...players who signed up for The ADVENTURERS game when it was announced three years ago, will be pleased to hear that it is now open!

To refresh your memory, The Adventurers was set up as a 50-player victory-point ended game, which had attracted about 23 people for the first section. It was shelved, and only recently I decided to redesign it to use no set number of players and to end based on a point shortly after completing discovery of the world. It had six character types, each having its' own advantages in various fields. Players would then explore, trade, convert, and colonise the globe, while publishing the accounts of thier adventures. player is allowed up to 3 turns per month, which represents a total of about three months game time. Every four weeks these written reports are published in a newsletter (probably KAISSA), and each game year (4 months) a new world map is produced. Players vie for Fame, Gold and Status.

I hope to start the game with at least 10 players by March first. The price remains the same: \$15 for set-up and first three turns, and \$12 per three turns thereafter. This includes the turn results, the monthly newsletter of reports and the "annual" map. All those who expressed interest the first time are invited back now. See the modified (original) flyer enclosed.

Since the players concerned are all LOV players, a short LOV note.

The game continues under the system described in the April'82 newsletter, but there are only about 76 activated numbers. We hope to activate another 120 over the next year. As always, LOV news is available for a Self-Addressed-Stamped-Envelope.





Some changes should be apparent. Firstly, after all these years, I am changing our DEADLINE setting from Thursday to Saturday. Next issue is moving back two days to a Tuesday, and number 98 will move back 3 days to a Saturday, after which we will run every fourth Saturday from now on. A second change is that this issue, and from #99 on we are going back to printing in-place of photocopied issues. The reason being that since I don't get copies on the cheap or by outright theft from work, for example, the cost above a circulation of 25 is about the same as printing, and is actually better by far for my time.

Another change may be in frequency. Barring another commitment on me, I may start a section of CIVIL-IZATION (provided that I can get

the requisite number of players) which will require some bi-weekly issues (or a player-only report, combined with the next turn at issue time for the readers.)

I am also looking into better options, such as regular articles. If that comes to pass (only after 100) the rate will be 1/4¢ per word or \$1 per unit of 10cu.in. for artwork (1 page is about 82.5 cu.in.).

Final decisions about any change will come around #99. Until then a few ideas are being considered.

Meanwhile, let's see some articles for KAISSA #100. We don't have a hundreth issue every day! Right now I see it appearing just after May 1, so submissions must be in before April 1, PLEASE.
