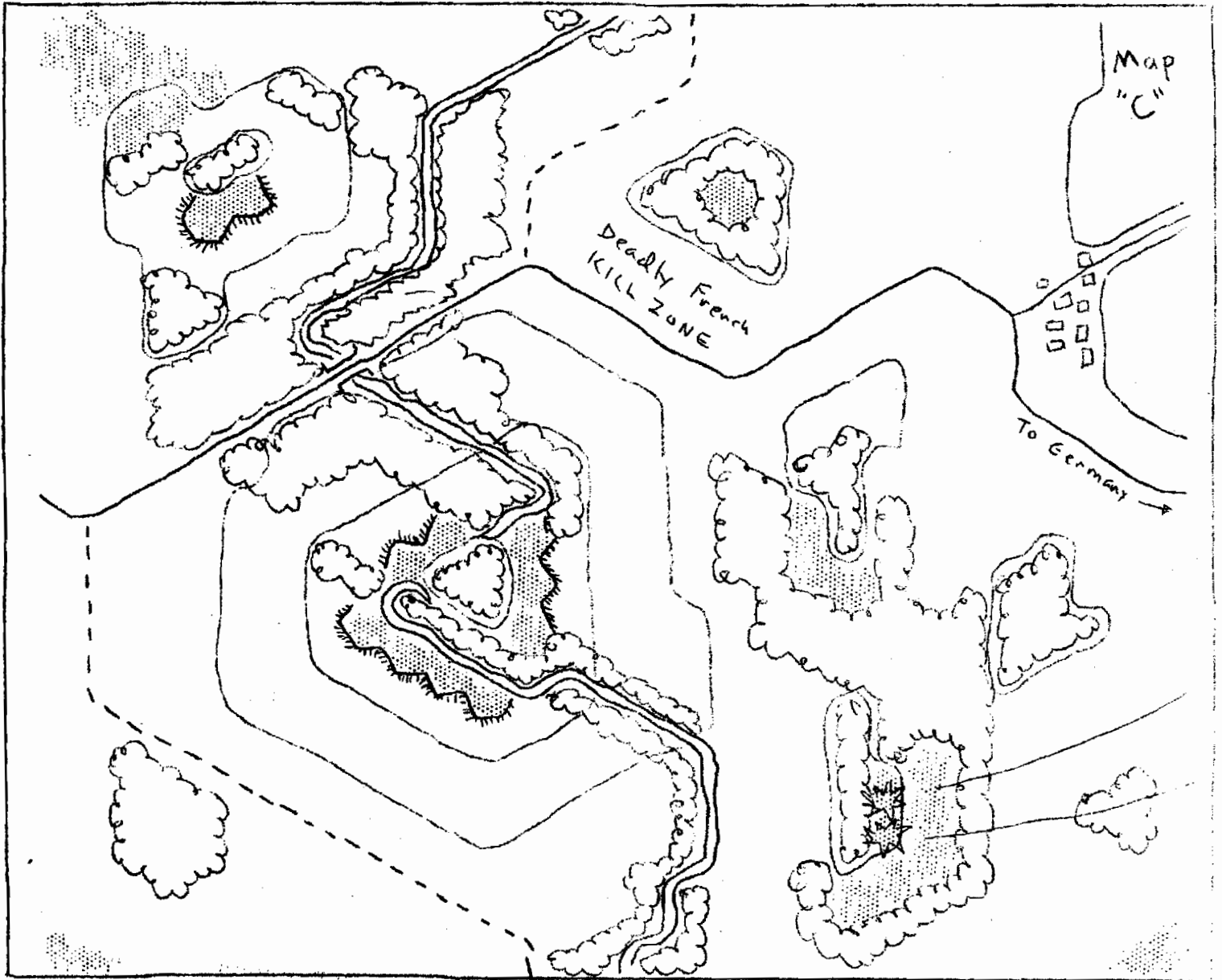

These 3 goals have to do with protection of society from anti-social acts. One's opinion on the Death Penalty should be founded on these criteria.

My personal view is the Death Penalty does nothing to achieve Restitution, nor does it Rehabilitate the malfeator. And it only deters to the extent that the executed person will not again commit the act for which he was executed. I believe societies with no Death Penalty have fewer violent crimes than the US with the Death Penalty.

[You'll note I've made a couple of minor changes in the AB reports. Maybe you'll hve some comments. I've begun reporting unit spottings only by general type. This will be important in multi-player scenarios. You may shoot at an allied player's units unless you both work out where you plan to operate. I'll report to individual players (where requested specifically) the exact weapon type when you are within 10 hexes or 1/5 of the spotting range to the unit (whichever is less).

The IF reports are now followed by a designated number. This number indicates the "class" of IF. There are 5 classes of IF. If the IF only impacts the impact hex, it is class "1"; if it impacts the impact hex plus 4 rings, it is class "5". This will let players know who close they may come to IF before they have to worry about being under the barrage. Clearly an improvement in reporting procedures, it seems to me. But I'm open to arguments.]

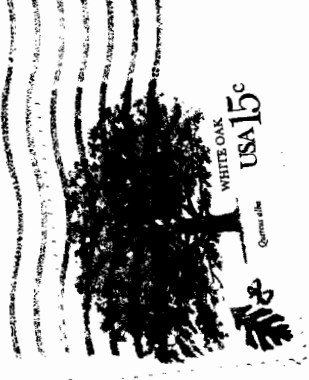
