Combine that with the natural drop out problem from games being rehoused after a 7 month hiatus and what you are experiencing could be just a natural phenomeneon. No, that doesn't excuse them from writing to you, but considering some of the abuse that players in Canada have had from past GM's (Bob Albrecht, Bill LaFosse, INFIDEL's 7 month non-publication with no word to the players etc) who knows how it may have affected their attitudes and sense of ethics/morals? ((In a recent phone conversation with John Caruso (WHITESTONIA) he did not seem to have heard about the exploits of Canada's Louis Riel. I guess they don't get CBC in New York City.))

The Gatling Gun "turned defeat into victory and ended the campaign, thereby saving millions of dollars for the Dominion Government."

This examplary ad was issued after the successfull use of the Gatling Gun - the first machine gun - by Government forces at Batoche, Saskatchewan, against Louis Riel's Metis ((Metis are ½ Indian and ½ French settlers - I think?)). The gun sprayed .45 calibre bullets at 25 rounds per second or 1500 rounds per minute. It enabled the government forces to literally mow the rebels down.

Thomas Scott was an Ontario Orangeman who was executed by the provisional government of Louis Riel on March 4, 1870. Scott had been arrested during the Riel uprising along with other Canadians. Scott escaped from Ft Garry and formed a body of armed men with the purpose of returning to Ft Garry to free the other imprisoned Canadians. Unknown to Scott, the Riel government had already agreed to release the prisoners as part of a peace settlement with the Canadian government. Ignorant of this, Scott's party headed for Ft Garry, were discovered by a

group of Metis warriors and captured. Scott proved so troublesome that a court-

martial was held and he was executed ((Interestingly enough, John Leeder, who pubs RUNESTONE, also pubs a French language dip zine called BATOCHE!))

Dirty Deeds! (Done dirt cheap).

There have been several controversies in the last while over GMing of games. In LIFE OF MONTY #14, Don Del Grande explains what happened to 81CP. It seems that the Spring 1901 order for Russia was F Black-Rum. Kathy Byrne, who was playing the position, claims that it was "F Sev-Rum" and she has a carbon copy to prove it. Don does not have his copy of the original order but he says, "I'm sure I'm right, more or less." Kathy talked to Randolph Smyth, the NADF ombudsman, and Don talked to Don Ditter (The BN Cusodian). After a vote among the players it is 4-2 (1 abstention) to go back to Fall 1901 and allow F Sev-Rum.

At this point, Mark Lew raises his objection to what is happening and writes to the other players. Don Del Grande then gets a letter from Kathy resigning from the game as a direct result of Mark Lew's actions. Don, at this point, polls the other players as to wether or not they wish to continue. Dick Martin and Mark Lew do not want to continue whilst Steve Arnawoodian, John Michalski, Dave Grabar and Scott Hanson do. Anyone want to help fill out 81CP?

In Robert Sacks latest list of Game openings there is a notation under Eric Ozog (Diplomacy by Moonlight) that, "Publisher has confessed to committing GM irregularity in one game in helping one player to win, but has pledged not to repeat it." The game was 79IW. Eric phoned up the xxxxxxx player and told him that he had not submitted orders (2 weeks after the deadline) and would he like to submit them. The GM then said "If you give me the following orders the game will end in an 18 supply center victory for England." The player did as requested and England did win. Eric is now back in the hobby and attemting to give publing and Gming another try. According to the sample issue that I got, Eric is testing the waters to see what the response will be to his zine. What he calls his "Oct

2nd, fill em up or bow out" philosophy.

GM/player disputes are not new. In fact Mark Berch devoted a whole issue of his DIPLOMACY DIGEST (#30) to the 1975CM affair. In 75CM the GM adjudicated the French player as NMRing in 1902 when what had really happened was that the GM (David Gladstein) had mislaid the orders. When he did find the orders he readjudicated the season with the excuse that the orders had been "delayed in the mail" and were now being accepted. The dispute came before the JudCom of the IDA and Dave was found guilty of giving an "untrue explanation" to the players concerning his reasons for accepting the French orders. No sanctions were taken against him since he had resigned as GM and was not GMing any other games.

I hope never to have anything like that happen in SK and to try to safeguard it I am keeping all orders sent to me until the game finishes. That means even the orders that you send that are later superseded. Of course, it helps to have a large house to store the files in. I also file game orders in a binder as soon as they arrive.

Postal Hikes!

Just what the Canadian Dippy hobby needed - higher mail costs. How will this affect you, the SK subscriber? Well, I already have increased the sub cost to 5octs an issue and I do not intend to put it any higher for a long while.

I am just wondering how will this affect the games themself? Will The basic first-class letter rate would people write as much? Will they reduce their number of games? Will people get so pissed off at this hefty increase and just chuck pbm games completely?

I still haven't figured out why the government is giving us 2 months to think about the increase?

OTTAWA (CP) — Proposed postal increases involve hundreds of different rates, depending on the kind of mail, its size, its shape and whether it is going first-class by air or in a lower class by ground transportation.

Following are highlights of the increases unveiled yesterday, including the scheduled date of implementation in 1982, subject to confirmation by the federal government in two months:

- increase to 30 cents from 17 cents if mailed to a Canadian location and to 35 cents from 17 cents if mailed to the U.S. Jan. 1.
- ☐ The first-class letter rate would cost 21 cents a letter in bulk mailing of at least 20,000 and 21 cents each in bulk mailing of at least 5,000 if presorted by the customer. The bulk first-class rate now is 17 cents a letter. Jan. 1.

Highlights

- ☐ Third-class addressed mail would increase to 30 cents from 15 cents. Bulk third-class rates would go to a minimum 13 cents from 9 cents. Jan. 1.
- ☐ The price of a first-class letter abroad would rise from 35 cents to 60 cents, and printed matter from 18 cents to 30 cents for surface mail and 27 cents to 45 cents for air mail, Jan. 1.
- ☐ First-class parcel rates would remain unchanged up to one kilogram. Rates for heavier parcels would rise by between 9 per cent and 34 per cent.
- ☐ The basic fee for registering mail would increase to \$1.85 from \$1.50. The minimum fee for cash-on-delivery mail would rise to \$1.50 from \$1.
