A Guide To The GM-Part 3, by Len Lakofka (Gamesmaster/Player Communication Insurance)

I. Responsibility of the GM

A. The GM must be very careful to keep his address lists up to date. He should publish a full list every 6 months at a minimum. He should publish COA's in and with the GAME—somewhere in the zine unless reference to that location is given in the body of the GAME text. That COA or note should be next to that player's name—not at the beginning or end of the game text. When a substitute enters the game, be sure the sub and the players know each other's addresses! This is easy to overlook.

B. The CM should request phone #s of players and publish them for player reference. His own phone # should be given along with favorable times to call—never promise to be home at a particular time!

C. The GM must type or print his address labels (or equivalent) clearly, and if there is a delay in mailing, the deadline should be adjusted.

II. Player to GM Communication

A. By mail.

1) File at least two sets of moves on two separate days-use carbon paper-don't copy, you will make errors. Date and sign all orders: 2) Do not send in a change of one or two pieces—send in a whole new set. 3) Use 8 xll paper typed or printed, if at all possible. 4) Do not put orders in the body of letters or on two sides of a sheet of paper. 5) Use a stamped-self-addressed post card as a receipt from the GM that orders have arrived. 6) Do not use certified mail! GMs are often not home when letters arrive and most GMs will not travel to the post office just to pick up your orders! 7) Use Air Mail to all metropolitan areas over 300 miles away if the deadline is 3 or fewer days away. Always use air mail to Hawaii, Alaska and Canada! 8) File one set as soon as the zine arrives! You can always change the moves later.

B. By Phone.

1) Avoid this system at all cost! GMs, believe it or not, do have lives of their own. ((Right on, Len! Right on!)) Being late for a deadline cannot be protested because you couldn't reach the GM by phone. This is play by mail Diplomacy!

C. Insurance.

1) Sealed Orders prevent misses. The GM opens them if no moves arrive and follows them (or calls up another local player to make moves from these orders). 2) Prescribed

substitute. The GM will call (at player's expense) a substitute if no moves arrive—He'll call you first, of course. The GM may require a deposit of a few dollars to cover these calls. 3) GM will call player when moves arrive by making a person to person call to himself. That is the GM will call the player and ask for himself. Obviously, he's not there so the player knows the orders have arrived! Careful though—"Ma Bell" can get upset if you try that too often!!

III. GM to Player.

A. Air Mail Fee. This gives a little better service—but not much. Fee: \$1.50—\$2.50 extra.

B. Double Results Method. GM mails two copies of all results—not necessarily two zines. Fee: \$1.00/10 copies or a flat fee.

C. Player sends a SSA Post Card with GM's name on it to GM. When GM sends the zine, he encloses the card. If the GM receives no card in 7 days, he sends another zine and bills the player (or a \$1 deposit). The player can arrange to send orders or a post card himself as soon as zine arrives. The GM will mail a second zine if orders or card do not arrive in 7-10 days!

It is up to the GM which of these he will or will not use. These methods are necessary because of late/lost mail and poor Western Union methods!

IMPROVEMENTS COMING UP IN IMPASSABLE!

Combining Len's lessons and the results of the poll in the last issue, it is obvious that changes are desired by both the readers and this editor/publisher/gamesmaster. Our primary concern last issue was to improve our gamesmastering. We think that we have printed one issue without errors as we haven't received any complaints. However, instead of sticking in little pink slips (a pun?) we will now endeavor to double our efforts in catching typing errors as they occur. We have not been making errors on adjudications, but we have been typing them out poorly—like forgetting a unit, or not underlining.

Future improvements will be in the area of contents and in improving the general layout of this zine. Another improvement will be contemplated in having the dead-line on Friday to cut publishing time.

THE SOLUTION TO PUZZLE #8

By having it on Friday, we can avoid the problem of Sunday not being a day for the post office. When we were on time, we mailed Impassable on Saturday, when we were late, we mailed it on Monday because of Sunday. Even with mailing on Saturday, you lost a day because of Sunday. Thus, Friday would give you another two-three days to negotiate. As a matter of fact, I will start doing this with #10, and we'll see how that works out.

What services will we offer to the players? We will call collect, if you authorize us to do so, whenever you miss sending in orders. We like the idea of some of the players who send a post card along with their orders for us to return and prove that we received the orders. We accept general orders, and we will airmail your copies of Impassable if you'll send us a deposit to cover the postal difference.

A method we are now trying in hopes of being more prompt with Impassable is to type as much as we can of each issue prior to the game deadlines. In fact, we are typing this on Saturday, August 26. If we were allowed to type up the propaganda together and separate from the orders, we could do these beforehand also, but we want to keep them with the game reports. We don't have the complete returns on our poll, but we have enough replies to establish trends. The major overall result is that everyone wants more non-game material to read like articles on tactics, etc. Also, nobody wants me to start any more games! If you want more articles and the like, you may have to accept a limit on press releases. With perhaps 10 games, we will have to limit coverage of each game to a page. This will leave us two pages which is not enough. might have to limit press releases to about one-half of a page. However, I can be flexible as I can look at all the press releases received and judge the total space needed. Some games will sometimes not have any press releases. All I can say is that you should write in smaller sections with different bylines so that I can eliminate one or two, if necessary. You can, for that matter, establish a "pecking order" for me to go by. Otherwise, I won't be able to tell which press release is more important.

It looks as if #10 of Impassable may be a super issue in celebration of our tenth issue. The way I look at it, if I must go over an ounce, I might as well as go to two ounces or 24 pages! Don't get all too excited as this is only my current thinking.

I was going to give just the answer, but since nobody got the correct answer, I will give the solution, long though it is.

The men needed half a day to travel 5 miles from Sonoita, deposit lo days rations at the 5 mile pt., and return to Sonoita. Then, they needed 1 full day to travel 20 miles: they journeyed to the 10 mile pt., deposited l_2^1 days' rations there, and returned to Sonoita, consuming ½ day's rations at the 5 mile pt., where they left the remaining 1 day's rations. Thus far, the men have spent one and a half days and established 1 day's rations at the 5 mile pt. and lo days' rations at the 10 mile pt.. Next, they traveled 20 miles in 1 day carrying 2 days' rations of which they consumed 1 day's rations and left 1 day's rations at the 20 mile pt. On their re-/ turn trip, which took one day, they consumed ½ day's rations at both the 10 and 5 mile pts., leaving 2 day's rations at the 5 mile pt. and 1 day's rations at the 10 mile pt. Now, you can see their method as they progress further and further as they establish caches of food along the way. The expedition then went 30 miles in $1\frac{1}{2}$ days; finally, they made their 50 mile journey using the food caches along the way. All told, they took 18 days to complete their expeditions. There isn't any puzzle this issue, but we will probably make up in the next issue, and we will present a tough, but perhaps a familiar puzzle (so tough I solved it only once myself) to some of you.

NSG--"Cupcakeville," Lenard who?? Rome, 1 April, 1902-Rumors have reached this capital city concerning the existence of a pretender to the Italian throne. A sometimes cabaret performer and all the time charlatan by the name of Hubert Horatio Humdinger has been quoted in certain foreign press as claiming to be the real power in Italy. King Ernesto il Ginzo has ordered a country-wide search to find and eliminate this potentially disruptive factor. The King stated that if Humdinger were found alive, he would be exiled to France where his irrational governmental decrees would represent an improvement in the caliber of leadership.

RRINGG—"Hallo, Minister? This is the Kaiser. Why did you order those two armies east? I thought we were going to attack Italy." "Sorry, sir, my secretary was at fault. She reads her shorthand notes wrong and typed 'east' instead of 'south' on the stencil. I had her replaced, so it won't happen again." "Okay, but don't let it happen again. Venice, 15 April, 1902—Italians in this city were just recovering from the brutal attack by German and French forces. King Ginzo immediately moved to patch relations with the neighboring Austrians and extended his declaration of war to cover the aggressing Germans. In view of the continuing hostilities which have enveloped Europe, the King proposed a Federated European Counter Enmity Session to iron out problems that plague the nations of Europe. The King stated that if enough advance warning was given, he would offer the facilities of the city of Marseilles for the meetings. Vienna(LRV)-April 17, 1902-The Dictator today announced the declaration of War he prepared last night against Germany and Turkey. He said that this was decided upon because of the three-way alliance of the Western Powers. With the help of the forces of Italy and Russia, this alliance can easily be stopped. He stressed the word easily since there are already rumors of dissent from that three-way alliance, but

the specific parties were not mentioned. Let us hope that France watches her borders.

Winter Palace—After a meeting lasting far into the night, the Imperial Russian General Staff ordered the 2nd Army to move to the province of Silesia in order to end German aggression in that area. Noting the recent German expansion in the armed forces and the German interference in Russian affairs in Sweden, the General Staff informed Queen Ruby of Begonia that war with Germany seemed eminent. Sources in the Foreign Office confirmed reports that Diplomatic contact had been broken by the Germans despite many attempts by the Russian government to establish contact.

Italy, Dec. 21, 1901—This past year,
though tragic, war has been brought forth
onto the European Continent. The Italian
Government is pleased that, even though
we didn't want war, Italy was prepared for
war, and in the major skirmishes of the
first year, the Italian forces were
victorious. Because of Italy's overwhelming victories, the Dictator of Italy
today announced his plan for the expansion
of the Italian Military. It is expected
that by mid or late winter, the Italian
Army will have been increased by 50%, and


