## JOUST

Hollywood, CA 91605, will represent XENO in the Joust. Paul Gardner's NNY will be represented by David Lincoln, 25 Sun Valley Dr., Cumberland, RI 02864. Now we need only one more zine to put up a champion and the Joust will begin!

## LIBOURSE PRESS:

Ken Gestiehr, Box 302, El Cajon, CA 92022, is the new Libourse player. His country is really named Klownvll. I just forgot to change it before I ran the program.

KLOWNVLL: I think I got it all. I'm still not sure about military attacks; or if they're even worthwhile. They're sure to get me enemies. Well, I've established that Druze is in the bad. My sales should hurt the others financially. So Klownvll attacks Druze.

## PBEM DIPLOMACY:

If you and your computer want to see a PBEM Diplomacy game in progress, call (503) 683-4350 and ask the SysOp to let you into the Dippy conference. Or you can tell me ahead of time, and I'll get you in before you call. Dan Gorham is in and waiting for the next opening. The current game is up to Fall, 1984.

## LIBOURSE:

Players in the Libourse trade in the currencies of the Top Board Game, 1984 IR. Currency prices are affected both by trading activity and by the control of supply centers in the Diplomacy game. You may join the game at any time by submitting the 43 game fee together with your request for assignment and a name for your country (only Top Board players may use the name of their position in the Diplomacy game).

Your country will have characteristics in the following categories: population, treasury, agriculture, military, industry, mineral resources, communications, transportation and utilities. You will receive approximately 67,000 in currency of the surviving Diplomacy positions in the Top Board game. You must improve your country in all categories to do well. And you may attack one other Libourse country each turn. Random events may help or hinder your progress.

## ARMORED BARBARISM 1985:

To speed up turn-around time on these deadlines, I plan to execute tactical scenarios as soon as I receive them, instead of waiting for the deadline. I will execute those for which I have the moves of both sides first, but some might be executed before the opponent has had a chance to put in a move.

Maybe you will be attacked and see units engaged before you

could move them out of the way. Maybe you'll be attacked in a location before your reinforcements arrived.

I will not execute a move from a player living in Eugene before I execute his opponent's move until the last 5 days before the deadline.

The market is lowering the price of Infantry. Buyers were scarce at 500 PP, so the new price is 300 PP. Anyone who spent 500 may receive a refund.

Just for your interest, here is how the players rank in terms of income/Growth Rate: UK - 1/3; USSR - 2/1; Germany - 3/6; Japan - 4/10; France - 5/2; USA - 6/7; Spain - 7/5; Italy - 8/9; Poland - 9/8; Turkey - 10/4.

ITALY LIFTS BLOCKADE OF SPAIN!  
Documents signed in Paris, Madrid and Moscow formalize the transfer of French territories to Russia and Spain. Russia receives all African possessions, Syria and Polynesia. Spain receives Normandy and Loire. Russia and Spain will not enjoy the full fruits of this transfer immediately, as Normandy, Tunis and Syria have been conquered in combat.

1 Infantry, 3 Teke tanks, and 1 carrier defeated 9 AIGs defending Indonesia. 1 Infantry, 4 Teke tanks, and 2 carriers defeated 10 AIGs defending Burma. Japan achieved a 63% victory in Indochina, and an 82% in Burma.

Turkish fleets sunk the Russian Black Sea Fleet and took control of the zone.

Italian fleets sunk the Turkish Eastern Mediterranean fleet.

The UK closes the North Sea and Channel to any shipping to France.

## PRESS:

BURGUNDY: The royal country of France has now retreated into the Fortress Burgundy. Having been attacked by Germany and stabbed by Italy, France has no choice but to hang on until the bitter end. Assistance from Russia (I hope) and England has eased matters considerably, and will be remembered. 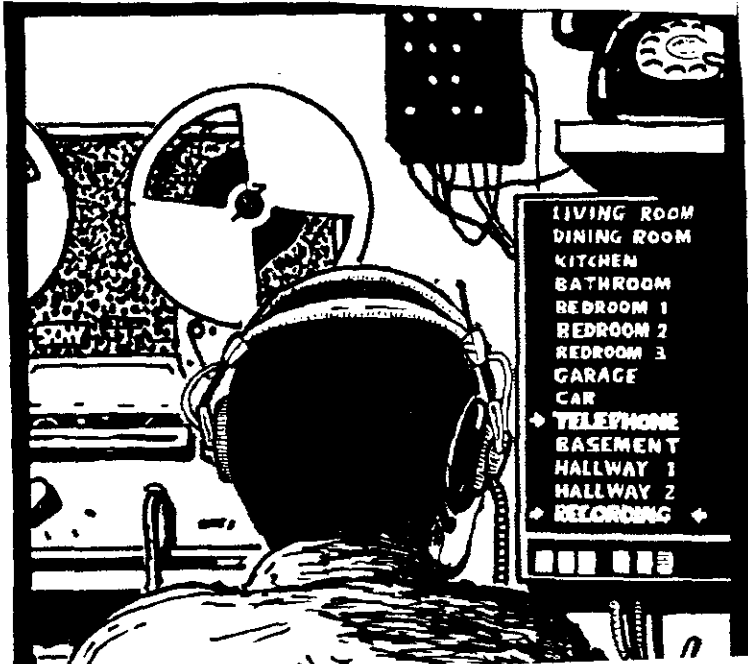


attack on Marseilles might leave their army in shambles. Peace is desired with Italy.

Not so with Germany. Already, plans are being made for possible ventures into Kiel or Bavaria. The Burgundians will fight Germany tooth and nail, scratching and clawing for every available advantage. Hitler must be captured!

POLAND)USSR: I understand the game (more-or-less). Thanks for your concern.

POLAND)WORLD: Poland declares a state of total isolationism. We have no intention of going to war against anyone and are hoping against hope that any potential aggressor will just leave us alone! Oh, by the way, Poland will join any alliance needing our provinces to satisfy victory conditions. We know we can't beat 'em, so we are more than satisfied to join 'em.

## MOSCOW (Pravda):

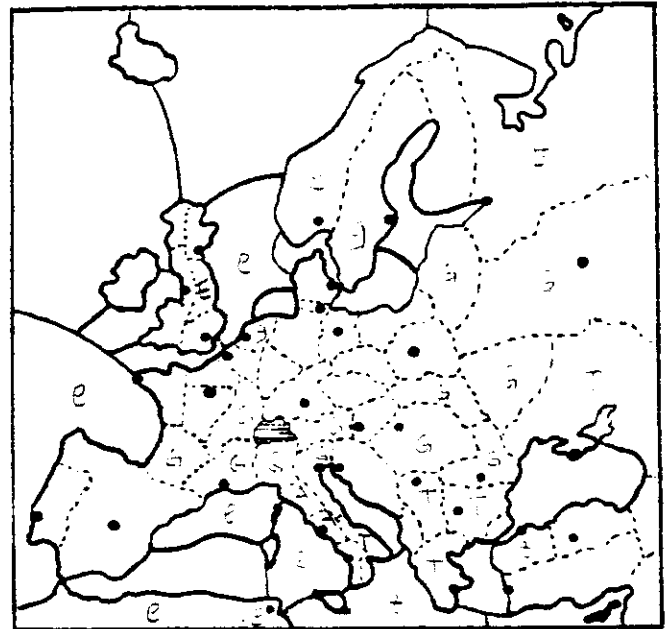
The Peoples Soviets of Mongolia, Finland, Estonia and Latvia were accepted into the USSR.  
MOSCOW (Pravda): The USSR formally protests the German treatment of Poland. Premier Phrogusinski states: "For Germany to force Poland to cede its capital, with a loss of 15-20 PP, and then to cut it off from its natural boundaries in Lithuania and Rumania is unacceptable. The Polish people deserve better treatment."

STOCKHOLM (Pravda): The Prime Minister ordered the old Prime Minister to return at once to face war crimes. Western reporters are also warned that if they continue to report false reports about the SSSR they will be barred from the country.

MOSCOW (Pravda): The Soviet Minister of Press warned western reporters that their continued erroneous reporting of events within the Soviet nations could result in their being barred from entering the USSR. Such statements as "surprise attack" when referring to politically advanced nations who of their own free will join the Soviet nation will not be tolerated.

PORT AU PRINCE, HAITI: The Haitian armed forces mobilized their 4 bicycles and 2 billy clubs in the wake of threats from Sweden to kidnap the Swedish govt in exile which has been given protection here. The former Prime Minister told the press: "Yadda, yadda, come and get me!"
