sail yesterday.

The former battle cruiser Goeben, purchased from Germany and rechristened Yavuz, led an impressive line of sixteen Turkish warships, including two heavy cruisers, which stretched for two miles over the cale bay waters. The crowd roared its approval when the Yayuz let loose a deafening broadside from its main battery of twelve-inch guns in the traditional Turkish Naval salute which is given before its fleets go into battle.

The fleet is reported to be headed for the Aegean Sea, where

Turkish naval forces are expected to contest the outer Greek There was no offiislands with the Austrian naval contingent. cial confirmation of this from Turkish naval authorities, but the likelihood of such an engagement seems high in the light of the recent deterioration of relations between Turkey and the Dual-

Monarchy.

It was long expected that Austria would cede the strategically important Greek position to the Turks, in exchange for furkey's support of its assault on the Italian provinces around Venice. But then, in October, Austria not only reneged on this promise to Turkey, but turned around and destroyed Turkey's lone army of occupation in Bulgaria in a surprise attack.

Relations between the two powers are said to have broken down completely since this Austrian move, and, though a state of war has not been oficially declared by either country, fu hostilities between Austria and Turkey seem all but certain.

Experts agree that it is now problematical whether or not Austria is strong enough to continue its war with Italy without Turkey's support. Indeed, should relations between Turkey and Italy normalize as a result of Austria's attack on Turkey—a possibility that some onlookers are fully expecting--a full-bown war for possession of the Balkans could be the result.

Should this occur, the complications for the eastern powers

would be hard to calculate.

The burgeoning alliance between England and Germany has all but sealed the fate of the outnumbered French forces. With Paris fallen, and Marseilles threatened, France is expected to sue for peace and get the best terms it can. This would leave England's fleet free to threaten the Mediterranean while Germany moved on Austria through the Tyrolian and Bohemian Alps. It is expected that France would be coerced into attacking Italy as a diversion.

Russia, which at one time might have proved capable of striking a strategic balance, is now widely thought to have been a paper tiger all along, and is in no position to seriously affect the course of events in the east. Turkey has, reportedly, extended an offer to help Russia retake Moscow from the Germans, but according to sources the Tsar has refused to accept. Turkey's

assistance.

This has fueled rumors that Russia might be working with Austria in an effort to wrest control of Sevastopol from the While this move would leave the rest of Russia open to further German aggression, Turkish authorities have taken the threat seriously, and have placed the fortress garrison on full alert, while a fleet is being prepared to render assistance from the Black Sea.

Turkish authorities have said repeatedly that unless Austria immediately relinquishes control of both Greece and Bulgaria, war between the two former allies would be inevitable.

"Austria's sense of survival seems to have once again been eaten away by its traditional greed for the Balkans, a Turkish ministry spokesman said. "It's unthinkable that Austria would consider fighting both Italy and us simultaneously, but apparent ly those are its plans.

*Our great fear at the moment is that the Kaiser will antee Austria its northern flank in exchange for a free hand in Russia. This would, i'm afraid, put our country in a position

When asked, should Austria and Germany agree on a nonaggression pact, if this would influence Turkish negotiations with Italy, the minister stated:

"I think it must be obvious to everyone that Turkey will do

whatever it must to ensure the safety of its lands and its peo-We have been in contact with the Italians for some weeks pìe. now, but I'm unable to disclose the nature of our talks at this time. I can say that both our governments are alarmed by Austria's recent actions, and all possible steps are being taken."

The Italian government has refused substantive comment on intentions, especially regarding its negotiations with Turkey, though it is widely believed its government is still explorthe possibility of arranging a general cease-fire with both ria and Turkey. The general feeling is that its attitude Austria and Turkey. towards Turkey has thawed some in the past month, while its relations with Austria remain critical.

In spite of its declared peace posture. Italy's armies fleets are readying themselves for the defence of Venice agair the impending Austrian attack, and the prospects for an ear. cessation of hostilities do not appear strong.
