EDITORIAL:

Now the truth can be told. The US attempts to bring down the govt of Nicaragua is all a mistake. A misunderstanding. failure of communication by the "Great Communicator" (Reagan).

Ever since coming to office Reagan has said be wants to bring "Death Valley Days" to the Micaraguans. Vell. the Pentagon and CIA had always thought he meant to use force on them. Finally, the editor of TV Guide has informed the Pentagon that remnants of Reagan's old IV series, if shown to the Nicaraguans, will cause them to hate communism as much as Reagan has since doing that show.

You now have until the deadline for LIB #222 to conduct your initial diplomacy.

ARMORED BARBARISM 1985:

It is August, 1939 once again and WWZ is about to erupt. More than 30 LIBbers have developed and played Armored Barbarism since 1975. This is the first AB game to be opened in more than a year. I want 3 more players: Germany and France. Looks like the game will begin soon. We've already got a good mix of experienced AB players and those new to the same. The 2 remaining positions are strange. The biggest eater and the biggest meal swallowed by Germany! If you are a big sater, or you think you can avoid being meat on the table, there are 9 players ready!

Players suggest the following rule changes which I think are a good idea (add this errata to your 3 pages of rules):

Each player's initial PP must be entirely spent on units in August, 1939. You may ignore maintenance. Spending on your economy may not begin until September, 1939 from your monthly income

Eliminate all Declaration of War rules (1.5) and all alliance rules (2.45 to 2.18) and change rule 2.52 to read "2.52 The US and Japan may make amphibious

Rule 3.22 Players may only buy units from another player's

Appendix A with permission.

Rule 3.31 Deployment only to controlled zones, or by

permission of a tone's owner.
Add rule 4.16: "Units strategically deployed to attack, or engaged in a continuing scenario to capture a cone require the expenditure of an additional 10% maintenance cost, for a total of 14% mice per month.

Rule 4.21 Attacks into mountains suffer only an additional

25% penalty, not 50%.

Delete Rule 5.2 On your maps make the North Pacific into two zones. West and East Pacific. The West Pacific (bordering Japan) borders both the Bering Sea and Polynesia. The North Atlantic also need to be two zones now that the US and UK are not required to be allied. Make both West and East Atlantic border the South Atlantic, with the border running off the top of the map.

Add the Skaggerak sea zone touching Norway, Sweden and

Denmark.

Changes to the Sea Zone rules (5.6):

5.6 SEA ZONES: Sea zones may be controlled by deploying Fleet Points equal to at least twice those deployed to the same zone by any other hostile player or alliance.

5 61 Fleet Points are units and may be purchased according to the following schedule: The US. UK. Japan and Italy get one FP for each PP spent; Germany and France get one FP for every 2 PP spent; everyone else gets one FP for every 4 PP spent.

5.62 (remains the same).

5.63 FP cannot control sea zones marked "c", but FP

may pass through these zones if not hostile.

5.64 FP may enter the Canal Zone, Egypt (Suez Canal). Istanbul and Kiel (Kiel Canal) with permission of the zone owner. Any canal is destroyed once the zone has been conquered. 5.65 FP may not pass through the Skaggerak if any

hostile player controls Benmark, Norway, or Sweden. 5.66 Polynesia may not be controlled unless Pearl Harbor is controlled.

5.67 Strategic Movement of ground units by sea require FP. 50 FP will carry one infantry; 1 FP will carry 5 PP

worth of any other unit.

5.68 FP are destroyed any time the ratio of hostile FP in a zone is 10:1 or greater. All the smaller force is destroyed, together with an equal number of the larger force. FP transporting land units are not calculated as part of the ratio, but will be retreated to an adjacent friendly or permissive zone, if available. If not, these FP, too, are destroyed, with equal FP losses to the victor.

Each issue of the LIB will be one or more monthly turns in which players have full diplomatic and economic control over their countries. Military control includes all strategic decisions, maintaining rosters of infantry divisions and armored regiments, purchasing units from a two-page appendix of vehicle types. Infantry and armored carriers are standardized. Operational decisions about zone attacks and defenses, whether to send reinforcements to an embattled zone, or to withdraw, how much to commit to an attack or defense are all fully within the players' control.

Veather is a factor in this game, and is important enough to probably reduce operations during winter months (except in Marica and the Middle East), so some turns might include months than one month. Minors may be politically controlled, and strategic movement of units require fuel expenditure (if you don't save enough PP in your fuel account, your units won't move). However, players receive monthly income. You no longer

have to wait to do annual budgets.

Tactical combat will be played with the force mixes chosen the players using the SSI computer game "Combat Leader". and my friends here in Eugene will play each month's tactical scenario twice and combine the results for the combat reports to appear, along with player press and reports of force levels engaged, in each issue of the LIB. 




