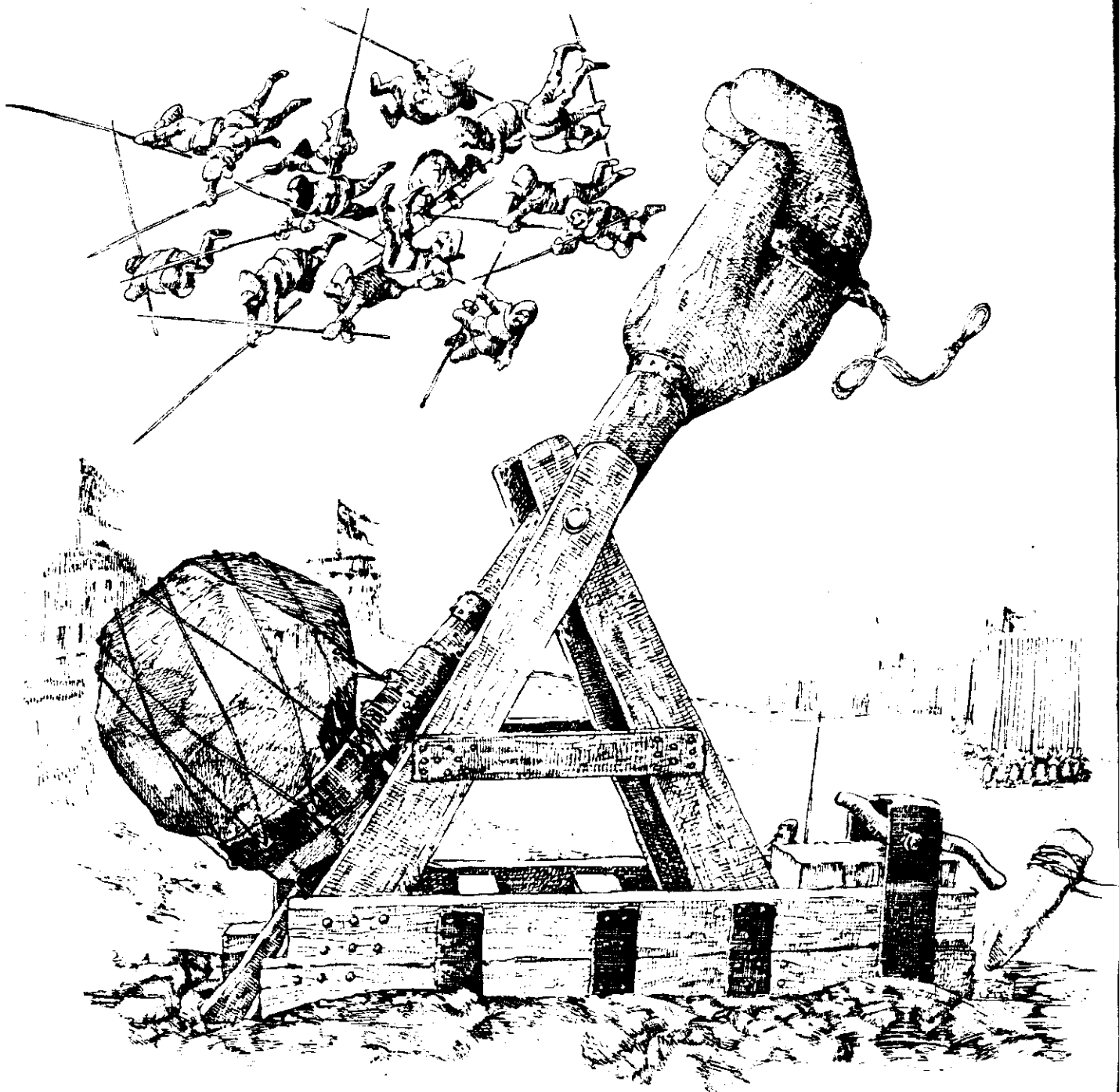


LIBERTERREAN

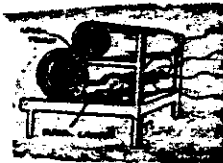
HAPPY BIRTHDAY!

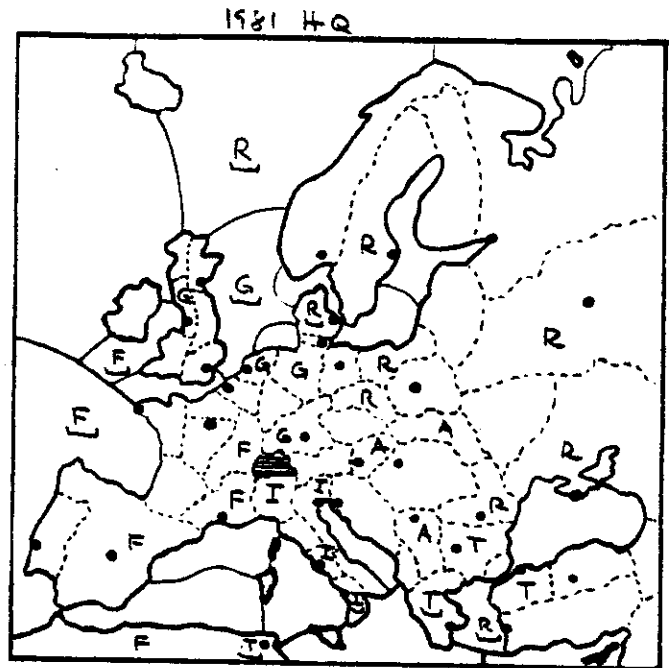

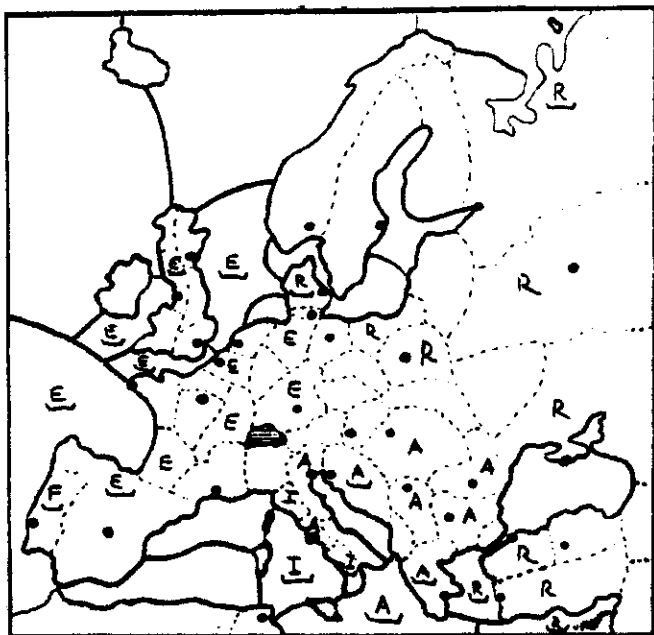

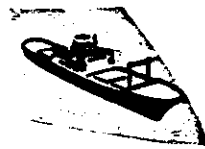
PRESS:

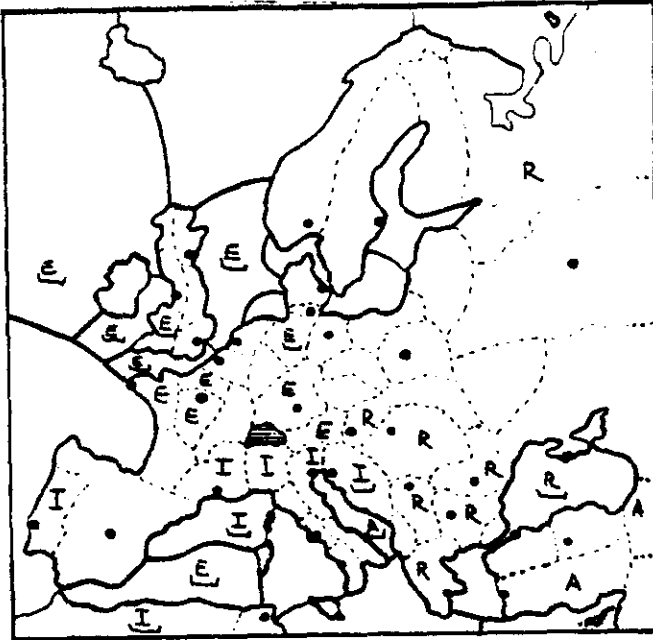

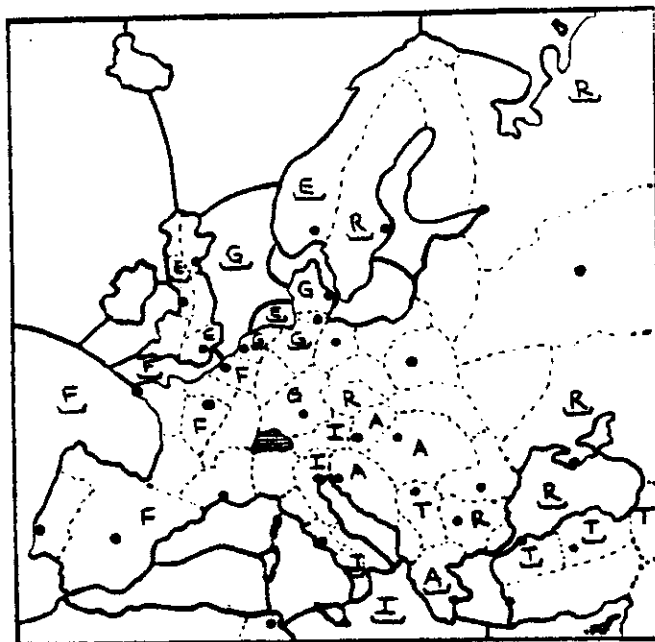

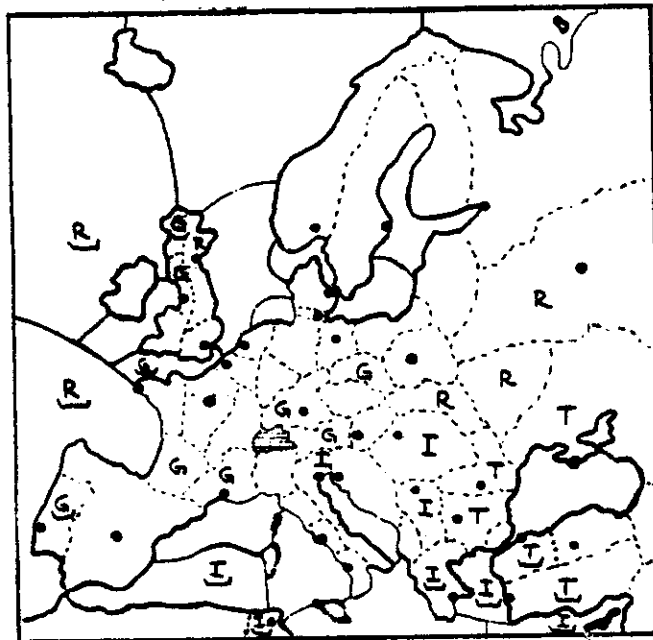
Tsar donned his mud boots and set out to thread his hook -- with a line and a stinker.

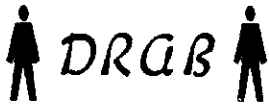

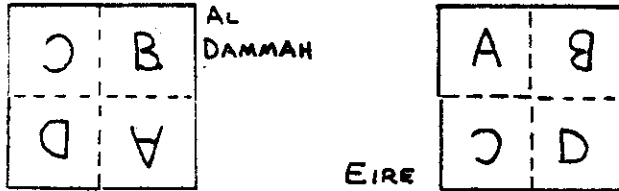

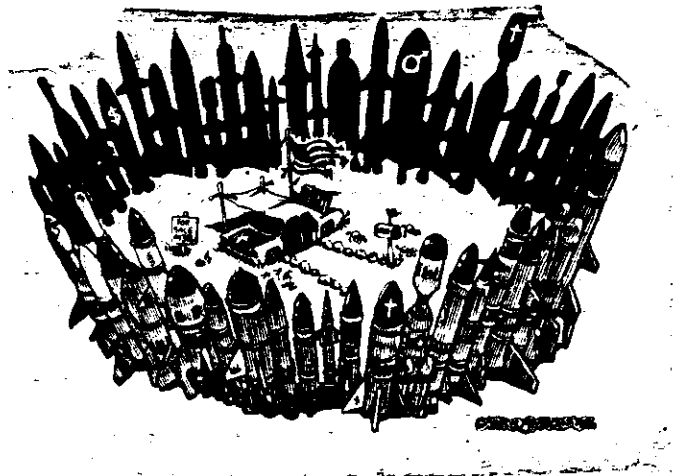
