FALL 1904 MOVES are due on Monday, 25 October 1970. This extra long deadline is to insure a smooth change-over to the new schedule.

Moves may be made conditional upon the direction of the Turkish retreat.

After Fall 1904, if Austria has no adjustments, or if Austria submits advance conditional adjustments, or if Austria has no supply centers, I will take Winter 1904 adjustments not later than 12:30, Tuesday, 26 October 1970 and publish them along with the Fall moves. Therefore, everybody should see me Tuesday morning; I'll be there (in the office), of course. If it is not possible for you to make it in on Tuesday morning, give me a call at home Tuesday night. My number is 282-1921.

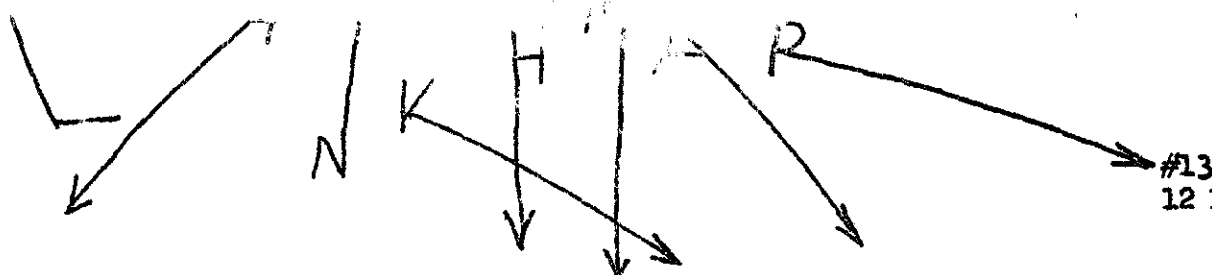

I've been ill, as most of you know, which accounts for the long delay of this. The deadline is accordingly delayed.

If any of you cares about the fate of Germany, you might mention to Bill Oberschulte that he ought to get his move in.

ROME: The commander of the army referred to as the Trieste Corps has been changed due to a temporary state of war. Pro-consuls Marcellus and Flabus have been placed in joint command of all units in the Imperial Army. They replace Varro and Paulus as Supreme Commanders and Pyrrhus as commanders of Fleet Forces West. Their first orders were, lift the standards, strike quickly, and hold the high points; we must prevent a Persian invasion of Marathon and recapture our strongholds of Bithynia and Thrace. After this we must consolidate our holdings in Transalpine Gaul and our amici city of Saguntum. At this point the attacks on the Getae and on Pergamon began spontaneously. ... (there's more, but no room)

Fall 1905: Perry Andrus will be at his Tempo AR address over the Thanksgiving holidays. Since no Winter adjustments are required of him, this should not make too much difference.

Wouldn't you know it. I line up a replacement player for Germany and Bill Oberschulte's moves miraculously appear. Ron is one of my History 30 students this year and a wargamer. He has not played Diplomacy before, but will learn the game.

1970AF -- NEW KAISER GIVEN CHANCE TO GIRD LOINS

Winter 1905:

AUSTRIA (Andrus): No change. Has A Gal, A War.

ENGLAND (Wolfe): B F Nwy. Has F Iri, A Hol, F Nth, F Don, A Gas, F Eng.

FRANCE (Everson): B F Mar. Has A Bre, A Par, F Mid, F Mar, is 1 short.

GERMANY (Oberschulte): No change. Has A Kie, F Ber, A Mun.

ITALY (Gullett): B F Nap. Has F Nap, F Apu, A Sor, A Bud, F Aeg, F Gre, A Alb.

RUSSIA (Stephenson): B A StP. Has A StP, A Lva, F Bel.

TURKEY (LaMotte): F Aeg (R)-Smy. Has: F Eas, F Smy, F Con, A Ser, A Bul, A Mos, A Ukr, A Rum.

SPRING 1906 MOVES were due on 8 December 1970. OK so far?

NOW it turns out that Bill Oberschulte has been drafted and has left town. He has therefore resigned (or is removed without prejudice, whichever you will) from 1970AF. He is replaced immediately by Ron Ridgeway, whose address and 'phone # were in #14. However, Ron will be gone over Xmas. I would like to give him a chance to negotiate prior to SO6. Therefore, the deadline for Spring 1906 is moved to Tuesday, 12 January 1971 (and no later), subject to the following conditions:

Players who change the moves already on file may change the moves only of units which border on spaces occupied by German units or which border on spaces to which German units can move. Such changes must be accompanied by a statement showing that the fact of a new German player is in fact the reason for the change. Units which border on spaces to which German units may move count only if they can also move to the same spaces. Units thus affected are: AUSTRIAN A Gal, A War; ENGLISH A Hol, F Nth, F Den, A Gas; FRENCH A Par; RUSSIAN F Bel, A Lva. These are the only units whose moves may be changed (and only as a result of negotiations with the new German player).

The reason I have to go through this rigamarole is that some of you can't wait for moves to be published. Let me state now, flatly, that hereafter I will feel perfectly free to alter the deadline, even ex post facto, if in my judgement this is in the best interest of the game. Therefore, whatever any player says about his moves after the deadline is his responsibility, not mine, and I will not take this factor into consideration in future decisions of this sort. You have all now been warned.

FALL 1906 MOVES are due by Thursday, 21 January 1971, NOT LATER THAN 2:00 pm.

Players will be notified if Turkey wishes to exercise his option to remove one or both of the dislodged units. I assume he would wish to retreat them, but one never knows in this game....

Save for the addition of German moves, none of the above represents any change of moves. One or more proposed changes were submitted, but without sufficient grounds showing the new Germany had changed things. I will not say who submitted changed move(s), or what the move(s) was/were, since this would necessarily reveal possible plans/intentions/negotiations.

ROMA (51 B.C.)(!1777!): The capital has been in a panic for weeks awaiting news of the fleet and army. One observes the touch of Fabius Maximus in the speed of recent events. However, by press time that will all be rectified.

We have it on good authority that Pompey is preparing to lend the Gauls a force of galleys for their upcoming invasion of Carthage; this while Pompey himself is occupied in sweeping Cyprus of her pirate monarchs and liberating the empire of Antiochus IV from his usurper, Mithridates.

Peace has finally been concluded with the would-be Hamilcar Barca. In fact, it is identical to the peace signed before by him.

In a surprise move the Papacy has transferred its seat from the Vatican to Corinth. This is to be a jumping-off place to Christianize Asia Minor and recapture the holy land of Orthodoxy.

Meanwhile the new Pontifex Maximus and Consul announced, "I will not, nor will I ever, violate treaties before the other party does. I intend to maintain peace throughout the world, Pax Romana for all, especially those barbarians to our far north, the non o' Germanic stock. 'Eine Leute, Eine Sprache, Ein Land'. And again I say, as Livy, 'Pax Romana'." The plebs then applauded and went back to their pastimes until the Circus.
