansion above), may account for some of the discrepancies. Finally, there is the admittedly rough nature of the figures obtained and considerations based on the typical alliance structures which arise in the course of the game.
