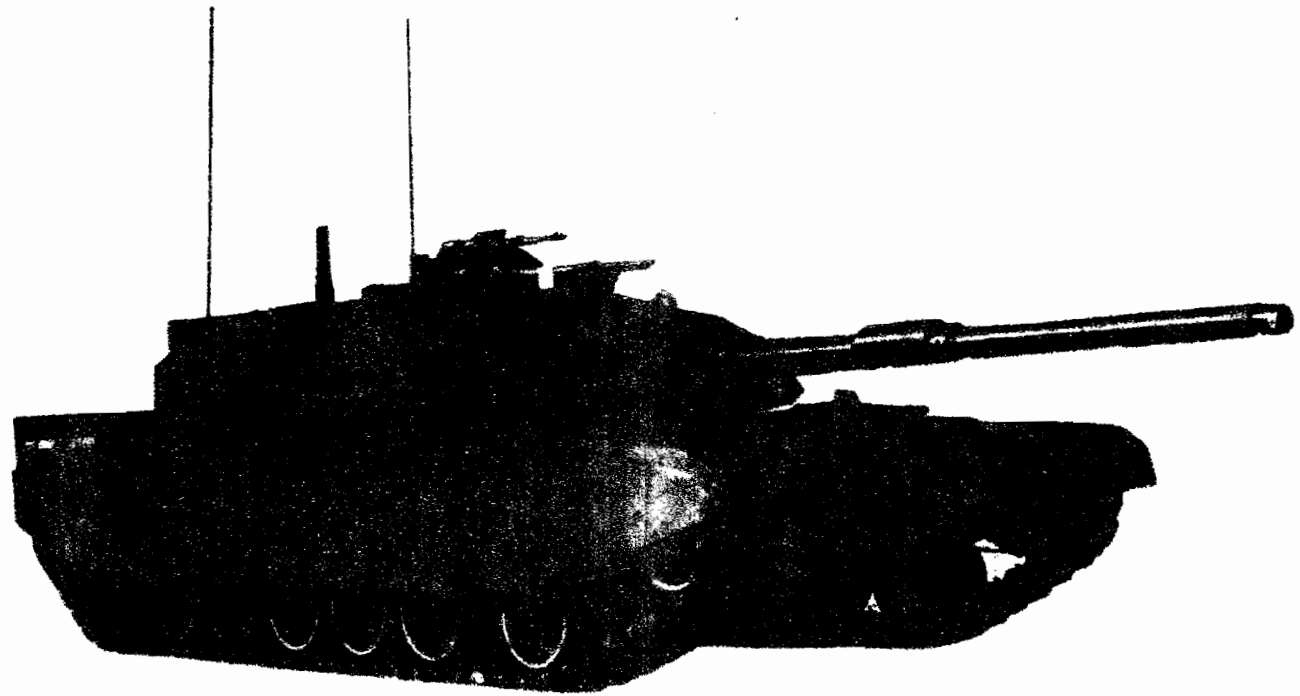

The International Defense Digest reports the US will use the German 120mm gun in the Abrams MBT. Its barrel life is rated at 650-800 kinetic rounds, compared to 213 rounds for the US 105mm gun. The US 105mm performed 3rd after the FRG 120mm and the UK 120mm (rifled).

The US Army has 2 companies of mech 162/BMP, with a 3rd company to follow.

Sweden's FH77A (155mm hwtzr) fires a "MIRA" starshell which illuminates an area of 2860m diameter for 60 seconds. An area of 1050m diameter is illuminated sufficiently for accurately aimed direct fire. In view of this, perhaps we don't need to worry about night fighting in AB.

Berlin: Chancellor Charlie sends his condolences to the British Prime Minister. It's only Sept. 1939 and already you've lost Iraq. Is this the look of things to come in 1940?

Chancellor Charlie wishes to welcome the Polish people to the world. "Do you happen to have a factory that makes Jaguars?"

In his annual Labor Day speech, Chancellor Charlie issued the following statement on the latest press from Ankara: "The German people sympathise with the Turks growing pains. We realize how hard it is for a Minor country to suddenly be thrust in with the big boys. President Bolin would probably take his ball and go home, but no-body seems to want to give him a ball."

WAR SPREADS! TURKEY DECLARES WAR ON SOVIET UNION! Turkish troops seen on Soviet lands! Anakra: (UPI,IP,SPI,AH): In a move that caught the world off balance the Turkish republic declared war on the Soviet Union. Although of late the two nations have had difficulty with each other over the question of Iran and military aid, this rift was not expected to lead to war--moreso since Turkey's avowed neutrality. After the declaration was made President Bolin met with international reporters.

R: President Bolin, what demands will you make for peace?

P: The same ones the Russians recently made on us: 1) Withdrawal of Russian units from Iran; 2) Turkish units to be allowed within Russian lands; 3) Any Turkish units destroyed in Iran be replaced at Russian cost. In addition: 4) That a neutral zone be set up between the two nations; and 5)

That this zone be patrolled by French/UK units to keep the peace."

R: Will this not increase your dependence upon Germany?

P: No, Turkey is prepared to deal likewise with the Germans. We may stand alone, but WE WILL NOT BE PUSHED AROUND!

R: What about the Allied Powers?

P: This is the one fact that could push us into the Axis camp. If they are too blind to see the need to aid Turkey to act as a buffer between them (in Asia and Near East) and the Axis, then it is their loss. However, we will still hope they will see the truth before it's too late.

Warsaw: Speculation runs wildly thru-out the capital of Poland these past weeks. The great anxiety over the coming war effort has caused mass surges of patriotism. The big question here is whether the other powers know how to use pencil & paper. As of May 15, only Axis powers have written. Will Poland have to ally with Axis powers? Only time (and letters) will tell.

"American warship accidentally bombed in Chinese port by unescorted Japanese bombers. Damage superficial, no fatalities. Japanese raid on harbor complex was more successful. Total devastation of all major dry-docking facilities. Civilian casualties high as near misses destroyed large sections of town near the wharves. British CA Exeter received 3 hits on superstructure in adjoining berth. 15 fatalities. 1 AA post destroyed. No other critical damage. Japanese warning to remove all neutral shipping from Chinese ports arrived 15 minutes after the attack. Please advise due course of action."

The Japanese High Command issued a formal apology to all neutral nations who inadvertently suffered minor damage in a raid on 8/27-39. The warning to have been delivered prior to the attack was delayed due to poor translators and ill mannered typists. Their hands have been severed and sewn into their mouths for their failure in duty. Great pains have been taken to prevent such an occurrence from reoccurring.

Japan must protest, however, the arrival of the Soviet Military Mission to China. In several instances, Soviet pilots have been reportedly seen flying! vs Japan in Chinese aircraft. We have not declared war on

Russia. And as Russia claims our taking parcels of China an act of overt aggression, we might ask, from whom did you obtain Mongolia? The tooth fairy?

FLASH! UNESCORTED SOVIET MADE SB3s in an early morning low level attack devastate a Japanese airfield in mainland China! 25 G3Ms and up to 30 A5Ms destroyed on ground! Only 3SBs received minor damage from the unprepared AA batteries. 1 SB was destroyed later when A5Ms scrambling from another air-drome intercepted it (stragglng due to damage) on its return leg. There have been no official casualty lists from the Japanese. These lightly armed medium bombers are perhaps the best medium bombers of the period. Rumors fly afield that they were Soviet crewed as well. The wreckage of the lone casualty, however, was too devastated to corroborate.

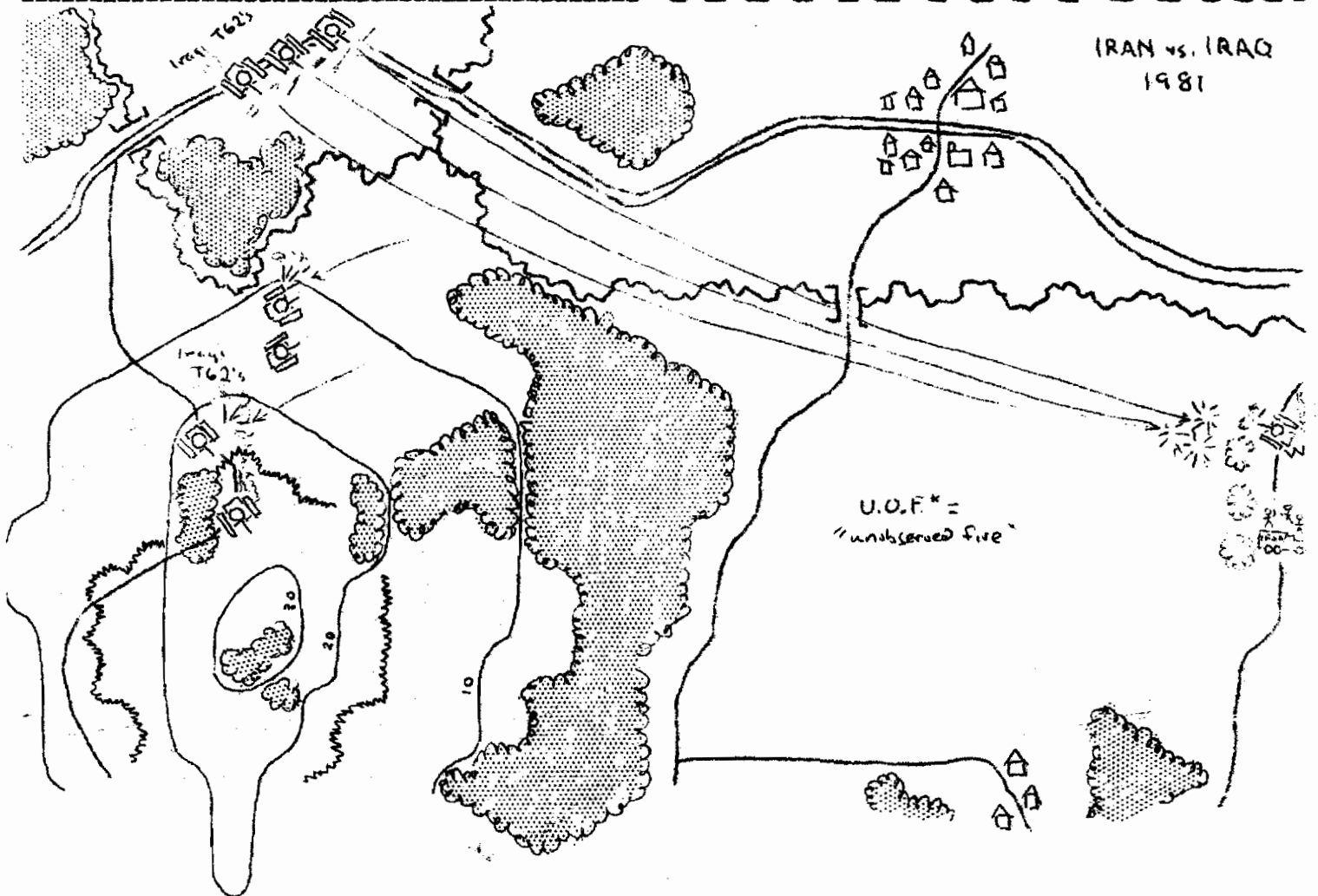
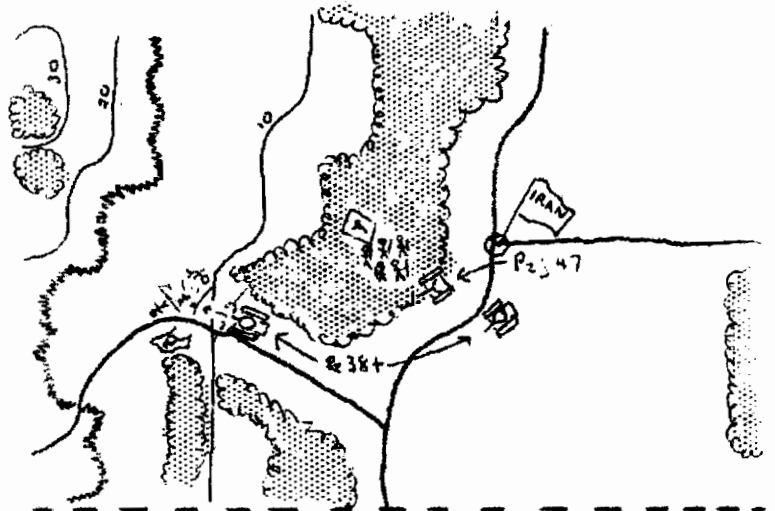

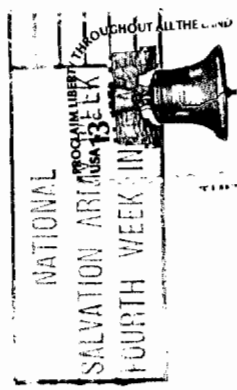
