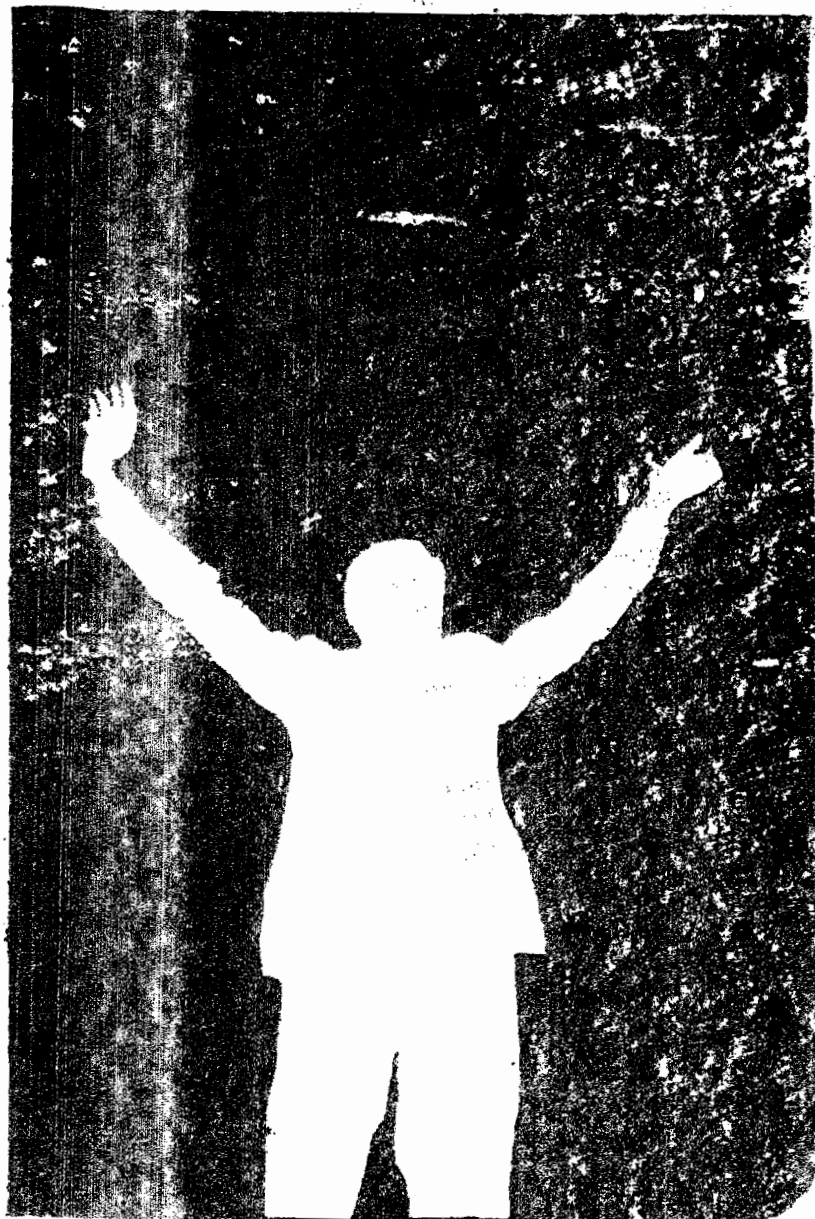

Press: Geneva(NMR): Massive rearmament has swept Europe over the past few months, according to a report by the Geneva Pacifist's Union. The report blamed the rearmament on renewed rivalries over the Balkans, the low countries, and scandinavia.

The Union estimates that European land forces have increased by 40%, and naval forces by 45%. The largest increases were by France, which tripled the size of its navy; Germany, which doubled its navy and increased its army by 50%; and Austria, which doubled its army.

Italy was identified as the only country not to join in rearmament. In a statement, President Schnick of the Union praised Italy for "setting an example which will shame and inspire the rest of Europe."

Diplomatic sources in several countries placed Italy high on their list of targets for the coming year.
