SOME GM'S allow a player to ask the GM to "announce" his vote. That is, the GM, on request by Player X, tells the other players that Player X voted YES to a G/F draw. Since the GM can't lie you know that Player X really did vote YES. WHO CARES (GM: Russ Rusnak) does not allow this and recently CHEESECAKE (GM: Andy Lischett) changed his rules to disallow it. There's nothing wrong with that since GM's have different ideas on how things should be run. Andy explains his change this way.....

"More than once players have complained to me that they were 'forced' to make votes public by the threat of overwhelming opposition if they didn't. It's Okay to gang up on someone who won't accept a draw, but that someone has the right to lie about accepting the draw, and the GM has no business helping anyone deny him of that right."

....The trouble with ganging up on someone who won't accept a draw is that there is no way of knowing wether he did or not without a public vote. I would expect that in games where a public vote is in effect on request, that the outcomes will have less solo wins since it'd be much harder to stab. With my wimp-like mellow approach to playing that's why I like the rule and that's why I allow public votes.

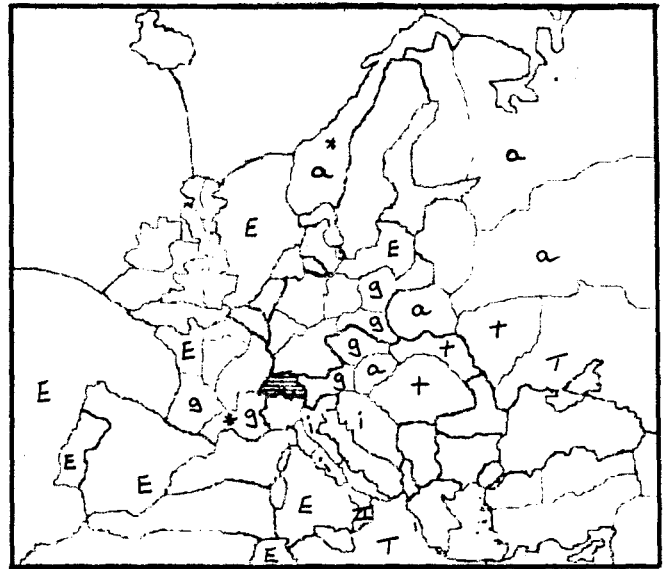
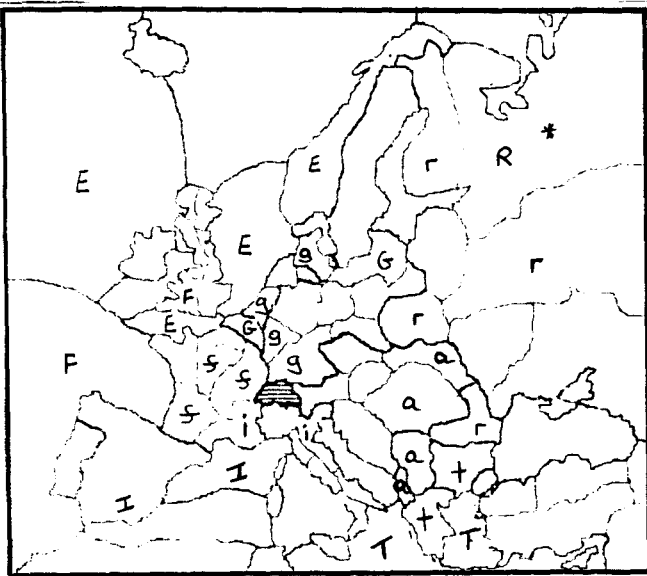
I have Spring orders on file for all but France. This means that Mark Keller will be the Turkish player in S'05. Thanks to Mike Gerein for unused Standby orders.

From Jim McCarthy: "I've played Rail Baron at Cons and have the game but how does it work by postal play?"

From Robert Jewett: "Lo and behold under the Christmas tree was a rail baron game. I would not mind taking on exciting positions but would like some help on the meaning of what you publish on the PBM Rail Baron games?"

PBM Rail Baron and FTF Rail Baron are almost identical. A player submits (1) His route to his destination listing the lines to be taken and where to change lines (2) A list of buys for when he arrives. The list can be any length long and usually has a minimum amount of "running money" that he wants to have left after a purchase (3) An alternate region destination should his region roll be the same as where he is.

Like ftf a round is done in sequence with BLACK going first and YELLOW last. Therefore if BLA arrives at a destination his buy list takes priority over a later player's arrival. A round will consist of as many turns as can be rolled before any player arrives at a destination. If any player arrives at a destination in a turn then no further turns are done, although the round will be finished so that everyone has an equal number of rolls. It's done this way because so much can happen when a player arrives at a destination that can't be forecast by the other players, eg: (1) A line may be bought that would necessitate a change in routing for another player. (2) The arriving player's next destination may be "locked in" so that another player may want to change his purchase list priority in order to screw the poor sap.

The game print-out consists of (1) Players name. (2) Name of his choo choo. (3) Die rolls for each turn, eg: f12[5,6]. (4) Position on the board and the line that he is established on. (5) Destination. (6) Payout on arrival. (7) Trip #. (8) List of holdings (9) financial matters.

Financial matters have the following abbreviations: pr=purchase, py=payout (Completed a trip.) ub=Used a bank's line, uYEL=Used Yellow's line, fBLU=Recieved from BLUE \$x for use of your line, adv=advance from the bank to tide you over till an auction of your line(s) is completed next turn.

You want some Dave Carter strategic advice? Buy at least the NYC or PA, preferably the PA!! You have

to be able to have an established line in the NE since NE is called 21% of the time. New York itself is called 4% of the time. I know that a lot of players go for the SE cos it's cheap (14g for SAL and 12g for ACL) but SE is called only 12.5% and of that 12.5% Atlanta is called the most and is not a locked city. I tend to completely ignore buying SE lines and concentrate on gobbling up the NE.

Does any other RB player have some different advice? Send it in and I'll print it.

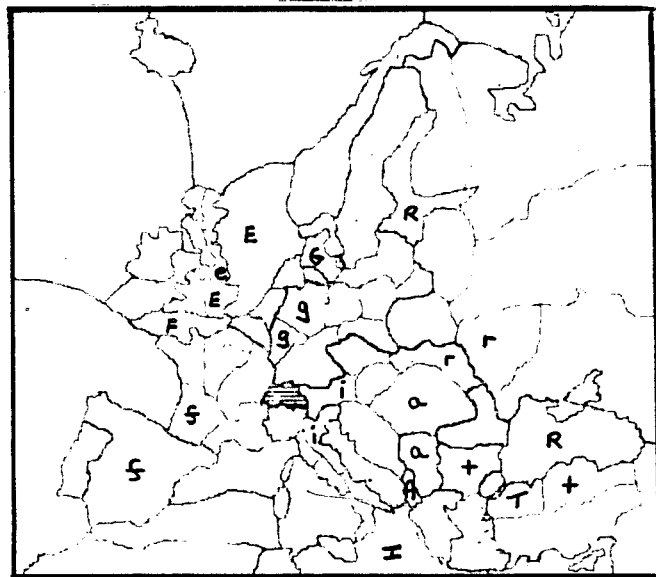

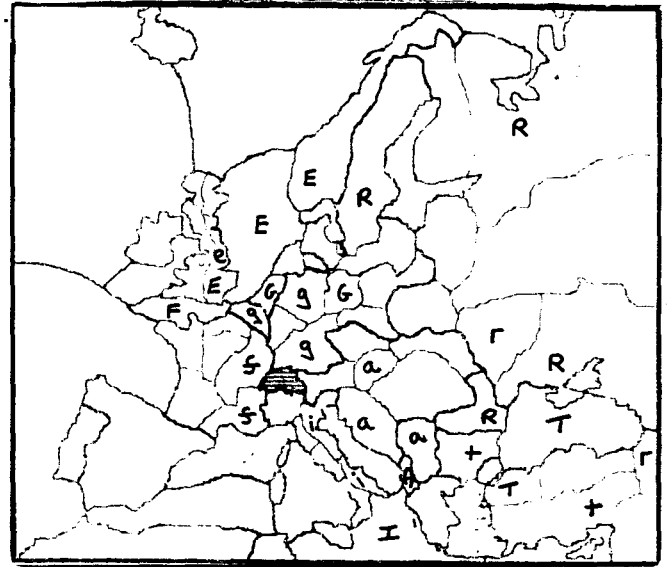
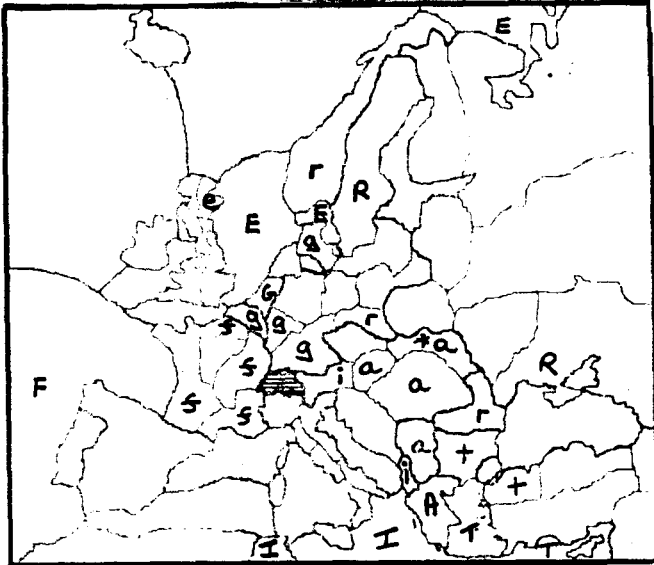
