





he gave out. You want to trust him?





Moderating AB isn't very much fun this turn. In the last few days I received letters from Cottle, Seman, and Frediani containing complaints about my moderating. This isn't unusual! Their letters always contain complaints. But these latest letters reach a new crescendo of intensity (or else I'm just becoming more sensitive). Cottle and Seman usually have a half dozen or so items about which to complain. Frediani seldom has complaints of his own, but not to be left out, he feels he must complain about the errors cited by Cottle and Seman, too.

Now I've never minded being told of the errors a player finds in a turn. And I haven't minded using citations of GM errors in press or diplomacy. What I do mind is the suggestion that it's my fault someone is losing a scenario, or that my errors are causing someone to lose the enjoyment he once received from playing AB.

If you don't enjoy the game, don't play. I'm not saying anything else. I don't want anyone to quit the game, but my advice to anyone is to play for enjoyment! If you can't enjoy -- don't play. But I do want to place these errors in perspective.

You 3 players also all played AB back when we had a Panic Rule. You know (and should remember) we abolished that rule in favor of enshrining GM error as a substitute Panic Rule. I know Cottle remembers, because he usually closes each item of complaint with a sarcastic "Panic, right?". Right! In my view, trading GM error for the old Panic Rule works out to everyone's advantage. The GM no longer has to double-check all plots, and then triple-check for Panic. The players no longer see 10% of their units panic for each Panic Level of their force. Do you really want to go back to that? I don't. If you want a Panic Rule so you can get me to correct GM errors, I'll go for one like this: Each turn I roll a D10. If it's < one's Panic Level, I write "PANIC" across the turn sheet and send it back unexecuted. Will that be better? Sure! You don't think in real life all units follow the orders given them by commanders?

Like I say, don't stop telling me about the errors I make... I want to know. But the only reason I enjoy moderating PBM games is because players enjoy it, and I enjoy moderating games which players enjoy. If you cease to enjoy a game, stop playing it. Don't try to dump all your frustration and bad feelings on me. That's not what I'm here for, and I don't take it very well. If you can think of a Panic Rule which is easy to moderate, make a suggestion for change. You know I like change!

On the subject of change: the change to the ARAB rules will be welcome to me. I think I'll enjoy it a lot more than the current rules. Even though I want it, I don't want to impose ARAB upon any unwilling players. Maybe we can make them voluntary! Those who want ARAB, ok! Those who don't, can still play by the old rules. The ARAB rules don't change the AB 8 Tactical Rules at all, except for hardening up CAS (by requiring more AA hits to DE the HE attack value), and for changing some of the tactical unit values (which change from year to year anyway). Everytime I find out something new about the units...

Anyways, some of us have had the ARAB rules to look over for some months now. And there are still several weeks before 1945 begins. So let's give the rules some serious consideration, ok? I'm sure I'll enjoy moderating the new rules.

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
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
