#### ANNOUNCEMENTS

Most of the above publications are still available through their respective publisher. It is strongly recommended that the publisher in question be contacted first since if he has the back issues available that you want, he can provide you with an original that is both clearer and cheaper than a copy from Hoosier Archives which is mainly a service to provide copies of unavailable back issues.

For an excellent list of current Diplomacy publications with name and addresses of the editor in question write John McCallum, P.O. Box 52, Ralston, Alberta, Canada and ask him for a copy of Serendip #58. He should be able to provide you with a copy for about 15¢.

The most complete review of the entire literature of postal Diplomacy ever written and current to May 1969 was published by Rod Walker, 5058 Hawley Blvd, San Diego, CA 92116. This "Bibliologia" was published in Erehwon, III, 9-10 and the price of these two 'zines is 80¢ by First class mail through their editor. Mr. Walker also published a survey of Dippy 'zines in Numenor 2 of 19 Dec. 69 that were then currently publishing, just starting, or recently folded. It is available through Mr. Walker for 30¢ first class mail.

## OUT OF THE GRAVEYARD REVISITED

In Erehwon, III, 5 of 23 Dec. 1968, Rod Walker started a series called "Out of the Graveyard." Its purpose was to summarize the contents and life history of various defunct Dippy 'zines. During the course of this series, three 'zines were reviewed that are now contained in Hoosier Archives. They are Aceldama, Laurania, and Viny Victors. All these 'zines were published by John McCallum and should be available from him for a cent a page. I now propose to "borrow" from Mr. Walker's research and re-review these 'zines. Anyone who wishes to get them should first contact Mr. McCallum.

ACELDAMA was a continuation of Armedgeddonia which was edited by Charles Turner and published by James Dygert. It was published to finish the last of Armedgeddonia's games, 1967AT and 1967AY. The former was brought to completion; the latter was cancelled when all but two of its players ceased sending moves. All issues were mimeo, on buff-colored paper, printed on both sides (where there is more than one page). Several issues featured correspondence sections and print-outs of the Calhamer Rating System.

LAURANIA was to have been a general Diplomacy 'zine appearing at irregular intervals. Both issues were printed by mimeo on both sides of buff-colored paper. # 1, 15 May 1969, 8 pp., carried articles on the 'zine itself, Crypto-Diplomacy, the names of Dippy 'zines, and miscellaneous subjects (on the basis of letters received by Mr. McCallum). # 2, 20 June 1969, 18 pp., reprinted the 1958 rules for Diplomacy and a number of letters and statistical items.

VINY VICTORS was the follow-on of Jutland Jollies. JJ was published by Derek Nelson and Bob Lake of Ontario, Canada and was the only Canadian Diplomacy journal (with the exception of Nemedian

Chronicles) not published by John McCallum. Vimy Victors was on light green paper, mimeo, both sides.
