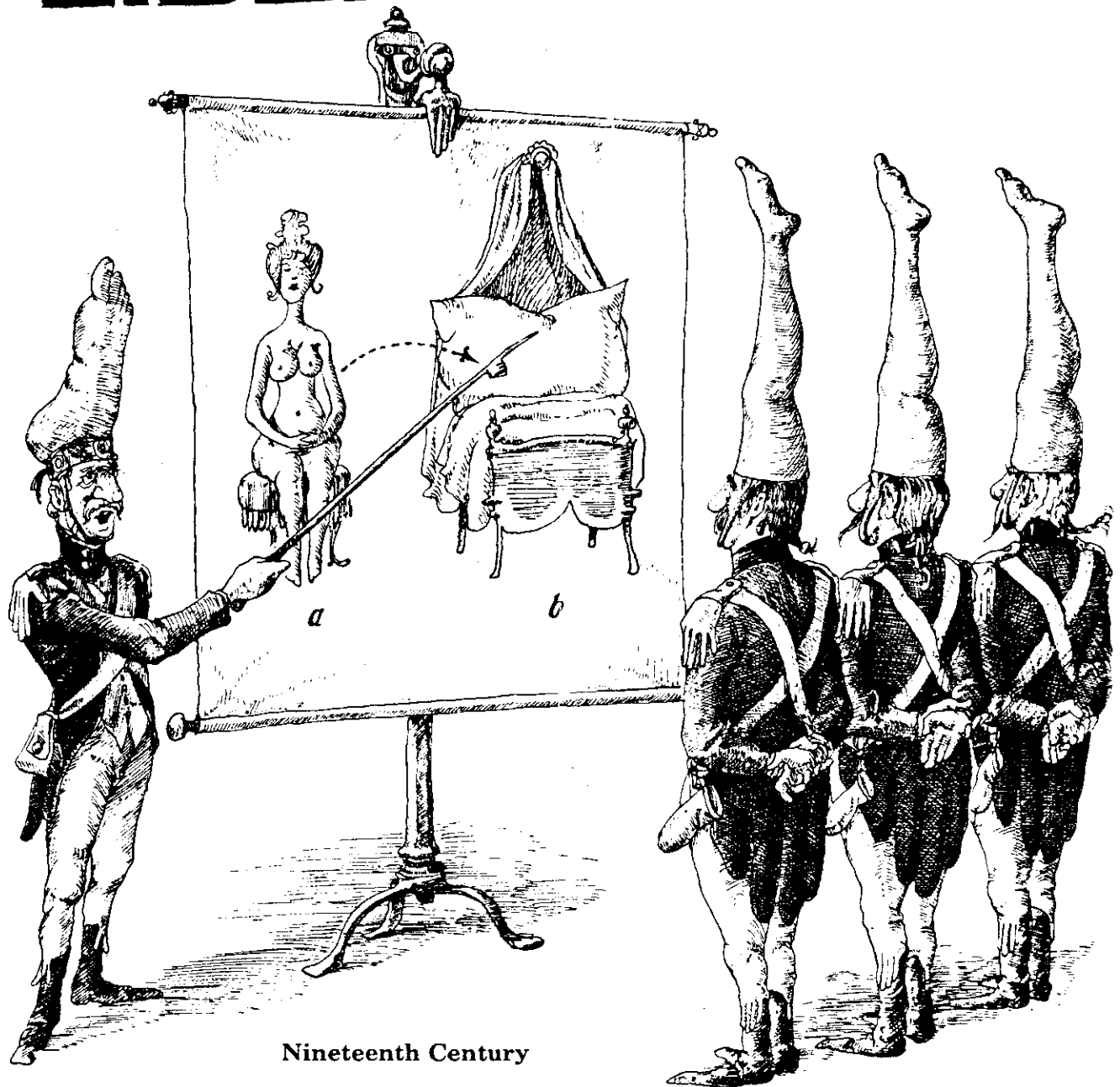

LIBERTERREAN BULLETIN BOARD:

The LIB BBS is now in operation. I have 2 different public-domain terminal programs: JTERM33 (the one I use), and AMISTERM (designed for use with the BBS I use). Both work well, but they will need translating to work on any but an ATARI computer.

You don't need an ATARI to use the LIB BBS. You don't even need a computer (a mere terminal will do). You do need terminal software (to convert your computer into a terminal connected to the BBS) and you need a Modem (the Radio Shackman for the ATARI is a good one for about \$80).

I'll try to keep the BBS up between the hours of 11:00 pm and Midnight, Pacific Time. Set communications parameters to Light Translation, No Parity, 300 baud, 7 data bits, 1 stop bit. The software will automatically set some, or all of these parameters. JTERM33 permits user selection of translation mode and parity. The "300 baud" means the communication can take place at "300 bps", or characters per second. This means an entire type-written page can be transmitted in about 10 seconds. This "electronic mail" is cheaper than Special Delivery or Night Letters, and you can check for yourself to see if it's delivered. Your message can be read to verify my ATARI has recorded it.

If you don't have a cassette or disk system, you'll have to type your messages in by hand. This is slower than talking, but at least the typos will be yours, and not mine.

I'll also put game reports on the BBS after the deadline so you can download them to your TV screen, disk, cassette, or printer (your choice).

I've got about 45k available just for the storage of messages (up to 80 messages). Here you may place press for your games, messages or ads to other players. Do not put anything secret here, for anyone can read them.

If you want to send moves, or private correspondence you want me to forward to another player, use the "U" option, and name the file with your "signature" (up to 8 letters). Be sure to send me your secret signature in advance. The ATARI doesn't know your "voice" and I'll have no way of being certain someone else isn't trying to make your move for you unless you arrange a unique signature.

If the traffic justifies it, I'll put the BBS up for longer periods of time in the future. Meantime: If it rings more than once, hang up. The BBS is set to answer on the 1st ring. I won't answer the phone after 10:00 pm usually, and if I do, I'll wait for at least 4 rings. If you call me at another time and hear an electronic tone, that's the "carrier detect tone" and means the ATARI is using my phone.

I believe there are a dozen or more LIB subscribers who have access to personal computers or terminals. I'm interested to know exactly what people are using. If you tell me the model of console you have, and list your peripherals (cassette, disk, printer, etc.) I'll publish the cumulative information. I think most of you are using ATARI computers, but I may also be able to get some public-domain software for some other computers, too.

The NATIONAL BOURSE game is 100% ATARI-moderated (no GM errors!). It has many routines which I've designed and which I believe will later form a foundation for a program to moderate DIPLOMACY by computer. I'm having a little difficulty with the problem of 7 players interacting all at once. The NB game may have almost unlimited numbers of players buying & selling currency in one turn, but it uses only 2 players so far in the combat routine.

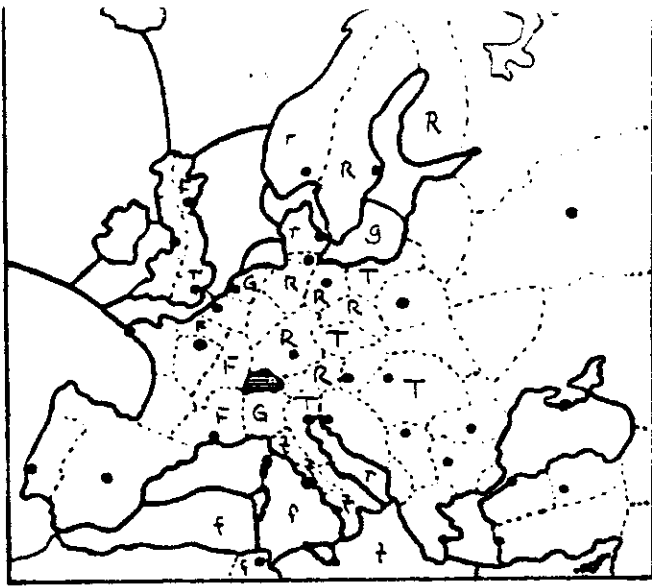

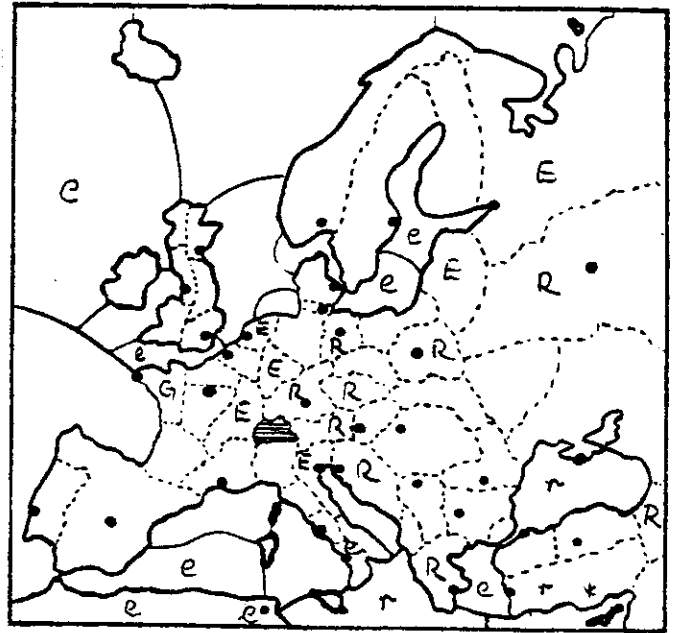

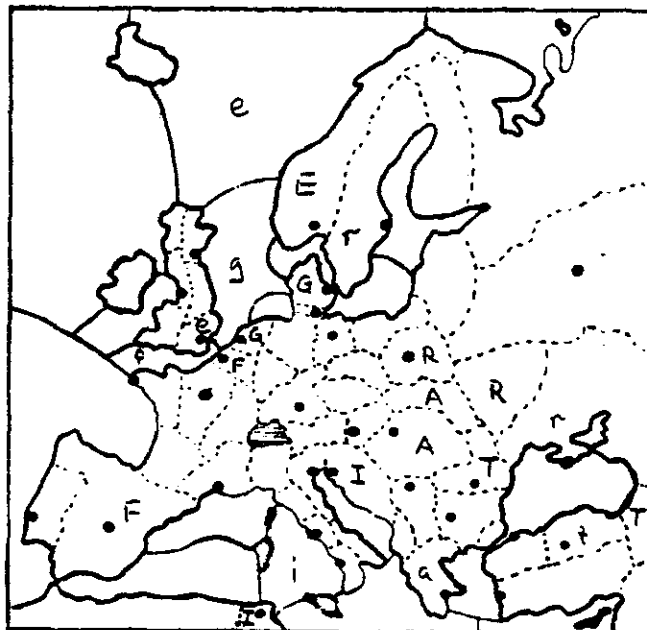

Nick Chrones has resigned the UK position. He says it wasn't much fun, so he joined the National Bourse game.

We now have no Italy, no Turkey (if Fred jumps to Germany), and it seems no Spain. Russell Fox has not been heard from since his air force was defeated in Zaal. This leaves Frediani, Wester and Phrogus against Bonkowski and Seman. And Seman wants me to apologize for an error he says cost him the Philippines, or he may resign. Even though I did get confused about the Turn on which I DE'd his M8s in discussing it with him after the fact, I still believe those ACs were DE by Japanese IF on a turn he missed. The report in the LIB shows IF in the AC vicinity T.3 -- but Seman didn't miss T.3. He missed T.4, but the IF wasn't there then. It looks like you blew it Bumpas. But I was so sure. No I'm not so sure. If it was my error (and it appears it was), I apologize. But I remind players they are to accept GM error in this game as Panic, or other failure outside the player's control. MacArthur did leave all his aircraft on the ground, lined up as nice targets for the Japanese 8 hours after Pearl Harbor.

It also seems Frediani did NOT omit to send his shoot sheet last turn. He says it was on the back of a sheet of press I published (and threw away after typing in the press!). Guilt!
