LIBOURSE:

Players in the Libourse trade in the currencies of the Top Board Game, 1984 IR. Currency prices are affected both by trading activity and by the control of supply centers in the

Diplomacy game. You may join the game at any time by submitting the \$3 game fee together with your request for assignment and a name for your country (only Top Board players may use the name of their position in the Diplomacy game).

Your country will have characteristics in the following categories: population, treasury, agriculture, military, industry, mineral resources, communications, transportation and utilities. You will receive approximately \$7,000 in currency of the surviving Diplomacy positions in the Top Board game. You must improve your country in all categories to do well. And you may attack one other Libourse country each turn. Random events may help or hinder your progress.

ARMORED BARBARISM 1985:

Carl Olson suggests a defender should have to pay combat maintenance, just as attackers do. I agree, and I want to charge defenders a 5% premium, or 1/2 of the attacker's premium -- whichever is less. If no one objects, I'll begin implementing this change next turn. If anyone objects, I'll wait for next game.

Another change I want to make is to permit a player to attack more than one zone per month with the same force, provided all but the last attack is an AV, and the attacker pays all required move and attack premiums. This rule might have permitted Germany to AV Belgium on his way into France. This change will also be implemented unless I hear an objection, in which case it will also wait until the next game.

GERMANY FAILS TO ORGANIZE A 60-ZONE WIN!

ITALY SIGNS TREATIES WITH BULGARIA, GREECE, SOUTH AMERICA AND CENTRAL AMERICA!

The Imperial Japanese Navy attacked the Royal Navy in the Indian Ocean (230 FP sunk); and Indonesia (350 FP sunk). The UK retained control of both sea zones.

France, USSR and Japan decline to join Germany in a win, and Germany excludes the USA. The remaining 6 players have only 59 zones.

5 T26s rumble into Iran from the Urals and Caucasus regions of the USSR. 3 T26s meet 1 Iranian T26, defeating it at a cost of 40% casualties. The Iranians fought with fanatical fervor and died to the last tank. The USSR scored 15 out of a total of 25. The Iranians scored 0 out of a possible 75.

PRESS:

STOCKHOLM: The "old regime" was tried and found guilty. The evidence of fleeing the country by the old Premier to "Papa Doc's" Haitian nation of terror convinced the jury of guilt against the people of Sweden.

MOSCOW (Pravda): Sweden's naked act of aggression was condemned by the Party. Western reporters were also warned again about false statements pointing out the Soviet people did not send advisors or assist Sweden in it's attacks.

Press Ratings: Russia 1, Sweden 2, Japan 3, France 4, Poland 5, all others 11.

The Hague, Netherlands: The World Court announced today that Haiti has submitted the question of the extradition of the former Swedish Premier to Sweden to face Soviet "justice" over to the judges of this august body.

The USSR and Sweden have refused to recognize the jurisdiction of the Court and says they will not abide by the decision, anyway.

Port-Au-Prince: The Haitian Public Information Bureau

announced today that the only reason Haiti is a nation of "terror" is because of these zombies which seem to wander around at will on the island. Attempts to eliminate them with BT seem to be unsuccessful.

JAPAN (IJNS): The Emperor today said, "There will be no retreat, no surrender and no reinforcements for the S.E. Asia expedition. We shall not loot our homeland's garrison in order to reinforce this army." Some generals bemoaned this situation, but most saw it as not too bad, since the Japanese army had captured 6x A10 in Indochina.

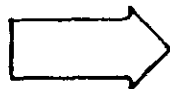
