- Basically you should send Barry:
- The route you wish to use to get to your destination.
- A list of purchases, in order of preference. It can be any length in length and can be changed merely by sending Barry a new list.
- A name for the Train that you control. eg: Carter's Cannonball?
- Your votes on the optional rules in the game. Optional rules are the variable price for Superchief and Merger of Railroads. See P3 of the Rail Baron rules.

cash on KK's you may  
find yourself short in  
paying the bills and  
have to sell something.  
Give Barry a list of  
your KK's in order that  
you wish them sold to  
cover these costs.

KB#1 looks interesting. A few short runs to start and Pat Conlon get's to go across continent. When you give Barry your 'buy' list - be sure to tell him how much 'running' money you want left.

The cash value in brackets is the pay out for the trip - payable on arrival. Naturally, longer trips pay the most and Western routes seem to pay higher than Eastern routes. The payoff schedule is included in the game but it did not photocopy well (blue ink) so players without the game won't have it. OK eh?

Cheap answers.

Stealing a line from W91130111E?4030111E, I'm going to use this space to answer some questions that have come my way recently.

Separation of Seasons. you can always ask for a separation but I don't automatically give it. A request for a separation due to a retreat will be given for situations where there are numerous retreats. Even though a retreat of a fleet from NH or MW can be quite variable, I won't give a separation since it can be easily countered by conditional orders. If several people request it your chances are better of getting it.

Conditional orders on a NMR. S'funny but 2 people asked about this this time. you can submit conditional orders on the player of a particular country (ie: Original or standby player) since that occurs before I do the adjudications. you cannot submit conditional orders on a particular country NMR'ing since that is that country's orders. It would be the same as saying: If France moves I wrest - Elig then I.... Anyway, that's the way I call it. So any GM's do it differently?

Anwyl of Weismark. Yes, he is a real person. He just happens to prefer to use another name for his gaming activities. Ron Brown of the CSO knows his real name, I know his real name and anybody in our Wargaming Club knows it. Be nice to him and he might tell you it? I haven't known Anwyl that long, perhaps 3 months or so but he does have short hair so he can't be all that bad (I said the same thing about Steve Hutton didn't I?). The only thing that I have against him is that the next time he rolls a double-one in Squad Leader-I stop putting in plugs for his zeene. Dave Weatherhead and I almost lost a 2-2 Leader, 3 squads and a flamethrower to a lousy Russian squad (We moved the board around and concluded that there was no line of sight).

Treaty Diplomacy - a variant.

Supplied by Hugh Polley. (1) All diplomacy rules apply. (2) Players may make two kinds of treaties a/ economic b/ military.

Economic Treaties: One power may lend a "specific centers" build to another power. If a power other than the lending power takes the center giving the loan, the contract is void. An economic treaty has a maximum life of two years.

Military Treaties: Two or more powers may sign a contract limiting the movements into a specified province or provinces. A military treaty has a maximum life of 2 years.

(3) GM's role: The GM will disallow any move which violates a contract, providing the move is protested by the injured party before the next deadline.

(4) Treaty form: Each party to a military treaty must send in a signed copy of a treaty, or a copy signed by both with the commencement date and ending date on the contract. The lending party and receiving party to a loan must be on the same loan agreement, along with the ending date and commencement date.

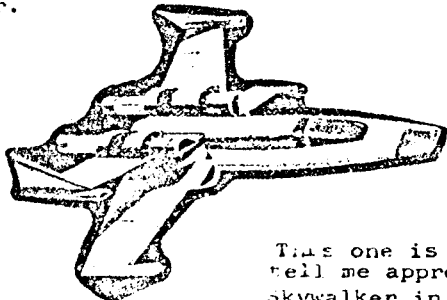
