AB-8: IRAN vs. IRAQ, 1981

This is turn 3 and there still has been no clash between units of the main forces of either side in this Iranian invasion of Iraq. No units of either side have spotted each other as they both maneuver around for position. When spotting does occur-WATCH OUT! These modern weapons should be very destructive.

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.1940 Armored Barbarism:

JAPAN ENTERS THE WAR! Jim Frediani, having resolved the problems which caused him to turn over command of Italy to Steve Goodman, will re-enter the game as Japan. His address: Box 751, Calistoga, CA 94515.

The addition of Japan to the AB/3rd Reich hybrid game, necessitates several changes. The cover of this issue of the LIB portrays a schematic of the Pacific Theater of Operations (PTO). In shows (encircled) the number of PPs income attributable to each PTO area. For the US & WSSR, the 100 PPs, and 40 PPs are in addition to those available for the ETO (European Theater of Operations). The PPs for areas controlled by other major powers are also added to the ETO incomes. The US, UK, and France may all transfer PPs and/or deployed units between the PTO and ETO, but there will be a 10% premium paid on all such transfers. The USSR need pay no such promium for transfers. For purposes of this rule, Iran is in ETO.

If the Netherlands is controlled by an Axis power, the Dutch East Indies becomes a possession of the UK. If France is occupied by an Axis power, Theiland becomes Japanese controlled, and Indochina becomes British.

THE US WILL INTER THE WAR no later than the 1942 scenario, or complier if Japan or any Axis player attacks any US-controlled area, Australia, New Zealand, Polynesia, Central American or South America. Until the US actively enters the war, the US player will operate the units of territories attacked by Japan (i.e., China, Dutch East Indies, etc.) Once the US is at war with Japan, it's at war with all the Axis allies. The US player may give Lend Lease to players attacked by Axis powers, or the US player may sell any units desired.

The SCHEMATIC DIAGRAM on the cover regulates attacks. Attacks into a particular zone may only be made from adjacent, contiguous zones under the control of the attacking player.

Additionally, attacks are further imited: The JAPAN HOME ISLANDS may never be attacked until the year following the stablishment of Allied control over the APAN MINOR ISLANDS. And the Japan Minor Islands may not be attacked until the year fter Japan fails to control all the following ones:

PHILIPPINES, MICRONESIA, MELANESIA, ALASKA, AUSTRALIA, NEW ZEALAND, POLYNESIA, HAWAII, CENTRAL AMERICA, SOUTH AMERICA.

No player may ever attack any zone out of China. China may never attack.

All zonal boundaries which are also marked by "W" require a premeium paid on all units in such an attack: Japan and the US pay 10%; all others pay 50%.

A premium of 50% is placed upon all Allied deployment in any. zone which is not contiguous with another Allied controlled zone and to which a path of may be drawn through Allied-controlled SEA zones to either India or the US. If Egypt is controlled by an Axis player, India may not be used for this purpose, and transfers of all Allied PPs and units between ETO & PTO (except for US), require a 50% penalty. (promium). The promiums required by this paragraph do not apply to infantry, mines, or tank ditches. All other equipment must be purchased in Europe or the US, paying the applicable premium. Japan must also pay the premium for any purchases in Furope (i.e., 50% unless the Axis controls. Suez/Egypt, then only 10%).

CHINA may never be conquered. China's income is always 100. Each time China loses a scenario, 10 PPs income increase is added to the victor's income (Japan or USSR). Captured equipment may also be added to the victor. China may spend a maximum of 50 PPs on non-infantry units, from the UK, US, & USSR. China must divide any purchases equally among those 3 countries. Chinese infantry is rated: 3, 0/2,2,5, 2.

JAPAN has a growth rate of 20% plus an additional 10% for control of each of the following areas (for a maximum growth rate of 40%): Manchuria and Netherlands East Indies. Japan loses 10% of its growth rate in any year Japan does not control the Japan Minor Islands. Also, Japan may not transfer PPs or units from possessions to the home islands unless Japan controls the Minor Islands. Japan's panic level will be "3" and the maximum OMA may be 2 x Light, 4 x medium; maximum CAS may be 2 x Light, 2 x Medium.

The above ideas have been worked out by myself and Jim Frediani. We've given quite a lot of thought to the question, but by no means will I refuse to change things before 1940 begins if nayone wants to make a good contribution of ideas.

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1939 AB Press:

Sgt. Major Wilcox was originally part of the British Military Mission to Yugoslavia. His job was to train his counterparts in the use of the 25 pdr. But he was more than that now. He had watched while his trainees fired the first shots in the defense of Grecoslavia, remembering his role as a neutral advisor. Then came the Italian artillery! He was no longer a spectator, but a participant. With the crew he took cover. With the crew he lay there in the sweltering summer heat and hotter detonations. And when playing possum convinced the Italian observers they were dead, with the crew he crawled out to man the undamaged weapon. Covered with sweat, blood, and dust, they loaded the 2-piece shell and waited. Nor in vain! Still shaken from the shelling their first shot went wide. Quick! 7° right, down 1, fire! The impact rolled the AB40 wreckage down the slope a good 20 metres. Now they were a seasoned gun crew. Now Sgt. Major Wilcox was involved.

Sirens blared the alarm through the Albanian night. Yugoslavians had crossed the border! British made Rolls Royce armored cars of the 23rd Recon Bn. had reached the outskirts of the capitol. Troops accustomed to rear area routine rolled out and inspite of their haste, constructed formidable barriers. Now the enemy had a choice: death or drowning.

Ankara: Riots broke out all over the Turkish Republic in response to the recently published Soviet letter. The rioters stormed the Russian Embassy while police looked on. President Bolin was able to save the ambassador and staff only by sending in his own guards. The Government as of yet has taken no action despite the pressure by rioters and citizens.
