JUNTA: Coup Phases 4 & 5

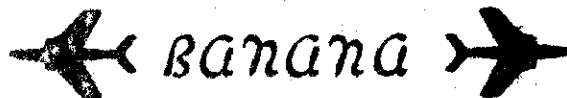

## AN OPEN LETTER TO JIM BUMPAS:

Playing AB is getting to be less and less fun, and more frustrating. No Jim, you're not becoming more sensitive (at least that I can tell). My letters have indeed contained more complaints lately. Things have been building up over the past 4-5 months culminating in the last couple of letters I sent to you.

Correct me if I'm wrong, but I don't recall my having blamed you for causing me to lose a scenario (though I'd love to have a scapegoat for DRAB). I may have blamed you in a fit of rage but I don't recall it. What bothers me the most is your attitude, which in effect says, "it doesn't matter if I make mistakes, you're good enough to win the scenario anyway." Your comments on my moves such as "give me some panic" when my units scatter over the map because you forgot to plot a couple of turns of their movement is also irksome.

I do indeed remember the old AB3 panic rule. Compared to the GM "panic" it has its pluses and minuses. The main plus was when a unit panic moved you knew it right away from your turn sheet, rather than 2/3 or 4 turns later when you moved or fired the unit. The main problem with it was we had not only that panic rule but also the GM "panic". The all or nothing panic sounds interesting. It might bear some discussion.

On the subject of real life units, if I wanted real life I'd either go back in the Marines or move to New York City. I play games for the competition and the enjoyment, not because I want to recreate real life combat.

I'd like to respond to what I feel was an unfair remark about Frediani. I spend quite a bit of time on the phone with Jim discussing the game. It's inevitable that I mention the latest "panic" to descend on my units. We also spend quite a bit of time bringing each other up to date on the latest rules "interpretations" to rear their heads. As a result of these talks, it is not uncommon for me to ask Jim to mention various things to you if he happens to talk to you. Therefore, I must take a good portion of blame when he brings my complaints to your attention.

On the subject of change, I'm not totally opposed to it. The unit lists (except for very minor changes) are the best we've had in a long time. I do however object to such a drastic change in the rules and maps in what is in effect the middle of a game. Change when change is cried out for is fine. Change just for the sake of change is not. Especially when for the past 3 years or so all the players have based strategies on the old rules. More so when the majority of players in the game are opposed to the changes. If you want to use the ARAB rules then start another game based on them. I certainly hope you're not serious about using ARAB rules for those who want too, while keeping the old rules for those who don't want ARAB. As for your statement that ARAB rules don't change the tactical rules at all, a quick glance at ARAB rules 5.1, 5.11, 5.12, 5.21, 5.22, 7.43, 7.62, 7.7 and all the Optional Rules 10.0 seem to change the tactical rules very much.

In conclusion, it seems to me that over the past 4-6 months, the incidence of GM "panic" has taken a dramatic increase. Maybe it's just that I'm becoming more sensitive. In my talks with other players, the feeling that possibly you're trying to do too much and as a result are making more errors. I honestly don't know what the answer is. I do know there is no way on earth I could moderate as many games as you do and put up with as much abuse as I (and I'm sure other players) give you. My hat is off to you.

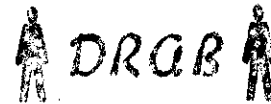

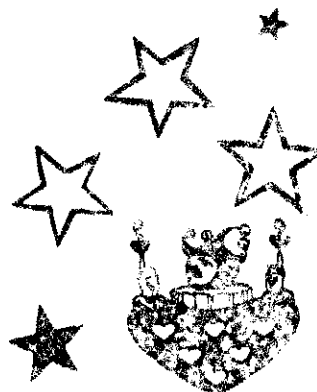

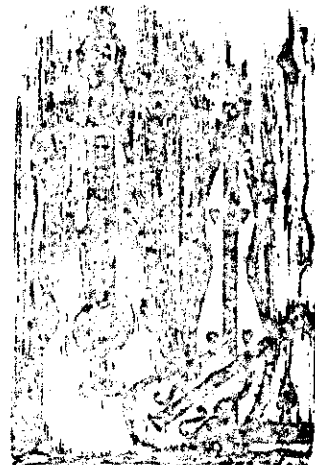
