Montreal, Canada; 3 March 1905:

Today one of the largest orders for a single species of wild animal arrived for trans-shipment, from Whitehorse. This order, for 5,000 specimens of adult, male members of the species *Canis lupus* (better known as the timber, or lobo wolf) leave tomorrow by steamer for the Imperial Zoo at Buda-Pesth

Sao Paulo, Brazil; 5 March 1905:

Today a special wildlife order left this port by fast steamer. After 6 months of collection in the interior, the consignment of 25,000 specimens of *Desmodus rotundus* (familarly known as the "Vampire Bat") is on the way to the Imperial Zoo, Buda-Pesth, in Austria-Hungary.

New York, USA; 7 March 1905:

The DeFlower Biological Institute today shipped the largest order in the firm's history. Being kept under refrigeration during transport are 5,000 ampules of active rabies virus. These are being shipped to the Buda-Pesth University of Medicine, reportedly for special research on the mechanics of the transmission of this terrible disease.

Trieste, Austria-Hungary; 24 April 1905:

Today, the last Austro-Hungarian port on the Mediterranean fell to the treacherous Turk. With much loss of life by the rear guard, a last shipment, organized under direct Imperial supervision, got out of port before the city fell to the invader. Even tho a special, high speed blockade runner, this ship, the IMS Walpurgis Nacht, was almost intercepted by Turkish naval forces until an out-of-season fog bank rolled in, covering her escape.

Strangely enough, her important cargo, who's safety was bought with much loss of life, was reported to consist entirely of 300 large boxes of earth shipped from the interior.

The Emperor disappeared from the area as soon as the ship's successful escape was reported.

Bitstritz, Austria-Hungary; 27 April 1905 (HELL):

(A direct report by our agent, Johann Bummbeck)

"The Empire is bearing up well under the burden of invasion. There are few complaints and there is almost universal support for the war against the Infidels. Sd one inhshbitant said to me, 'With Count D., all you needed for security is a little garlic and holy water, and he stays off your back (or neck as the case may be), but if the Turks take over, that's the end of civilization. The smell of garlic I can stand, but the odor of Turkish goats (and soldiers) is just too much to face!'"

Bitstritz, Austria-Hungary; 29 April 1905 (HELL):

(From our agent, Johann Bummbeck)

"War reports continue to be grim, the Imperial forces being pushed back along all fronts. But a bit of hope has been born with scattered reports of a strange malady breaking out among Turkish troops. It is said that numbers of enemy troops on night patrol have been found the next day dead, the cause of death being extreme loss of blood, even tho no obvious wounds were on the bodies. Hope is also being fostered by rumors of new 'secret weapons' being prepared. These stories being aided by the arrival of secret shipments from abroad."

Ulan Bator, Inner Mongolia; 12 November 1905:

The Sultan of Turkey announced that he takes no notice of the threats of Lord of Outer Mongolia, and that demands to withdraw from Mongolia, etc., are not being considered at this time. However, if pressure is increased by these sons of jackals, Turkish policy will be to invade not only Mongolia, etc., but also Morocco,

Monaco, Mexico, and Manchuria. And if that isn't sufficient, Turkish troops will occupy Murmansk, Maritoba, Melbourne, and Cedar Rapids, Iowa. The Turkish people are 100% behind the move! Would you believe 50%? How about 2 retired generals and an obscure religious fanatic?

EDITORIAL:

5/7/70

William Schroeder, Allison Krause, Jeffery Miller, and Sandy Lee Scheuer, these were the four unfortunate victims of a tragedy in Ohio. Yet they are not, and should not be made into martyrs; whether or not they espoused the ideals of the protest in which they became embroiled, whether or not they were active or passive in its portrayal. We should follow a simple Apache custom, speak their names now, and never dishonor them again by using them. These four are not heroes of the new left, of the anti-war campaign or any other stated cause. Their killers are not pigs, they are not mindless tools of the establishment, they are humans just like the students that stood before them. To fault the National Guard totally, to allow the

militants of America to make saints of four innocent youths is to miss the point of this tragedy. No one should take sides here needlessly, no one should ascribe virtue to one faction and lunacy to the other. Yet the Weatherman will attempt to incite riots, fools will burn or destroy portions of college campuses using their deaths as an excuse, and governors will become more apprehensive--perhaps maybe more reactive--yet few will try to understand.

The youth of America is sending up one single cry--end bigotry. However the majority of Americans, young and old alike, are either too content in their hatred or too entrenched in their own campaign to see another's plight, to echo a word of understanding, to offer a hand of support. The youth of today is educated but often footloose and unsophisticated. Radical change can only create chasms over which no one can pass. Yet can anyone blame a young man for being impetuous? He can not see that by entering the world before him he can change it. Instead he desires to sweep that world away.

Then is there a key to understanding, to progress not controlled by the extremes of the arch conservatives or the "new left"? Yes, of course there is, it is education. Education of each group to the needs, wants and desires of the other. When you assail another group, when you bludgeon it with your demands, when you attack, radicalize, and destroy you accomplish one end; ALIENATION.

Look at the tactics of some of the groups trying to gain their rights today. The Blacks have formed an infrasociety and have, in many cases, drifted away from an integrated society; the protests of the anti-war groups have often resulted in wanton destruction of the very institutions that could help bring about the change they desire; the gay liberation prances down the street and creates the very impression about themselves they wish to destroy, etc. Each of these three groups, as examples, wants change, they want understanding, they want their rights. Yet the simple answer is education--only in this way can the bigotry behind each of their problems disappear. If each minority group would make an effort to educate each other group, to exchange speakers, information, time and work a first giant step would occur. For the upper echelons of most minorities, of many protest groups, and those at the very bottom of the heap know the least about their entire peer group.

How does this all relate to Kent State? Only a small fraction of the students of this University were even on the college green and only a fraction of them hurled missiles like small children that should have been spanked. This tiny fraction of mindless ruffians have given ALL college students (of R.M Nixon 5/1/70) a bad name. And they, like the persons and policies they protest against, are bigots. Radical, mindless, stupid bigots. They are BLINDLY hateful of "the establishment" a supposedly totally immoral, totally conscienceless mob. But because of them and because of that segment of society that is bigoted against blacks, "foreigners", homosexuals, Jews, youth, etc. we have reached a near impasse that has finally erupted in death. (and violence--witness the "construction workers" corps)

To mourn, to cry, to call for revenge is as insane as the narrow mindlessness that led to the Kent State nightmare.

Instead a campaign of education must begin; educators, advertising agents, business groups and youth must all get together. So much non-certified effort must cease--and one vanguard must replace the scurrying about. Unification is goal number one, and a reasonable second goal is the changing of the meaning of one word--protest. This word have become bastardized to mean futility, foolishness, vulgarity, violence, indolence, malingering etc. It's synonym has come to be dissent and not its primary meaning, to assert a belief and to affirm a goal. Let us seek a positive connotation, a positive direction, peace.

Paris Jan 2, 1902

Excerpts from King Philip XVI's annual state of the Kingdon Speech: "...unless the Austro-Hungarian Empire and the Czar stop their foolish aggression against the peaceful people of Turkey, I must instruct my diplomatic corps to break relations. If they do not heed my cry for peace, I will ask the civilized peoples of western Europe to assist me in making the world safe for monarchy!...applause."

Part VIII of the King's speech centered on the Italian aggression in southern France--)I wonder if the damage to good relations caused by this nonsensical attack can ever be repaired. I hope so. However any more attacks will be met by overwhelming repleis. Let Premier Russwop send his emissaries, and an agreement and Italian reparations will be worked out...."

Part LXXXVII of the King's speech summed up the Low Country sit-

uation--) "...And it is my fervent wish that the feeling of good will now existing between Germany, England, and France shall never be shattered by any rash act. None of the three has any reason to attack any of the others, and let it be so...."

Q. What about sealed orders?

I.e. giving allies, enemies basic priorities, etc. This set will be used if you ever miss a move. It is wise to update your general (sealed) orders often. In fact it is excellent policy to submit a new set in the form of orders for the very next season. This is your option however.
