JIHAD Rules for Bourse

by Glenn Overby, with special acknowledgements to Tom Swider & John Marsden

- <u>Bourse</u> is a companion game to a game of regular <u>Diplomacy</u>. Any person regularly receiving JIHAD may play by paying the gamefee UNLESS they are in the attached Dip game. No player may play in both a Bourse and its attached Dip game.
- 2. The object of Bourse is to accumulate the most Victory Points by buying and selling currencies of the 7 <u>Diplomacy</u> countries so as to amass the largest holdings of the countries that finish strongest in the Dip game.
- 3. Each player starts with 1000 units of each nation's currency Crowns, Pounds, Francs, Deutschmarks, Lire, Roubles, and Piastres - plus 1000 US Dollars. At gamestart, 1 unit of any national currency = \$1US.
- 4. The play of the game consists of buying and selling the currencies of the various countries. During each season (Spring, Fall, and/or separated

Winter) players may:

a. SELL currencies of any number of nations at current market price (hereafter CMP), receiving US\$ for same; and/or

b. BUY currencies of any number of nations at CMP, paying for them with US\$ in their account or received for current turn sales.

Restrictions on buying and selling:

- a. Players may not SELL more than 500 units of any currency in a single turn.
- b. Players may not BUY currencies unless they have enough US\$ on account and/or realized from sales this turn to pay the tab.

  c. Players may not deal in fractional amounts of any currency except
- 6. At the end of each season, the GM will calculate a new CMP for each national currency. The CMP will <u>rise</u> by 1¢ for each 100 units of <u>net</u> <u>purchases</u> in a currency that season, or <u>drop</u> by 1¢ for each 100 units of <u>net sales</u> of a currency that season. Fractions of 100 units are not considered in these adjustments. Examples:
- a. Players bought 1500 Lire and sold 700 Lire, making <u>net</u> purchases of 800 Lire total. The Lira's CMP goes up 8¢ for next season.
  b. Players bought no Crowns, but sold 1999, making net sales of 1999
- Crowns. The Crown's CMP drops 19¢.
- 7. Before each <u>Winter</u> season only, the CMP of all currencies is further adjusted according to the net supply center change by that country from the preceding Winter. Countries that gain SCs have their currencies rise, and those that lose SCs have currencies drop, by the following amounts: 3¢ for 1 center, 8¢ for 2 centers, 15¢ for 3 or more centers. These counts are based upon the SC situation before retreats.
- 8. There is no maximum limit on CMP. The minimum CMP for a currency is i¢ as long as the country survives; however, when a country is eliminated, all trading in its currency is halted and the currency becomes worthless.
- 9. Victory is determined at the end of the <u>Diplomacy</u> game by computing each player's Victory Points as follows: the number of centers held by a country multiplied by the number of 100-unit blocks of that currency held by a player equals VPs received for that country. The total of the VPs received by a player for all surviving countries determines the player's final placement.
- 10. Note that the "value" of currencies at game's end has no bearing on victory; and that US\$, while necessary during play, are worthless in meeting victory requirements.
- 11. There are no NMRs in Bourse, nor are there standbys. Players who do not submit orders are assumed to be standing pat on their portfolio.

12. Players may join the Bourse at ANY TIME, by paying gamefee and starting with 1000 units of each surviving country, plus only 500 US\$.

# <u>Game Review #7 - Empyrean Challenge</u>

Empyrean Challenge (Superior Simulations, 524 Franklin Park Circle, Boise, ID 83709) is one of the best of the new games in the fastest-growing area of the postal games hobby - computer-moderated games.

 $\underline{EC}$  in its original form is a 150 player game (!). There are 15 players on each of the ten racial homeworlds; they strive for control of a galactic cluster containing 100 solar systems and 500-700 planets.

Obviously, the game is science-fiction oriented - and incredibly detailed. It is a game of economic management as much as (if not more than) military strategy and tactics. Keeping track of your farming, mining, and manufacturing capabilities, plus monitoring your resources, collecting intelligence on other players/systems, and waging war or diplomacy as needed is a pretty tough task at times (as is deciphering a 5 page printout on the above when you pick up a standby slot). However, the game by its scope offers more potential rewards to a player who has the time than any other computer SF game presently out.

The rules for EC cost \$5.89, and the fee for each turn is \$4.00. Turns presently run each six weeks or so.

This game is not recommended if you already feel overloaded - but if you have lots of time (and not a little money), it's a very worthwhile gaming experience. If you inquire to the company about EC, the man to contact is Vern Holford. Tell him I sent you.

Tetrazzini set out for Serbia across the mountains, proceeding to split tires, break axles, run out of gas, and back one jeep over a cliff. - St. Petersburg The Tsar wishes to make it quite clear that he knows who the trouble-makers in Europe really are, and recommends that the Austrians get their just deserts ASAP. Even the Tsar (noble, benevolent, and kind-hearted man that he is) can be roused to wrath and the Austrian attempt to rule the world has done just that! Fear not, ye slobbering Slavic minions, for SuperTsar is on his way to save you from a fate worse than debt.
- Dublin More news of English atrocities came to light today, with the arrival in Dublin of Seamus McBlob, an Irish peasant of note. He swore on a bottle of Old Bushmills that English troops had tied up the population of a whole village in County Cork and then drank all their Guinness. As if that was not bad enough, when they could drink no more, the English Protestant Heathens broke the remaining casks over the nearest Irish heads and then marched off singing "Boggarary" and other vulgar songs. The Sultana explained this move: "Berlin will soon speak a civilized tongue; I don't need an interpreter."

Melbourne - While on his world tour, the Pope delivered a stirring speech today to an enthralled audience, who were amazed that so holy a man could possess so clear an understanding of politics. In stern tones he rebuked Italy and Russia for attacking weak, needy, helpless and downtrodden Austria and ordered them "as good Christian countries" to lay off and put the boot into the infidel Turks. He also praised England for the courageous decision to attack the Germans, declaring that "they're only one notch above dogs." He went on to say "Kick 'em while you can",

amid the cheers and adulation of thousands of devoted Australians who roared at every word. (They'd been at the Foster's) In his encore he warned England to watch out for a French stab saying "Never trust anyone with garlic on his breath."

Moscow - The Tsar's Chief Minister, Rasputin, told Western press agencies of the recent favourable trade agreements signed by Germany and Russia. When pressed as to what the details were, he replied that there were many facets of the agreement which were secret, and which would be revealed in good time. He also mentioned the Cheka, at which point everyone dropped the subject and asked instead about the Tsar's skiing vacation. Rasputin's only comment was that the Tsar looked fit, happy, and had spent some time with an old and dear friend, who was not men-

tioned by name. Trans-Balkan Press Service (Naval Dispatch #2) - Admiral Manicotti has been transferred to the Home Fleet in Constantinople. It seems the gunnery cadets have been placed on permanent assignment to Armenia at least until they sink the Caucasus mountain range. The Admiral requested the transfer "before I strangle the brats." The Board of Safety of Constantinople refuses to allow the cadets back until their aim improves. "Those fools could start for Austria and wind up in Australia - following direct orders," Manicotti was heard to growl as he caught a train for Smyrna.

Sarajevo (NOT TURKISH PRESS - GM) - The Serbian government today expressed its gratitude to the great Tsar of Russia for his lion-hearted efforts on their behalf. They wish it to be known that his intervention has foiled the disgusting meddling of Austria, and has shown the world that the Slavs will be free no matter what the cost is in other peoples' blood. The official government spokesman also expressed a hope that Italian and Russian troops would finish the Austrian army by the end of 1902 "...so that the Balkan peoples may once again drink out of their streams, instead of paying extortionate sums to Glenn Overby for American bottled water."

Geneva - At supper last week the Tsar and his guests were overheard discussing the current mess in Europe. Among his guests was a familiar looking German officer who asked the Tsar what he planned to do about the Sevastopol incident. The Tsar showed his true humanitarian spirit, promising that "no harm will come to Manicotti since this kind of indiscretion will not occur again." Before retiring that night the Tsar offhandedly remarked that "it will be a great pity if I am forced to return the Admiral to Turkey via Greece, since they have a habit of firing people from guns, and that probably wouldn't do him any good." He also added that the Sultana wouldn't lie to him, so there was no point in continuing the conversation.

# Game Review #8 - Patterson's Diplomacy

Patterson's Diplomacy (Michael Mills, 1585 Quaker Rd, Macedon, NY 14502; cost 18¢ stamp) is a new Diplomacy variant with a twist - economics and more economics.

The game is played by 14 or more - seven "governments" moving Dip units, and seven or more "financiers" whose primary interest is the almighty buck (excuse me--Swiss franc in this game). All players have a vested

interest in the <u>two</u> Bourses and the stock market, as governments need money to function, while financiers need money to win.

Trading occurs in up to 15 different currencies - the 7 major powers plus up to 8 minor countries - and 22 different companies stocks. In addition, mercenary and National Guard units can be formed by financiers to influence on-board happenings, and governments can buy and sell in the markets (and possibly direct dividend payments, etc.) to place a check upon financiers.

PD looks like a real bear to adjudicate, but there's a lot of room for creative knifing. Mike has announced a PD opening in his zine Emhain Macha (subs 50¢/issue; gamefee \$2.50), so contact him if you think you'd be interested.

In the meantime, chalk up another winner for Mike Mills - certainly one of the emerging leaders of the Dip variant hobby. Keep it up, Mike!

Similarly, if the Papal player denies the annulment, he should also state whether or not he will excommunicate if England goes through with divorce, enclosing a copy of the Papal Bull if appropriate.



As I close up another issue, I'll get more serious than usual for a minute -


