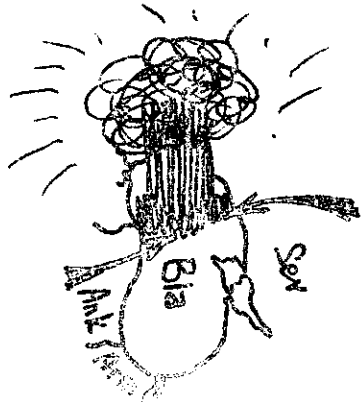

#### LEUDE SIGNE QUOGU

1. When I first said there would be two weeks between deadlines, some of you said, "That long?" Now I'm getting complaints that there isn't enough time. Now, I'm indifferent to how long we have, so you-all can vote on it. With Winter moves each player is also required to vote in favor of two weeks between deadlines or three weeks between deadlines. I will abide by the majority decision.

2. Convoy. Add to the House Rules, as Rule #36, the following: 36. CONVOY ORDERS. The movement order given to an army which is to be convoyed must specify the exact convoy route to be taken by the army, with the convoying fleets listed in the order in which the fleets will be used; thus: A Lon-Tun (Eng, Mid, Wes). Convoy orders given to fleets other than those listed are invalid, subject to the considerations of Rule 11.

3. Crawling Retreat & Coastal Crawl. Delete House-Rules 21 and 22. House-Rule 21a is now House-Rule 19, corollary d. Add House-Rule 37, to read, 37. SPACE. The word "space" in the Rules of Diplomacy is interpreted to mean "a province or body of water" (in the same way that "unit" means "army or fleet"). No ruling will be made, nor any move allowed, which treats any province or body of water as if it were more than one space. No exchange of position (except as noted in House-Rule 19, corollary d) will be used. The Coastal Crawl, the Crawling Retreat, and the Changing of the Guard are not used.

4. LILLIPUT, my new regular 'sine, has game openings at \$4 (\$3 for regular members of the NFFP Games Bureau or the International Federation of Wargamers).

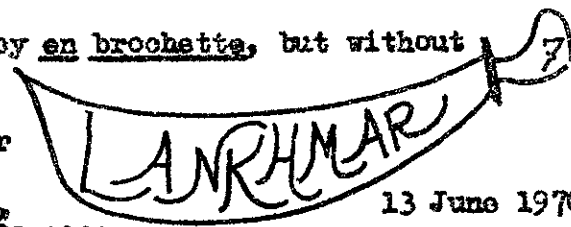

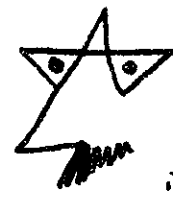
**THERE WAS A YOUNGE MAIDE**

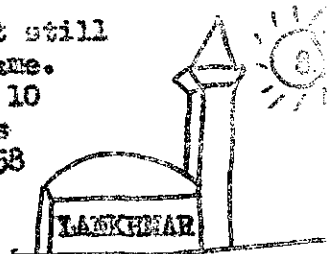
Big Brother is watching you

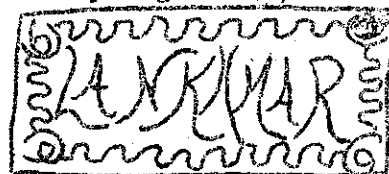

This unit will be under the command of General Marcellus Fabius Gracchus, a gentleman of Turkish ancestry and a master of the art of taking tanks over mountain passes and through the steaming jungles of Spain.
