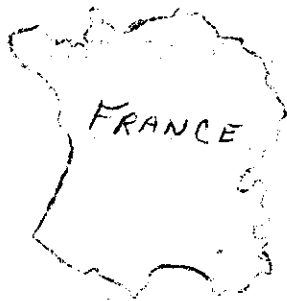
PRESS RELEASE

Vienna, Austria; 1 May 1906 (UPI):

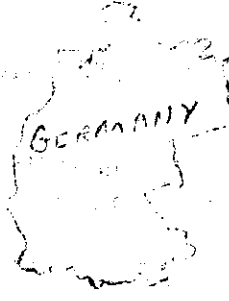
Sigmund Prude held a press conference today in which he commented on recent re-

(S) BY F WES, F ION-TYRR S note: Lucien questioned whether his F mar should have not succeeded to Lyon. It should not, since A pied CAN support a move to any provence to which it can, itself--were it moving, move to. Ergo the supports from Pied for F Lyon and the support from F Spa cancel into a 2:2 att. Russia -- Cleaver F STP SC - BOTH, F SEV - RUM!!, A UKR (S) F SEV-RUM, A GAL - war, (d) to either boh or sil or (a).

Turkey, Katzive: F Bla (s) a rum (army Rum NOT ordered to hold, for the rules allow a support of a move into a provence--SPECIFICALLY ORDERED--or support in place. Support can not be given to a piece ordered to move such that the support will take effect if the piece FAILS to accomplish its order), a arm (s) a rum, (impossible order), f bul e.c. (s) a ser, a fleet cannot support inland, also as above, we note a seris ordered to move, ergo a support coule not be legal for its standing in place) a rum - sev (d0 and (a), A GRE (H) (S) by F AEG, a ser - rum. The short of this is that Mr. Katzive did not write his orders correctly, yet every player's rights must be strictly protected. An incorrectly written order that can in no way be interpreted of more than one meaning can be followed, however these supports are not of this type. A player may send in an incorrectly written order such that it will not be followed and allowed by the GM. Thus drawing this line of distinction here is a precident I will not set--orders must be correctly written or they will not be obeyed.
