PACIFICON 1983

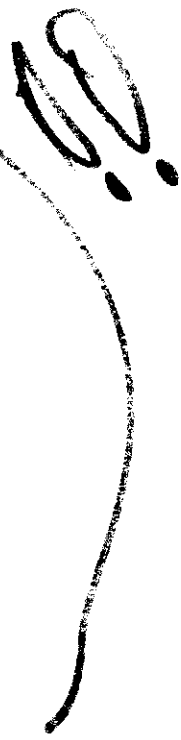
60 players completed 15 boards over the Labor Day weekend at Pacificon. Games lasted from 6 to 15 years, with an average of 9.2 years per game. 9 of the boards ended in 18 center wins: England had 1; Austria 2; France and Turkey had 3 wins each. That's an incredible 60% wins and only 40% draws. Dave Grabar won the Top Board game playing Austria. No other Diplomacy tournament has so high a percentage of 18 center wins.

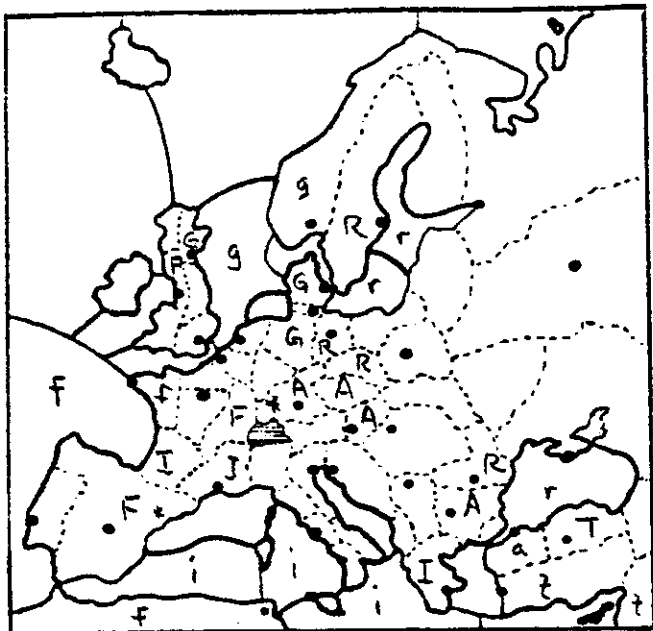
The top 6 players shared \$180.00 in cash prizes: 1. Vaughn Heppner with 27.03 points; 2. Dave Lowerman - 22.85; 3. Kevin Kozlowski - 22.81; 4. Dave Grabar - 22.45; 5. Mike Maden - 20.86; 6. Brian Larson - 19.97.

Scoring the countries as if they were players, results in the following scores: 1. France - 13.42; 2. Turkey - 12.16; 3. England - 9.75; 4. Russia - 5.89; 5. Austria - 3.13; 6. Italy - 2.67; 7. Germany - 1.45.

15 players played 4 Libourse games with Kevin Kozlowski (1st) and Dave Grabar (2d) sharing \$22.50 in prizes. Kevin accumulated \$3,015,987.00 in currency in one game; Dave had \$2,731,486.52.

I learned about 4 year's worth of information about the Libourse: If you try to buy 50,000 units of one currency all you'll get is 500! The largest amount one can buy is somewhere in the range of 12,500 to 13,000. And to get this much, you need to try to buy (and PAY for) from 25,000 to 30,000 units. Sales are similarly distorted at these high levels. Revolutions seem also to happen if a turn has an unusually large number of disasters.
