REGARDING STAB (GROWN GROWN). WHILE I HAVEN'T YET SEEN THE COMPLETE SC CHART/RATINGS FOR THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN DIPLOMACY CHAMPIONSHIP, I BELIEVE THAT (FROM WHAT I DID SEE) IT WORKED VERY WELL AT SADC. THE ADDITION OF DRAW POINTS SEEMS TO WORK VERY WELL. HOWEVER, THE CRITICISM WHICH BROUGHT THIS CHANGE (FROM 1.333 MULTIPLIER TO DRAW POINTS) APPLIES EQUALLY TO RATING OF GAMES IN PROGRESS.

IF WE WANT TO PRESENT A TABLE OF PROGRESSIVE RATINGS IN THE JOURNAL GENERATED BY MICHAEL HOPTON'S RATE PROGRAM, THEN WE NEED TO PROVIDE AN INCENTIVE/REWARD FOR PLAYER (SPECIALLY SMALLER POWERS) TO STRIVE FOR THAT EXTRA CENTRE OR TWO. ALSO PROGRESSIVE STAB FAILS TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE ACTUAL CURRENT POSITION OF PLAYERS, WHETHER ONE HAS JUST CURRENTLY FOUGHT ONE'S WAY INTO THE LEAD (AND SCORE SEVEN POINTS) OR HAS LEAD IN THE PAST BUT IS NOW THIRD OR FOURTH, MAKES NO DIFFERENCE. SURELY THERE SHOULD BE SOME ACKNOWLEDGEMENT IN THE SYSTEM OF HOW PLAYERS ARE ACTUALLY PERFORMING.

I PROPOSE THAT INSTEAD OF SCORES BEING MULTIPLIED BY 1.333 FOR GAMES IN PROGRESS, 4 POINTS BE PRO-RATED ACCORDING TO CURRENT SC HOLDINGS. AS GEORGE SMIRNOW WOULD BE THE FIRST TO POINT OUT, THE CURRENT 1.333 MULTIPLIER IS TOTALLY ARTIFICIAL. I BELIEVE IT IS DESIRABLE FOR A PROGRESSIVE SYSTEM TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE CURRENT, ACTUAL STATE OF THE GAME, AND PRO-RATA ALLOCATION OF FOUR POINTS, WHICH IS ALREADY HOW DRAWS ARE DEALT WITH, SEEMS A SIMPLE AND EFFECTIVE MANNER OF DOING THIS.

ADDITIONALLY, WE DO NEED TO ADDRESS THE LARGE AMOUNT OF NOISE GEORGE S. IS MAKING ABOUT RATINGS. ONE OF THE THINGS THAT RANKLES HIM IS THAT STAB TAKES NO ACCOUNT OF ACTUAL CURRENT HOLDINGS - THIS IS A VALID CRITICISM. THE PROPOSED CHANGE WOULD NEATLY ADDRESS THIS CRITICISM, AND MAKE THE STAB SYSTEM, WHICH IS BY FAR THE BEST IN AUSTRALIA, EVEN BETTER.

((I AGREE WITH YOU. I DO SEE GEORGE'S POINT ABOUT RATINGS, BUT HE'S CHANGED HIS SYSTEM SO MANY TIMES I'M NOT SURE WHAT HE'S UP TO. THESE CHANGES WOULD MAKE STAB MORE RESPONSIVE TO THE GAME'S SITUATION AT THE TIME OF RATING. I'LL GET ON TO HOPTON ABOUT THIS))

# Tournaments

## AUSTRALIAN TOURNAMENT RATINGS 1988.

BY MICHAEL HOPTON

As I was about to prepare this listing, I received a new version of STAB from the guru. I didn't like the previous versions due to the common disagreement between STAB scores and final center counts, and I feel that the position at the end of the game is more important than STAB allowed. Andrew has overcome this problem by increasing the victory point pool by 10 and averaging this with the score.

My last article was cut by Mike so I will explain that LT stood for last turn. Therefore LT CENTRE COUNT was the number of centres in the last turn and LT STAB was the STAB score for the last turn only (ie position).

The four columns this time are New STAB, Old STAB, POSITION on the last turn, CENTRES held on the last turn. The line beneath the titles tells how the scores are averaged. STAB scores start from 1902, all years are considered and totals are divided by the number of games + 1. The others start on the last turn and totals are divided by the number of games.

There are two causes for changes in rank from the last list to this one. The first is the addition of SADC results and the second is changes to the rating system, for example removal of the 4/3 multiplier. Any change to the rating system can have profound effects on the rankings. This is due to the closeness of the scores and small number of games played by many people.

The high scoring countries at SADC were in order Turkey, France and England. The gap between these three and the other four countries was very considerable. Turkey's improved performance is due to the long games at SADC. Also neither Turkey nor France were eliminated at SADC.

France regains the top spot from Germany, lost after the anti-French EXPO and Turkey is finally out of the last position. Italy and Austria still struggle in the bottom half of the order.

Andrew England's position on top of the ladder seems unassailable due to his 18 centre victory at CanCon, despite an elimination at EXPO. This is a definite incentive to win games.

Neil Smark and Rob Wessels continue their form and remain near the top. Rob also has an elimination against his name, which just goes to show what a mean Diplomat he is. James Vickers retained his ranking, but Mike Gibson took a plunge due to a very bad game at SADC. Ben Groenen also fell a few spots, but holds the record for the most tournament games, despite playing in only one final round. Congratulations Ben.

George Smirnow and Bill Brown, having put in very good performances at SADC, climb several notches, while Alan Howard and Frank Meerbach make big gains through the lower order. SADC saw six new entries to the listing, the highest being by Simon Miles in 17th position.

Nearly one hundred people played 54 games at the four tournaments in 1988. This is an average of 4 games per person, which shows that too many people are attending only one tournament. Initial indications for 1989 look promising, for increases in both number of people and the number of tournament games played. Next year I also hope to get results from WA and QLD tournaments, if such beasts can be organized.

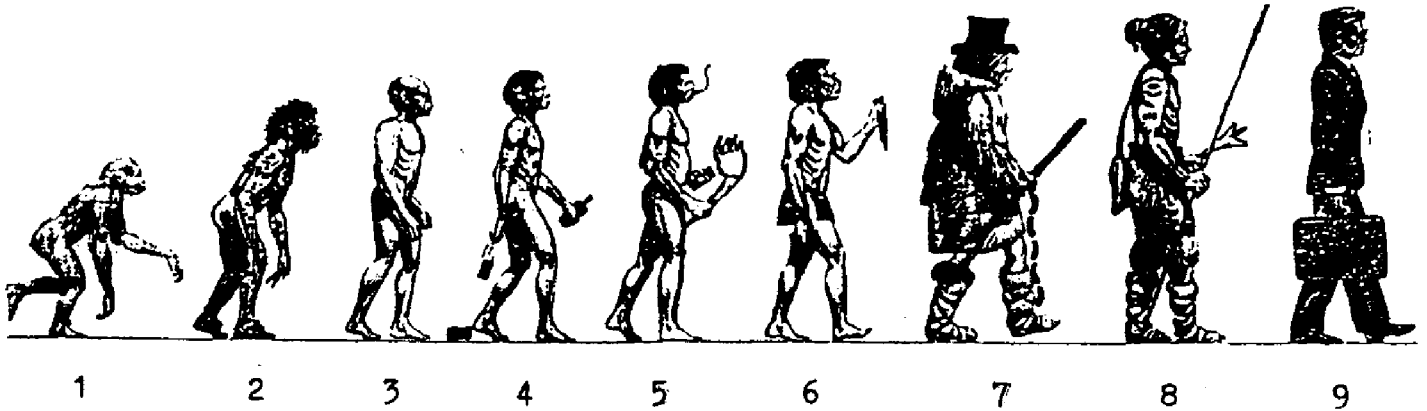

I HAVE JUST RECEIVED A RHETORICAL-MONOLOGUE-BY-MAIL FROM GEORGE SMIRNOW, ARGUING WITH EVERY Ounce OF HIS NOT-INCONSIDERABLE FORCE OF PERSONALITY AGAINST THE USE OF THE STAB OR STARS RATING SYSTEMS IN TOURNAMENT SITUATIONS. I AGREE WITH HIM TOTALLY. IN FACT, I GO FURTHER THAN HIM. I DON'T BELIEVE THEY SHOULD BE USED AT ALL.

HIS BASIC ARGUMENT IS SUMMED UP IN A CHART SHOWING AN ADMITTEDLY EXTREME CASE; A BALANCED GAME WITH AN EARLY FRONT-RUNNER AND AN EARLY LAGGARD. ON THE FINAL TWO TURNS, THE FRONT-RUNNER GETS BLITZED AND THE LAGGARD RECOVERS TO LEAD THE PACK. THE FRONT-RUNNER HAS A STAB AVERAGE OF 6:100 AND THE LAGGARD 1:600. THIS IS CLEARLY AN ANOMALOUS RESULT; AND ONE THAT TOO OFTEN OCCURS UNDER THE STAB SYSTEM; A "PACK" OF 3'S DEVELOPS, ALL ROUGHLY CO-EQUAL IN POWER (ie 6, 6, 7 OR 10, 12, 12) BUT WILDLY DIVERGENT IN STAB POINTS.

GEORGE THEN SUGGESTS THAT THE "SHORT GAME" RULES BE USED (ie THE LEADER ON CENTRES IS RULED TO HAVE NONE). THIS IS EQUALLY RIDICULOUS, ESPECIALLY SEEING MOST TOURNAMENT GAMES GO ONLY TO 100 OR SO. HOW MANY TIMES HAVE YOU SEEN A GAME DEGENERATE INTO A MAD SCRAMBLE OF CENTRE-SNATCHING, JUST BECAUSE THE TIME IS TICKING TOWARDS 11 PM (OR WHATEVER)? IS IT REALLY FAIR TO AWARD VICTORY TO A POWER ON 13 CENTRES, WHEN HE IS HEMMED IN (AND INDEED, BEING SLOWLY ABSORBED) BY A COALITION OF SMALLER OPPONENTS? WHAT IF 3 POWERS EXIST ON 13, 12 AND 9 CENTRES; FROM THAT POSITION, ANY OF THE THREE COULD WIN. AND IT GETS WORSE WITH "PACKS" OF FOUR OR FIVE

HERE ENDETH MY COMMENTARY ON GEORGE'S IDEAS, AND BEGINS MY TWO-CENTS WORTH ON TOURNAMENT RATING SYSTEMS AND RUNNING TOURNAMENTS IN GENERAL.

THE BASIC PROBLEM WITH TOURNAMENT DIPLOMACY IS TIME. THERE IS ONLY SO MUCH DIP YOU CAN FIT IN IN THREE DAYS OF PLAY. THE STANDARD SOLUTION HAS BEEN TWO DAYS OF 'HEATS' (THREE OR FOUR HOURS APiece) AND A LAST-DAY FINAL. I PROPOSE A MUCH BETTER ONE; YOU TREAT THE TOURNAMENT JUST LIKE YOU WOULD TREAT A ZINE. SAY YOU HAVE THIRTY PEOPLE ATTENDING. FOUR GAMES OF DIPLOMACY START AND TWO PEOPLE GO ON A WAITING LIST. AS PLAYERS GET KNOCKED OUT, THEY JOIN THE WAITING LIST. AS SOON AS THE WAITING LIST HAS SEVEN PEOPLE, IN IT, YOU START ANOTHER GAME. CONTINUE UNTIL THE END OF THE CON, OR UNTIL THE FINAL IS DUE TO START.

SIMPLE, MUH. YOU GET LOTS OF GAMES, PEOPLE WIPED OUT IN MALL '02 DON'T HAVE TO WAIT FOUR HOURS FOR ANOTHER GAME, GAMES CAN BE PLAYED TO COMPLETION (I CANNOT OVEREMPHASIZE THIS POINT, AS IT IS AT THE CORE OF ALL TOURNAMENT DIP'S PROBLEMS.) AND PEOPLE CAN WANDER AWAY FOR A FEW HOURS TO GET LUNCH OR CHECK OUT THE REST OF THE CON.

THE ABOVE HAS A MINOR PROBLEM WITH RATING PEOPLE, BECAUSE ONE PLAYER MAY

HAVE PLAYED BUT TWO GAMES AND ANOTHER FIVE. THIS IS HOWEVER, EASILY SOLVED BY USING A "ZERO-SUM" CALKHAMER POINT OR GENGHIS KHAN SYSTEM.

ONE LAST POINT. LUNCH. ## A NOTE ON ZERO-SUM RATING SYSTEMS

### ZERO-SUM CALKHAMER POINT:

IN THE CP SYSTEM, ONE POINT IS AWARDED PER GAME. THE WINNER GETS IT. IN THE CASE OF A DRAW, IT IS SHARED EQUALLY AMONG ALL PARTICIPANTS.

A ZERO-SUM C-P SYSTEM IS SIMILAR TO THE ABOVE, EXCEPT THAT EVERYONE NOT IN THE WIN OR DRAW LOSES POINTS SUFFICIENT SO THAT POINTS LOST = POINTS GAINED.

EXAMPLE: \*IF ONE PLAYER WINS, HE GETS 1 POINT, EVERYBODY ELSE LOSES 1/6 OF A POINT.

\*FOUR PLAYER DRAW. THEY GET 1/4 OF A POINT EACH. THE OTHER THREE EACH LOSE 1/3 OF A POINT. GOT IT?

### ZERO-SUM GENGHIS KHAN:

IN A NORMAL G-K, THE WINNER GETS (16 + HIS #CENTRES) POINTS, AND SURVIVORS LOSE (THEIR #CENTRES x WINNER CENTRES) POINTS. ELIM-

INATION GETS NO POINTS. IN A DRAW, 18 POINTS ARE SHARED EQUALLY AMONG ALL PARTICIPANTS. IN A Z-S G-K, EVERYONE NOT IN THE WIN OR DRAW LOSES SUFFICIENT POINTS SO THAT POINTS GAINED = POINTS LOST.

EXAMPLE: \*TWO PLAYERS DRAW. THEY GET +9 APiece. EVERYBODY ELSE LOSES 2/3 POINTS

### ADVANTAGES OF Z-S SYSTEMS

THE MAIN ADVANTAGE IS THAT IT DOESN'T MATTER HOW MANY GAMES ARE PLAYED, EVERYONE'S RATINGS SUM TO ZERO. THIS MEANS IF SHARL KIBBLE HAS PLAYED 41 GAMES AND IVE PLAYED THREE. OUR RATINGS WILL STILL BE COMPARABLE. NON-COMPARABILITY IS THE CHIEF BANE OF MANY LONG-TERM RATING SYSTEMS; IS FRED NEWCOMER (WHO HAS WON ONE GAME OUT OF FIVE STARS) A BETTER PLAYER THAN JOE OLDTIMER (WHO HAS WON THREE OUT OF FORTY)?

## THE ORIGINAL TOPICS

**WORLD DIPCON** - There are various bits of information on when we'll be asked to hold this event, and I believe that a lot depends upon the hobby politics overseas. However it might be as close as 1990, and we had better get out act together. Where should it be held, when should it be held, and what should the format be?

**RATINGS** - Oooohhh a juicy issue this. Most of you know the big problems and arguments here. Do we have the right to exclude and game from the ratings, or do we have a responsibility to future players to ensure that all games are run properly, and that all the past games included are "correct". What is correct?

**PUBLICITY** - 2 million people in Australia saw Luke get insulted on TV whilst talking about Diplomacy. This raises a few vital questions about publicity. Where should we advertise? What type of person are we trying to attract? Are hobbyists prepared to pay for slick (but limited) advertising in gaming magazines. Is publicity necessary? If Luke is prepared to stick his neck out, what can we do?

**CUSTODIANS** - What roles need filling? Who should have these jobs? How much power can/should they have?

**DIPLOMACY ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALIA** - What should it be and who should be in it? How can we stop the inevitable power games and bickering? Where will it get its finances and when does it meet? If a position is an elected position, then who votes for you?

**MAGAZINES** - Are there too many in the hobby relative to the talent available to contribute to them? How do we set up Editors Packs for aspiring editors? Are there market forces involved here? Do we need a zine register?

**GAMEMASTERS** - The conduct of GMs has often been brought into question. How do we protect players, and how do we help GMs? Who picks up the pieces of a badly run and dead game?

**THE JOURNAL OF AUSTRALIAN DIPLOMACY** - Who owns this zine? I mean it's mine now, but if it becomes the official voice of the DAA, who would control its production? Are you happy with its role? What else can it do to help the hobby? I have a dream of the Journal being sold as a glossy magazine along with *New Ideas* and *Opini*. (At the moment a blues guitarist on the radio is saying "Take me dan' that ro' bro'er Yeah." With a prophecy like that, anything could happen.)

**CHANGE** - Ugh what an ugly word. If anyone should become dissatisfied with anything in the Diplomacy hobby, who do they complain to, and how can they get things changed? What happens when our rules become outdated? Should there be an avenue for protest? If the Ombudsman is to take this role, will s/he need a committee to help?

**JOHN CRAIN** (Victoria)

**RATINGS** - I can see two distinct topics here, firstly a discussion of ratings systems in general, and secondly specific discussion on the details of the Stab rating system. In my view, anybody is welcome to publish their own rating system, and they'll no doubt get plenty of feedback (from George at least). If they want to do all the work of rating games according to their system, that is their business, and if they can find someone to publish their ratings, more power to them. In line with my views on ratings systems in general, I believe it is up to the person actually putting together the ratings for Stab to decide which games they believe are eligible for inclusion. If they exclude too many, the howls of protest will soon make them regret it, if they include anything, no matter how irregular, then the ratings will be dismissed as a joke. The most important thing is that, on the final records for a game which has been conducted in a manner which differs from that generally accepted, the Boardman Number Custodian should indicate way that this has occurred, and why the game is considered "irregular".

**STEVEN BAGSHAW** (Western Australia)

**PUBLICITY** - We should be advertising in game shops and in Breakout. We should be trying to attract FTF Dippers, Wargamers and PBM gamers. Slick advertising in gaming magazines is not worth it. Publicity isn't really necessary. If we want it, we could wait until Cancon, then start a riot. Whatever we do, print is number 1, electronic media is to brief and fades from peoples memory quickly.

**ADRIAN APPLEYARD** (Queensland)

**WORLD DIPCON** - Sydney would be a very good place to hold it since it is relatively centrally located. Canberra would be the next choice. Easter would be a good time, although that is the time the Melbourne Con is on.

**JAMES VICKERS** (South Australia)

**WORLD DIPCON** - For Australia to present this we would have to be extremely well organized and fairly united. This is why the DAA is essentially a good idea. Canberra strikes me as a good central place to hold it. How many overseas players could we expect? Probably a few Kiwis to start with. What must be remembered is that it is far cheaper for people to go to the UK from the USA or vice versa, than it is for either to come to Australia. So for people to spend about A\$2000 to get here we must have magnificent prizes, a high degree of professionalism and perhaps something a little more than just a Diplomacy Tournament (ie if they come over to Australia and want to travel we could supply billets in most states). I think it would perhaps be a little beyond the possibility to sponsor people to come over here.

**NEIL SMARK** (South Australia)

**MAGAZINES** - You are showing your socialist feelings here, let free market forces rule, if there are too many then the ones that aren't doing too well will go under and the popular ones will flourish. It is a hard world but I think that everybody realizes that there are more than enough zines on the market. Let common sense prevail.

**PIOTR DYDUSIAK** (New South Wales)

**MAGAZINES** - Yes, there are too many zines. How about aiming at tow huge zines run by several editors each? One could feature Normal Dip and the other variants and other games. When you consider the expense of having to subscribe to five zines (DI, Journal, Envoy, Beowulf, Vicky) the cost of two well organized bumpers is nothing.

A lot of games die of lack of interest or are not played to a win. I propose a \$3 gamefee, \$2 being a deposit and \$1 going for a prize of \$5 to the winner and \$2 to second. New games should be developed and conducted alongside on going progress in Diplomacy games, for example an improved Bourse.

**STEVE GOULD** (New South Wales)

**THE JOURNAL** - At the moment I only subscribe to The Envoy and The Go-between, so I feel there is a lot happening in the Diplomacy world that I miss out on because of all of the zines that I dont subscribe to. As it is quite expensive to subscribe to all of them, I'd like to see The Journal cover the important events/stories that I would otherwise miss out on, as well as the custodian reports etc. Actually, looking at The Journal now, I suppose that is what it is doing, but I thought I'd stress the point.

**MAT GIBSON** (South Australia)

**WORLD DIPCON** - Should be held in place of Cancon 90 or 91 simply because Australia cannot hold more than two broad based conventions. Having it in Canberra on Australia Day also lends credibility. We also need to use the Cancon facilities.

**RATINGS** - Remember that ratings only have a limited scope. What they represent is very clear and within their context a certain standard must be maintained. So yes, games ought to be excluded if they are deemed irregular.

**PAUL WARD** (Western Australia)

**WORLD DIPCON** - Should be held in Sydney to ensure a big turn-out. I doubt we are ready for it. The hobby is still expanding and we need to have a better structure and organized hobby first.

**RATINGS** - We dont have to decide what games to rate, just keep the records. I'm not a big fan of ratings anyway. Everyone knows who the best players are and I dont think they need that type of recognition.

**PUBLICITY** - The hobby seems to be expanding well enough without big advertising campaigns. The best way of attracting people is by making more and better magazines, and that is up to subscribers/contributors, not the editors.

**IAN WHITCHURCH** (Tasmania)

**WORLD DIPCON** - A great idea. It should be at Cancon, on the grounds of central location, established position as the premier Dipcon in Australia and non-parochialism. Also, if we are going to hold it, we need to start accumulating funds so we've got enough money to contact everyone in Australia who might be interested.

**ALAN HOWARD** (South Australia)

**MAGAZINES** - At this stage, I think we have just enough zines for the hobby. Any more and we start to saturate it with zines. New zines will have to offer something brand new to get people interested. Regarding an editors pack, one way to do such a thing would be to get current editors to write about their experience in starting up a zine. They should write about what not to do, as well as what to do.

**MICHAEL HOPTON** (South Australia)

**CHANGE** - Power grabs and people abusing positions are unlikely at this stage and cant be stopped in any case, only noticed early and controlled. At present there are many zines to turn to if someone tries to push a particular line. The nature of the hobby (many small zines) means everyone should remain reasonably well informed. No-one has any real power to control such a beast.

**GEORGE SMIRNOW** (Victoria)

**WORLD DIPCON** - John Cain is the man. He will have valuable personal experience and exposure. We should be guided by him when he returns from the UK. Basic to any consideration of World Dipcon is whether we could attract any overseas visitors if we really tried to, and if so how many. I would be prepared to help as much as I reasonably could, eg with billeting. I see Melbourne as easily the best and most superior venue for World Dipcon for the following reasons:

- \* The Melbourne bunch would all rise to the occasion.
- \* The Easter Convention in Melbourne has four full days.
- \* Easter in Melbourne is the most fantastic weather in the world.
- \* Numerous pikers from Sydney who have so far refused to attend any interstate Con would not miss World Dipcon in Melbourne.
- \* Melbourne has John Cain who will be the main man.
- \* Melbourne actually does have a greater concentration of reliable, longstanding hobby members who would contribute their effort. Many hands make light work.

**CHANGE** - We cant stop it. Lets change everything. Keep on changing it or it gets boring. Bring in new ideas, bring back old ideas. Put a box in all the zines begging everyone to send all their ideas to you. Look you could be the Catalytic Central Printer and GM Custodian President who took Diplomacy to the Pubs. No, I dont mean that bit but I wont delete it, I like it.

**LUKE CLUTTERBUCK** (New South Wales)

#### DIPLOMACY ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALIA

The sole advantage of this organization, to my mind, is to get ourselves in the phone book. I have a suggestion here for publicity. Elect someone Chair (you, me, a paper bag - it doesn't matter) and ask someone BIG to be honorary President for a year which means they come to one event and give a 15 minute talk. I suggest Bill Hayden or Clive Robertson. If they accept we tell the media. If they refuse we tell the media. We can't lose!

#### PUBLICITY

If you want to air your own views then you must take out paid advertising. This is expensive. \$350 for one tiny ad towards the back of one metropolitan paper for example. Late night and early morning TV can be had for as little as \$120 but it costs at least \$1000 for a 30 second commercial (and that's if I use friends in the industry). Radio is probably cheapest of all but also the most unpredictable.

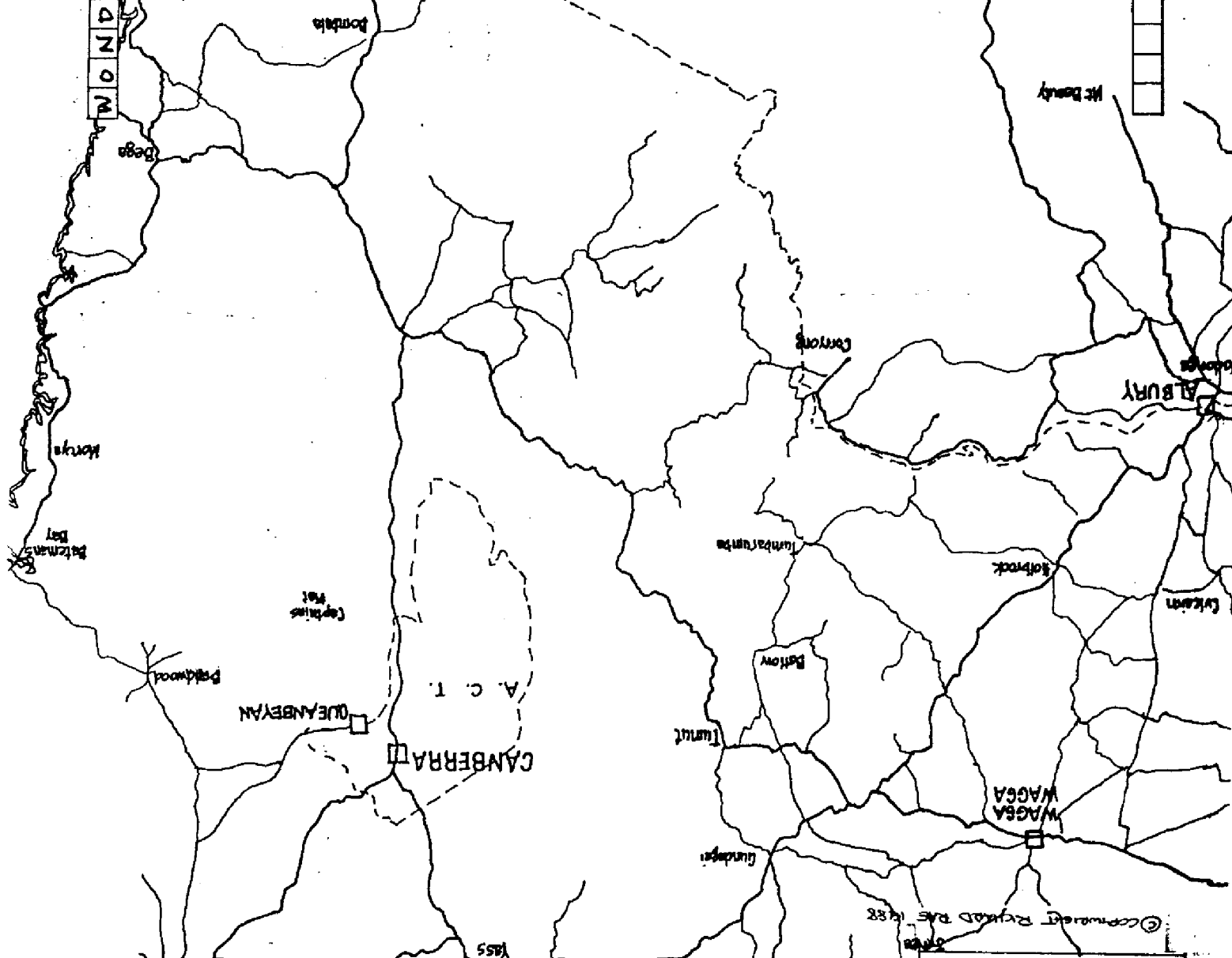

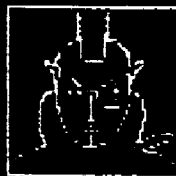

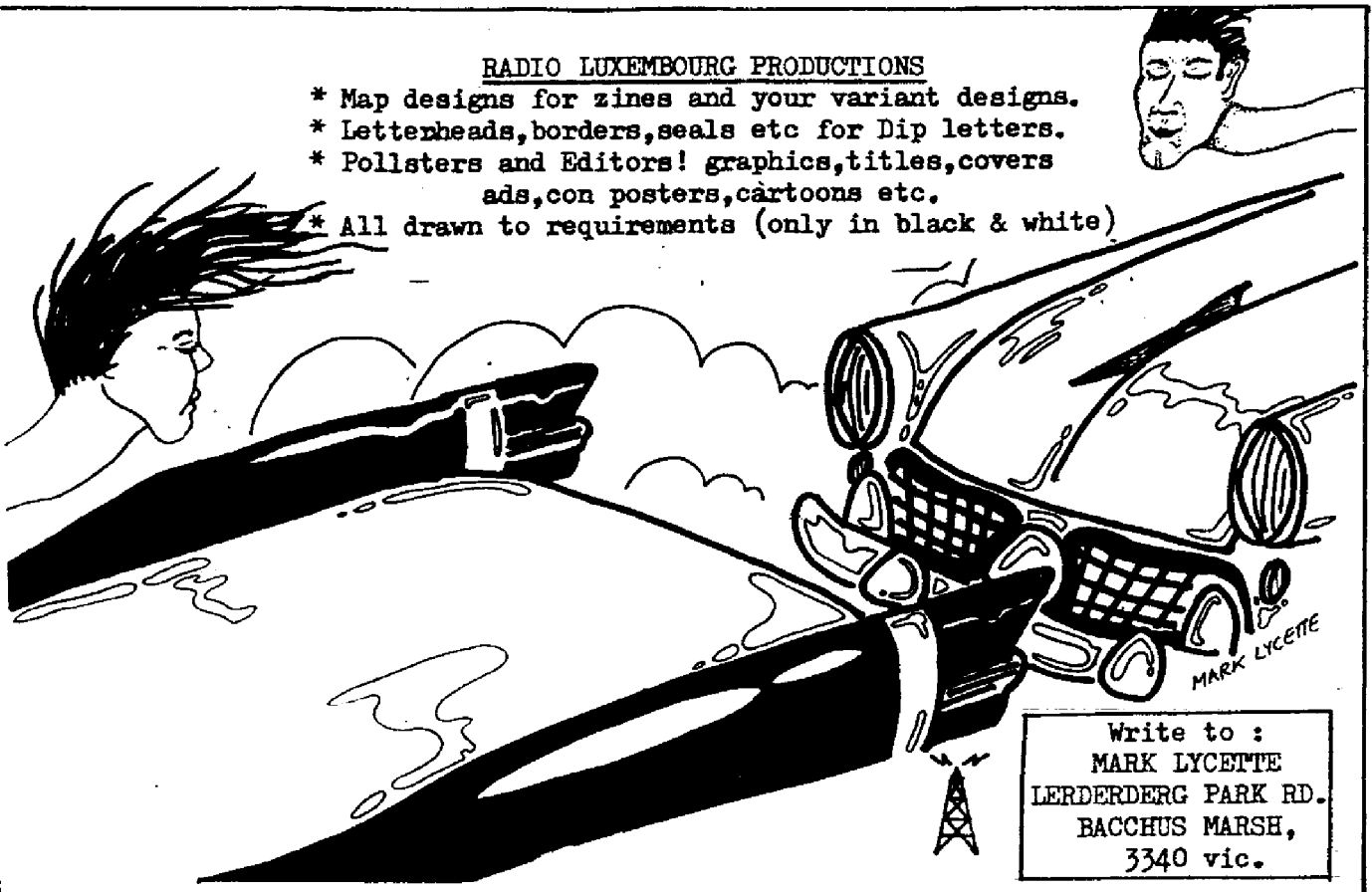
