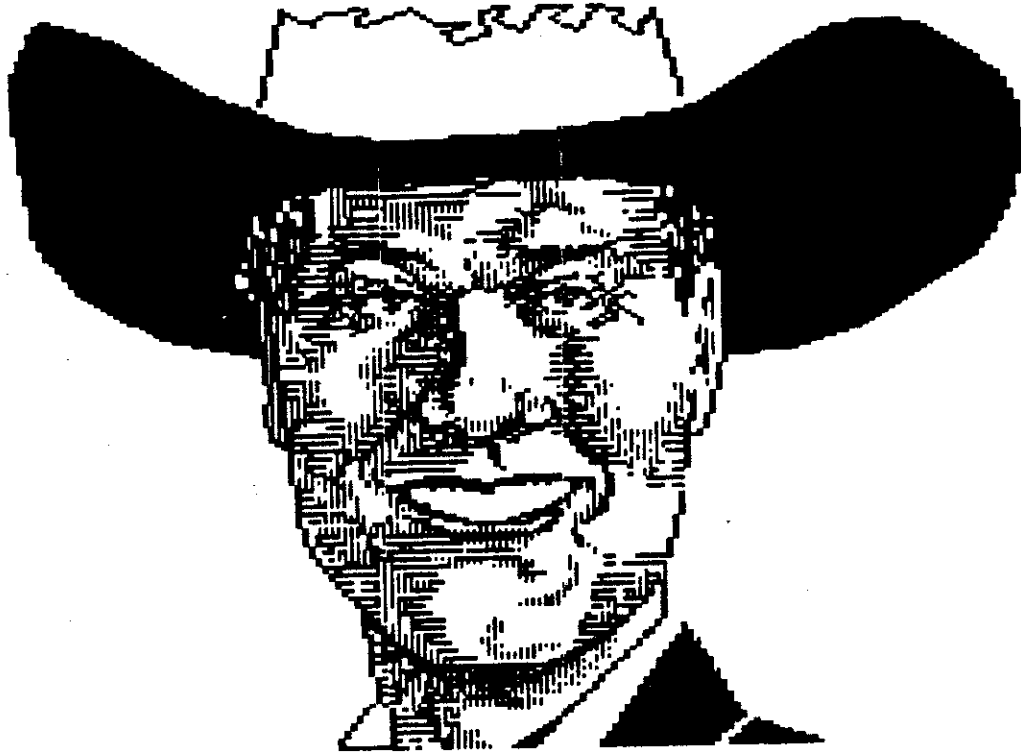

EDITORIAL

The Olympics won't be as much of a spectacle with the Russians, E. Germans, Cubans and other good athletes missing. But the U.S. can't really complain about putting politics into the games. The U.S. has long considered the Olympic games a political event as well as a sports event. The 1980 boycott to protest the Afghan invasion is only one of the more obvious violations of the Olympic spirit.

On another matter, I think it's ironic how the gov't complains about attacks on shipping in the Arabian Gulf. But it's ok to attack shipping in the Pacific Ocean off Nicaragua. Of course Iraq and Iran are at war, so there is some legitimacy (in International law) for attacking the commerce of those two countries. Iran seems to have stepped beyond the bounds by attacking ANY commerce in the Gulf.

Notice how you have seen that water called the "Arabian Gulf" more lately. When Iran was favored by the U.S., we usually heard it called the "Persian Gulf". A little more Orwellian Newspeak? Well, not exactly. The alternate term was not just recently invented. It's always had the two names.
