

Fall 1901 moves are due 15 December, Friday, 1967

WIEN: (8 March, 1901) In accordance wurg the agreements of November, 1900, at the Conference of Lov, the Imperial Austro-Hungarian Government announces the incorporation of the Kingdoms of Serbia and Albania into the Empire as client states.

The Ministry expects complete incorporation of these territories into the Empire, with full privileges and obligations by 1904 at the latest.

War Minister von Korber also announced the conclusion of treaties of non-agression with Austria's neighbours, vowing that the tireless "diplomatic efforts of countless servants of His Imperial Majesty have finally secured peace for Europe in our time".

VERSAILLES: (3 April) The King of All the French, Normans; Scots, and Welsh, Coleman I of Anjou, today issued a long, eloquent summary of his giverances against the present Spanish ruler. While emphasising that he had no issue with the people of the noble land of Spain, he expressed his sadness at being forced to remove the King of Spain from his unlawfully secured throne. He stated his intention of restoring the rightful ruler, Peter XIII of Anjou, to the throne of Spain, and asked the people of that land to allow a speedy and harmless movement of a few police forces from Andorra to Madrid. King Coleman promised his armies would not attack, nor have a-nything to do with the populace so long as it remained impassive to the police action.

VERSAILLES: (14 May) The Foreign Minister of France, Jacques Anoneto, was sorry to announce today that a minor incident of English piracy in the Manche necessitated occupation of the Channel Islands. He stated no action would be taken against England as a whole if it also took its lawful part in suppressing these pirates; therby indicating its support of law, order, and peaceful commerce.

BRUSSELS: (April 30) The King of Belgium, Lendex IV, was grieved to announce that all contact had been lost with the border fortress of Tournai. French forces, it seemed, had cut the telegraph wires and beseiged the place. The only unit of the Royal Belgian Army anywhere near the place was in Rochefort, and this gallant brigade was expecyed to march to the rescue of Tournai against any dastardly Frenchmen near the outpost. "If this is a French invasion" intoned Lendex, "We will never be overrun! What a weak force has attacked us. Our southeastern area can hold out indefintely."
