EGYPT: (Walker) f upper egypt-red sea, f oersia h, f lower egypt s GALAK f crete-minoan sea (ISO), f cyrenia s f lower egypt (nc).

SYRIA: (Leeder) a Labalon-persia, f sumer h, a palestine-trans-jordan, a sinai-lower egypt, f cilicia-eastern mediterranean, f minoan sea s f cilicia-eastern mediterranean, a cappadocia-asia.

GREEKS: (Bennett) f adriatic-etruscan, f macedonia-adriatic, f's illyria and central med. s f macedonia-adriatic, a dacia h, f aegaeon s f central med., f crete s f central med., f sparta s f macedonia-

adriatic.

CARTHAGE: (Rorgen) f central med. R-western med., a tripoli h, a carthage s a tripoli, f sicily h, f english sea-open sea, f western med. s f sicily.

Somewhere on the end of a hooka pipe- What can I say, really?

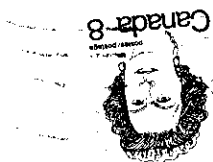
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
