#### SCANDINAVIA, ENGLAND'S SPOON INLAND, OR AN IMPROVED BOARD

Scandinavia, which for the purposes of this article will mean Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Finland and St. Petersburg, is especially valuable to England. There's the obvious fact of the four centers all open to naval attack. Even better, they can be defended from land attack with only three units, thereby freeing one unit for duty elsewhere. If St. Petersburg got of Russian hands, the threat of fleets attacking England from that flank is ended.

England's main adversary is usually Russia, but Scandinavia affects every country on the board. Germany has trouble finding units to commit up there, but if either of the other two becomes dominant up north, Germany can be in trouble. Therefore, German policy is often to promote a stalemate. To France, Scandinavia is a welcome jewel to have England away from him. However, France may suddenly find England a little too strong for comfort, not to mention that Scandinavia can also be the basis of a territorial alliance when Turkey, Austria, and Italy look at Scandinavia, they see a valuable and defensible group of four centers which hurt their chances for a mid-Atlantic land victory.

If you'd prefer to try for Scandinavia with or without attacks, France will

possibly be more than willing to surrender the English Channel. That strategy would

The point is that England was always the objective of St. Petersburg, a Russian

 north, but at the expense of weakening her power. If Russia gets two million men  
 out of an army in Moscow and the rest of it to the northern front. This is less than the  
 more effective. The matter of the war is diplomatic and a French attack on England is  
 only effective.

However, Russia has very little chance of success. If she can't strike the British, Britain  
 will be a Turkish ally, and the English will be in a position. If the concentration of  
 north, she is also open to island attacks by Austrians or Germany, particularly if he  
 holds a fleet in St. Peter. Also, Germany is in a better position to do Russia more  
 than Russia is in a position to do Germany. Russia's supply routes for the  
 north are the British to 1902 in order to get Russia. Russia's supply routes for the  
 north, St. Petersburg, is open to Russian attack, while England's home centers are  
 secure from Russia.

Russia has a tendency to write off the north when things go badly up there, not  
 especially if St. Peter falls. He may pull back to an army in Moscow (he would expect  
 that if England has a fleet in St. Peter) and continue to fight in the north with a  
 secure defense in his rear.

The conclusion seems to be that if England doesn't negotiate in his favor, makes the  
 proper diplomatic arrangements, and makes the proper tactical moves, he has a good  
 chance to gain his "Second Island" and will have a firm base from which to try for a  
 win.

The percentage of total people has somewhat shifted over to the foreign countries since my last article. As a matter of fact, it has more than doubled. THE INTERNATIONAL RATING LIST

The 1968 rating list is maintained and edited by Jeff Power, 521 Sixth Street, Westport City, Michigan 49681. Inquiries and corrections should be addressed there. The list is published by Bill Hamilton and can be obtained only from him.

For the benefit of the individual, the BRILL rating list orders players by a percentage score determined from the formula  $R = \frac{S}{G} - \frac{20(S/60)(1 - \frac{S}{G})}{G}$ .  $R$  is the number of completed regular postal replacement games for which that player is the player of record,  $S$  is the cumulative score in points from those  $R$  games. In each game a player receives 1 point for every player having done worse than he and gives away a point to every player having done better. Players having done equally well exchange no points. Games in a game are ordered as follows: win, draw, success according to the number of supply containers, elimination according to the season and year. Since the zero is added to  $R$ , the initial eliminated player is -1, and so on. The term  $(1 - \frac{S}{G})$  decreases as the fraction of a point which the player on average has exchanged per opponent in the games. The term  $(1 - \frac{S}{G})$  is a correction to balance the wide variances characteristic of the average score of a player rated on the basis of only a few games. It appears as  $1 - \frac{S}{G}$  in the original rating and has been replaced by  $1 - \frac{S}{G}$  in this revised rating. A typical rating in the list might read 100.0 10 100.0. The first two figures from left to right are respectively the percentage score, the games, and the number of wins.

When a victory is played by one of many replacement players, the player of record is determined in the following way. Any score of 5 or less is credited to the original player and every 5 or greater is credited to the latest replacement player of that number. A score of 1, 2, or 4 is given to the latest replacement player whose score one would expect; otherwise it goes to the original player.

Only active players are included in this listing, to the best of my knowledge. Some past records are available, and I depend on you to provide information leading to the further correction and improvement.

THE MCCALLUM SYSTEM OF NOTATION

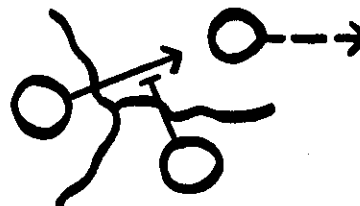
For ease in following the current demonstration game, a Diplomacy map is reproduced on the reverse side by permission of John Moot, the President of GRI. Incidentally, DIPLOMACY is a registered trademark for a game invented by Allan B. Calhaver and copyrighted by Games Research Inc., 500 Harrison Avenue, Boston, Mass. 02118. GRI sells the game for \$8.95 and the 1971 Rulebook for \$1.

To best follow the game and hopefully learn something from it, since it is being played and analyzed by experts, I would like to suggest to you the use of a recording system that was first proposed to me by John McCallum.

First of all, you will need seven crayons in the following colors: red (Austria), purple (England), blue (France), black (Germany), green (Italy), brown (Russia), and yellow (Turkey).

Now to use the McCallum system, you take this map, which is provided with each of the spring and fall seasons, and record the armies with a circle of the appropriate color and the fleets with a line. For the winter season, simply take the fall map and make square brackets around a unit built and round brackets around a unit removed.

Also, a good way to go from one season to another is to indicate an attack with an arrow and a support with a line and bar as illustrated. Additionally, an unsuccessful order or retreat can be indicated by a dotted line.
