up. Which, in turn, gave me the supply centers for the win. I was wondering why I did not recieve any opposition in my battles in the west. I nrow know why. I would like to thank George Mills for his faithfulness as an ally and Dave Carter for GM'ing the game. I think you did a great job. Sign me up for the next game.

Congratulations Dave. I won't be opening any more Deadman dip. They are just too hard to GM when you don't have the feedback of the players to point out mistakes etc.

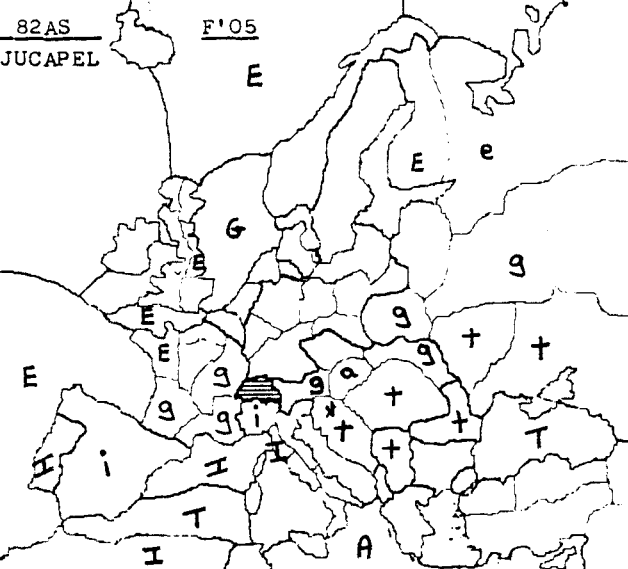

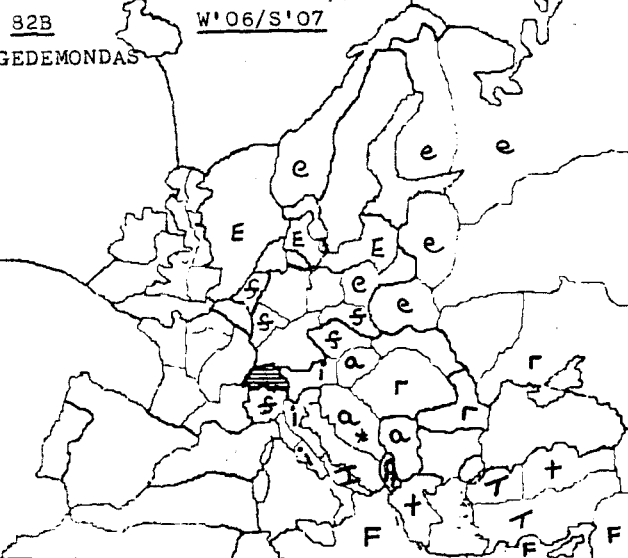

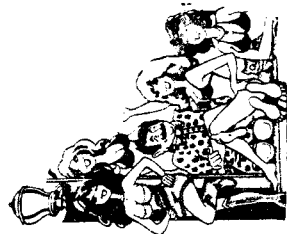
