As for code names? I started off with Lord of the Ring names and now I'm into SF book titles. Yes, there was some duplication of names.

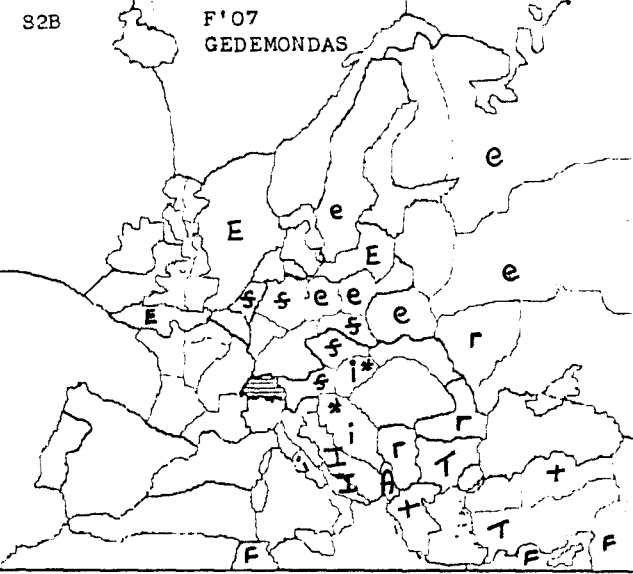

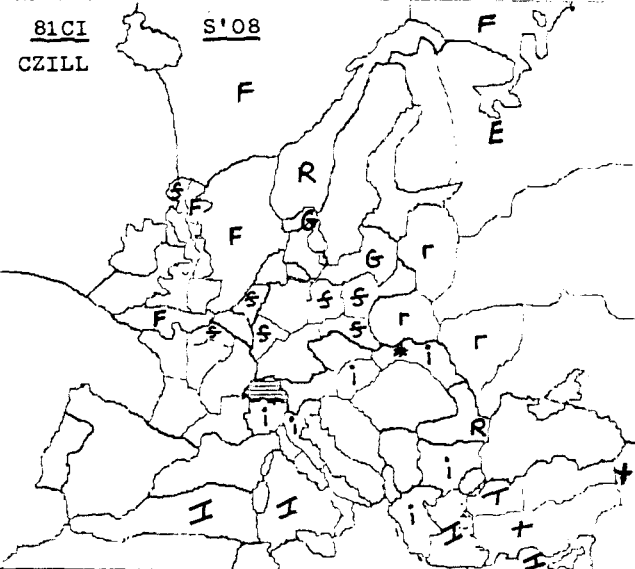

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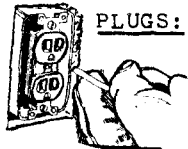
Influential Player Rankings - Update 9th June 1983.
