Editor.....Monday Nov. 24

An unusual time awaits us, a
time of many things, and an issue
of unusual type. They say that
good things come in small pack-
ages. This Kaissa will be one of
those. I haven't published a
games-only issue in two years; -
in fact this won't be one either
although much is missing. Cline
is starting, so it's rules appear
instead of the last part of Di-
Production; and the results of
the Logic-puzzel contest. But I
hope to keep the issue to 12 pages
if possible. Why?

Today it is ten years since my
first hobby (gaming hobby that is)
zine was published- Clue & Key #1
appeared on 11/24/76. (See last
issue for a longer story, includ-
ing the initial flyer and Kaissa).

In that time I've experimen-
ted widely. At the beginning I
wanted a genzine (C&K) with a game-
zine adjunct (Kaissa) and eventu-
ally settled for the latter alone.
Recently I cast envious eyes on
the format of a bi-monthly zine
that ran its games by flyer. The
last couple of issues I've tried
this, and decided it doesn't work
for us, so with this issue, we
go back to the regular schedule-
except that we will have an ex-
tended deadline to miss the hol-
idays and jump over into January.

There will be a lot of changes
next time- with so many games
filled, I'm closing all but two
openings. Also, by popular demand
I'm including addresses in the
Trade list (which wont appear
this issue for the first time in
about 2½ years) from now on- but
carry it perhaps only every other
issue. Kaissa is well known for
the hobby news- another item cut
this issue for the first time in
ages. A full summary of the end
of the year will appear with the

next news column.

That issue will also carry a large letter discussion- as you know, I don't run letters more than once per three or four issues, but next issue will be an exception due to the mail on the Linsey matter- also, as you know, he has answered the list of facts about himself, all of which were true, not with evidence or answers, but with a list of lies and countercharges, all of which are false. It will be a spirited debate, to say the least.

That said, Kaissa begins a new decade and a new format- as I cast envious eyes at another zine- an oldrevered one, Runestone. Runestone was a weekly zine, with the games distributed around it's schedule. Rarely there would be an issue with no game in it. It was a warehouse most of the time. However, with so many games now in Kaissa, I don't want a warehouse, so I've thought up a compromise. Starting with the next January issue, Kaissa will be a weekly zine.

Every fourth or fifth issue will be a regular issue- subbers will only receive those issues. Players will receive the regular issues and any of thier game issues. Traders will receive the regular issues only unless they request the others, in which case they can have all issues if they so desire. Regular issues will have the regular features (the Trade list, the monthly news, articles etc.) and the 198SHU novice game with commentary, and the Cline 9-man variant, will be the two run in synch with the regular issue. The rest will be distributed among the other in-between issues, and will run 3-5 weeks (shorter for winter), and, of course, 6-weeks for the Canadian/American game.

Non-trading readers, who don't play (a large bulk of current readers, and getting larger) will only get the 4-5 week (monthly av.) 'regular' issue for thier regular subscription. The details and games run list will be explained in next issues Colophon and Accounts columns.

In any case, I hope to get this out (12 pages or 16) by the end of the month (with Thanksgiving this week the printer can't get it back to me before Monday, I'm sure), and take a long well-deserved break for the Holidays.

So, confusion to the enemies of the hobby; to those who do evil we wish just punishment and thier sincere repentance; to the rest of us we wish the warmest greetings of the season, and the best of wishes; many happy returns.

See you in 1987.

Cline-9-Man IV.1

a diplomacy variant

DiProductions final part is delayed, partly due to the need to run Cline-9-Man-IV.1. The game is full and ready to start. (See the games section), so the rules are needed. Each player will receive the map seperately.

1). The 1971/1976 standard Rulebook for Diplomacy shall be applicable except as hereinafter described.

2). To the seven powers are added two great powers called BARBARY STATES (Starting with an Army Algeria, Fleet Tunis and Fl in Morocco, and PERSIA (Starting with an Army Iran, Army Arabia and a Fleet Jordan(wc). In addition, Turkeys starting Army in Smyrna becomes a Fleet in Smyrna.

3). (See map):the following neutral supply centers are added: Corsica, Ethiopia, Egypt and Crete. The existing space of Piedmont also becomes a neutral supply center. Tunis is now a Barbary home center. The total number of supply centers is 45. Victory criterion becomes 23.

4). Canary Islands is a coastal space within the meaning of the rules:i.e. an army may be conveyed to, but not through, the space.

5). Circumnavigation of africa: There is a space called the Antarctic Sea which is adjacent to only two other spaces- the Indian Ocean and the Western Atlantic Ocean. Armies may not be conveyed through this space. It otherwise functions as a normal sea space.

6). Canals:In the standard game two spaces function in a special way, Constantinople and Kiel. In this game, Sevastopol and Egypt function in this same way.

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
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In addition, the Volga Canal continues on, linking Sevastopol and the now-passable Caspian sea, along the border of Moscow and Georgia. This means that, due to the canal between Moscow and Georgia, Moscow-Georgia have the same special relationship as do Denmark-Sweden in the regular game (and in this one as well).

7). Since the Caspian sea is now passable, Iran has two coasts for building, and Moscow now has a coast for building as well.

8). Bridges: Naples/Sicily, or Ireland/Clyde are joined by a bridge symbol. This allows a move between those places as if they were adjacent. Such a move does not affect directly, nor is it affected directly by a sea move crossing under it.

9). Abbreviations: All standards apply; most new spaces can be identified by their first 3 letters with the following exceptions: West Africa (Waf), S. Atlantic (SAt), W. Atlantic (WAt), W. Med (WMed instead of the usual Wes), S. Med (SMed). in this section.

That's it. Players have a map enclosed (if you already have one don't worry about it). Players will get a result map each turn, although I'm not certain if I will actually run it in print each turn. (See game section for more on this particular section).

and CIVILIZATION, an A-H game. A discount section variant for 7-9 players GMed by David Danbury.

BONUS, paid signees get the set of Avalon-Hill advanced Trade cards free or 4 issues of Kaissa your choice. Advanced cards are used in this section. PBM rules in one or two regular issues; fee is \$10/4 turns (sub included).. (This is the same as before figuring fee and sub needed; but it works out better this way in the bookkeeping).







I have Fall 1904 orders on file for all; you may change them of course.



1903

1903 was a year primarily of consolidation for the winners




(England, France, Austria, Turkey) and slow dissolution for the losers. The most significant event was the change of player in Turkey. Lackadaisical Spring play and a fall NMR by Turkey's Adams have allowed Botimer's Austria to capture a certain amount of initiative. It will be interesting to see if the new player can or will reverse it.

How does the purported initiative show itself? Primarily in unit placement. Austrian armies in Serbia and Sevastopol threaten Turkish holdings in Rumania, Bulgaria and Greece plus the key tactical province of Armenia. On the other hand, Turkish A Moscow survives at Austria's pleasure, Budapest-Serbia can be made quite safe and Turkey's western advance seems stalled, if

not reversed, with the fall of the Tyrrhenian. The Austrian armies mentioned above, even if used only defensively, act as an implicit threat - sort of like Russian SS-20's in Europe - and tend to induce non-threatening behaviour as a result.

Of course, Austria does have his own problems. England and especially France are moving very fast. As a result, the window of opportunity for a quick Austrian occupation of all of Italy has passed. Also, western armies are moving through Germany and will soon be a threat. The best counterplay is a deal with England. However, England seems content with France, as far as can be ascertained.

As always, the western problems are the mirror image of



those in the east. For England (Petty), having given up Holland, the payoff is Kiel now, Berlin in '04 and St. Petersburg in '04 or '05. For France (Martin), having assumed a pose as defender of the downtrodden Italians (if they stay out of civil disorder, that is), further gains must come from Austria/Turkey or (less likely) faithful English ally.

The real question is if Austria and the new Turkey a rather ineffective offense or a coordinated defense. In the former case allowing western units to leak behind the lines would eventually prove fatal. In the latter case, an effective attack will be extremely difficult, if not impossible.

As for the minor powers, at one unit, Germany (Kelly) and

Russia (Grubb) are basically out of it. Russia might survive a little longer as a StP placeholder to keep England out, but that is about it. Italy's A Rom has a little more play, but both Rome and Tunis should eventually fall to France.

Things to look for in '04:
 -France's best builds are probably F Bre (-Mid-Wes) and A Mar (-Pie). But what would England think?
 -England will probably kick at German A Ber in the Spring and really go for it in the fall with the help of F Den-Bal. A Yor-Nwy (via F Nth), F Hel-Den is probably the best compromise for the rest.
 -Austria will take F Tri(-Adr-Apu) if trusting of Turkey or A Bud (more likely) if not. Some

reshuffling (Aus A Ser-Rum, A Sev-Ukr, Tur A Rum-Sev) would resolve Turkey's potential worries in an amicable fashion. Reasonable Spring play would be to kick at Rome from Venice while hitting the Tyrrhenian (Aus F Nap S Tur F Ion-TyS) in case France tries to reposition his awkwardly placed fleets.

Ultimate prediction: E/F/A/T draw, now more than ever. Best winning chances: France, due the player change/NMR with Turkey.




