SCANDIMARIA, ENGLAND'S SPARING ISLAND, OR AN INVALUABLE PRIZE by Howard Meister

Scandimavia, which for the purposes of this article will mean Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Finland and St. Petersburg, is especially valuable to England. There's the obvious fact of the four centers all open to naval attack. Even better, they can be inferiorized from land attack with only three units, thereby freeing one unit for duty elsewhere. Throw St. Petersburg out of Russian hands, the thrust of fleets attacking England from that flank is ended.

England's main adversary is usually Russia, but Scandimavia affects every country on the board. Germany has trouble finding units to commit up there, but if either or the other two becomes dominant up north, Germany can be in trouble. Therefore, German policy is often to promote a stalemate. To France, Scandimavia is a welcome jewel to bore England away from him. However, France may suddenly find England a little too strong for comfort, not to mention that Scandimavia can also be the basis of a German-French alliance. When Turkey, Austria, and Italy look at Scandimavia, they see a very well protected group of four centers which limit their chances for a wide-spread land invasion.

To repeat, whether to say for Scandimavia with or without Denmark, I don't know.

The Northern sector consists of all the states north of Virginia and east of Ohio, including West Virginia. The South is made up of all the states south of Virginia, Tennessee, and Oklahoma, including Virginia and Texas. Anything west of Texas, Kansas, Nebraska, and the Dakotas, including Alaska and Hawaii, are in the West, and the rest of the states make up the Central area.

THE MIDWESTERN RACING LIST

The 1958 racing list is maintained and edited by Bert Powers, 521 Vista Street, Harrison City, Michigan 44427. Inquiries and complaints should be addressed there. It is not published by Bell Publishing and can be obtained only from him.

For the benefit of the unfamiliar, the Bell racing list orders players by a performance score determined from the formula $R = \frac{P}{2} + \frac{S}{100}(100)(1 - \frac{P}{100})$. P is the number of recognized regular round handicap games the player has played at 100%. The term S is the cumulative score in points from three P games. In such case a player would be rated if he were playing better than he had given away, or equal to every player having done better. Players having done equally well receive no points. Scores are as a rule also ordered as follows: win, draw, survival, especially in the number of recognized wins/losses, elimination according to the season and year, losses, the season's record of the latest eliminated player is -2, and so on. The term $(1 - \frac{P}{100})$, therefore is the fraction of a point which the player on average has + or - against your opponent in one game. The term $(1 - \frac{P}{100})^2$ is a correction to balance the wide variances characteristic of the average score of a player rated on the basis of 100% of games. It applies to both K-tournaments (regular and handicap), and to the K-tournament of seasonal rating, a typical rating is the first night each week. The last term $\frac{S}{100}$ will be right as represented the percentage rank, i.e., 100% and 100% of wins.

When a racing is played by one or more replacement players, the player of record is eliminated to the following way: any score + or less is assigned to the original player; otherwise + or greater is assigned to the latest replacement player of that racing. A score of -1, 0, or +1 is given to the latest replacement player unless a replacement would improve; otherwise it goes to the original player.

THE MCCALLUM SYSTEM OF NOTATION


For ease in following the current demonstration game, a Diplomacy map is reproduced on the reverse side by permission of John Moot, the President of GRI. Incidentally, DIPLOMACY is a registered trademark for a game invented by Allan B. Calhamer and copyrighted by Games Research Inc., 500 Harrison Avenue, Boston, Mass. 02118. GRI sells the game for \$8.95 and the 1971 Rulebook for \$1.

To best follow the game and hopefully learn something from it, since it is being played and analyzed by experts, I would like to suggest to you the use of a recording system that was first proposed to me by John McCallum.

First of all, you will need seven crayons in the following colors: red (Austria), purple (England), blue (France), black (Germany), green (Italy), brown (Russia), and yellow (Turkey).

Now to use the McCallum system, you take this map, which is provided with each of the spring and fall seasons, and record the armies with a circle of the appropriate color and the fleets with a line. For the winter season, simply take the fall map and make square brackets around a unit built and round brackets around a unit removed.

Also, a good way to go from one season to another is to indicate an attack with an arrow and a support with a line and bar as illustrated. Additionally, an unsuccessful order or retreat can be indicated by a dotted line.
