



LIBERTERREAN

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The 2nd annual Armored Barbarism tournament was last Saturday. Jody Caldarulo, veteran AB and miniatures player was randomly teamed with Ed Williger, the most dramatically improved AB player I've ever seen. I was teamed with Eric Sander, new to AB (and to the tactical effect of air power); but with obvious tactical armor play experience.

The 1st round saw us playing the German side against US units of Jody and Ed. I had 4 good tank destroyers (JgdTigers) and 3 lighter TD's and a PzIVFl. I also had 12 88's (only 5 of the 88/71), and some smaller atg's, together with 5 Nebelwerfer. Eric had a large panzer force.

Fortunately for me, Ed lined up 6 of his heaviest tanks on a ridge about 1200m from my 88's. I knocked out 4 of them before the survivors ducked for cover, not to see action again. My game plan was to lay back and defend my CP. By the end of the round, I'd lost all my atg's and half my 88's to IF and CAS. I lost no tanks.

Eric launched the most exciting tank assault of the day. 3 or 4 platoons advanced on Jody's position for over 1000m until they came to the slope of a hill. US M8's and some infantry were dispatched by the Germans rather quickly, together with a couple of Stuarts. No German losses. Then the US Air Force arrived and DE'd 10-12 panzers before Eric could extricate his force. Next, Eric tried a rush at the center of Jody's line with 6-7 tanks. These were handled easily by 90mm atg's and M10's in defensive array. Eric had one other thrust going, thru the woods on Jody's right flank. Jody's infantry tried to slow the advance where the only close assault of the game was launched unsuccessfully against a PzVG. In spite of Eric's successes on this flank, Eric's chances to win were dashed on the other flanks, in spite of the fact that 2/3 of his aerial tormentors had been downed.

The 2nd round had me with a British force teamed with Eric's US force. I had 7 platoons of armor with green crews and 27 tubes of 25 pdr guns. I could deliver about 23 tons of HE per turn (about 195 impact hex factors). Jody had CAS again, and OMA, together with 5 88's. Totalling the HE on all attacked hexes, Jody had as much IF attack strength as me. But mine was more flexible, in smaller units. I could break mine up into more attacks. The early turns saw Jody and me trying to cream each other with HE. I lost 3 or 4 units early without getting anything in return. But then my fire began registering in. Both of us realized death was coming by IF unless something was done to neutralize its effects: I'd placed all my tubes in a shadow behind two hills, so he couldn't spot fire to me unless he took an advanced position. IF is easy to counter: put out the "eyes" by smoking or DE'ing spotters; smoke your own positions; or keep in the dead areas behind terrain, like my 25 pdrs.

After I DE'd several BTGs on my left flank, I sent out a platoon of Fireflies in a cloud of smoke to rush the German CP. Once my smoke cover scattered wrong, and he got off his only D8 88 shot. And he sent 6 or 8 TDs into my smoke to gas me. We traded shots at under 300m, so my fireflies gave as good as they took. But he got them all. Late in the game, there were 7 turns left and I had over 20 afvs which could reach his CP with a turn or two to spare. He had only one TD left and an HQ afv. Even if he got off a shot apiece on every turn, I'd still have 6 units to walk onto his CP.

Eric, meantime, was being roughly handled by Ed. An assault by 5 JgdTigers supported by IF fixed Eric's attention. Eric knocked out 2 of the beasts, but he lost his whole blocking force. Ed had another thrust at the center, down the

mean. Eric's quality equipment was being held on the hill in front of Ed's JgdTigers. Here he had only Grants and Stuarts to face the much heavier German. Eric was eaten up. By the end of the game, Eric had only 2 infantry squads and two Shermans, with the Germans swarming within 500 meters of his CP.

In my opinion, these 2 games were the best AB games I've yet played. As moderator I don't get to play often. This was the 2nd time I'd played since I was nearly pushed off the board by Jim Frediani last year. The spotting rules simulated well the effect of being able to fire from hidden positions without being spotted in return, even though we played without dummies. If it were true force. All the casualties I inflicted in the 2nd round, except for my 3 Fireflys, were by IF. All of Jody's AFs but one were knocked out without ever getting off a DF shot. I was almost "carpet bombing his whole sector". My success probably simulated a breakthrough of the German lines by first applying heavy artillery preparation.

The final standings: 1st round: I scored 320; Jody scored 249; Eric, 147; Ed, 63 (!). 2nd round: Ed scored 355 (!) [see what I mean about "most improved"?]; I scored 273; Jody, 177; Eric, 114.

GAME OPENINGS:

In approximately 3 months JJ Seman & Art Lubell shall referee a strategic Napoleonic campaign. WW2 Armored Barbarism:

Due to questions raised by players about the anomalies created by reducing WW2 afvs armor defense to one factor, I've redesigned the Appendix A for the 4 major countries: Germany, USSR, UK, USA. I've also taken advantage of the opportunity to verify firepower values with a pretty complete list of muzzle velocities and projectile weights which I recently used. The result is some dramatic alterations of attack strengths, especially among German and Soviet weapons. In addition, I've reduced all fire-control systems to "N". The Germans, only, may fit "SC" to any weapon, upon the paying of a 4 PP premium. This is pretty stiff, but it will keep him from unrealistically fitting it to everything he has without a serious penalty in the number of units he can field in 1940. Also, when you see a panzer position reported in the spotted units, you won't know if he can hit you at 2000m, or only at 500m. What a choice.

Larry Fong, the UK player has decided to take command of the Swedish units for the remainder of 1939. Walter Blank commands Norway and Denmark; Russell Fox commands the Low Countries. For the 1940 scenario, I will accept requests to play Poland, USA, and even Japan.

There's been some confusion about panic for 1940 under the AB-8 rules. For this WW2 game, 1940 and beyond, I will still apply historical panic levels to all countries. You do not all start at "5".

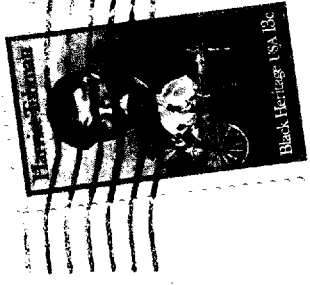
