



Hoosier Archives is a periodic listing of the Diplomacy archives of Walter Buchanan, R. R. 3, Lebanon, Indiana 46052, telephone (317) 482-2824; Archives Director, N37GBDD; a Director of The Diplomacy Association; and a member of IFWDS. Since the archives is virtually complete in at least xerox form back to 1966, the archives listing will only appear quarterly, the last being in issue #35, or as further substantial additions are acquired. However, additions to the archives are solicited, either through originals, which are preferred, or a loan to permit xeroxing. Also, postage fees will be paid for duplicates so that they can be made available to others. Many original spares are now available. The main purpose of Hoosier Archives is to make available information from the archives, such as Diplomacy articles, game news, etc., as well as to serve as a medium for original articles, which are solicited. To subscribe to Hoosier Archives, send one stamped, self-addressed business size envelope per issue. For back issues, only a stamp per issue is necessary. INTO THE ARCHIVES NO. 13

As mentioned in the last issue, Hoosier Archives is taking over the Calhamer Point Count Rating List. It appears below as updated since the last time John McCallum published the list in Pfenning-Halbpfenning #1 on 7 September 1971. In honor of the occasion, Edi Lirsan has written an article analyzing the changes in the ratings that have occurred over the past two years. It is a coincidence to note that after this article was written, Edi surpassed John Smythe in the ratings to lead the pack. This is the first time John hasn't been in first place on the list since its inception. Congratulations, Edi. (I bet all the girls at the office are proud of you, Edi!)

TWO STATISTICAL YEARS by Edi Lirsan

It has been about two years since SerenDip #19 was published in September 1969. Since that time, the number of postal Diplomacy games completed has exactly doubled from 86 to 172. In looking at the Calhamer Rating system for the past two years, the following seem to be true for the mass of postal play:

1. The combination of Russia and Turkey will dominate the ratings, with Turkey probably eventually upsetting Russia for the number 1 slot by the end of another year.
2. France is slowly gaining on England for the number 3 slot.
3. The English have lost the greatest amount of ground relative to the other countries. If we were to give a rough calculation of the English growth in the past two years, it would be the lowest, for while the number of games played has increased by a factor of 2, the total English score has gone up by only a factor of 1.66.
4. In the last three spots, Italy, Germany and Austria will probably continue to fall farther and farther behind the leaders with a slight reshuffling of Italy's cellar position.

When we look at the player list, the first thing we notice is that it has grown from 52 to 91 people rated. Yet the top and low scores haven't changed much: in 1969, the range was 6:20 to 0:12; in 1971, 8:20 to 0:10. Andy Phillips has come from no-where two years ago to score 5:34 points, the greatest gain for the two years, followed by John Beshara with +5:12, Charles Turner with +5:10, Edi Lirsan with +4:10 and Hal Naus with +3:10.

In both lists, the number of people above one win and with one win or less was about the same in relation to the number of players. More than half the players with one win two years ago have gone on to greater glory while the other half represent mostly inactive players such as Tom Griffin and Bruce Pelz. So, it may be said that your first win is your hardest...afterwards, things may become much easier.

So much for two years of ratings. In the next year, we can expect not too much change in country lists but the player list will see winners winning more and more with many changes in relative positions.

RECENTLY COMPLETED GAMES

The following 14 games are added to the Calhamer Point Count Rating List appearing below. This brings the total games rated to 186 as compared to the 172 Edi analyzed. The winner and his country appear after the applicable Boardman number. Multiple names after the same number indicate a draw.

AVERAGE POINT COUNT RATING SYSTEM

This is the new system as suggested by Allan Calhamer and modified as explained in the last issue. Briefly, it works as follows: The Calhamer Point Count Rating List score is

divided by the number of games for which the player in question is rated, and only players with three or more games rated are included. It should also be noted that the data used to compile this rating system is taken from Numsnor and may therefore differ slightly from the data used to compile the Calhamer Point Count Rating List. Draws are not included.
