The following is a letter I received from Scott duncan. It is addressed to me although it is an answer to an editorial written by Len. (I might as well add here that all editorials are written by Len unless my name appears on them.)

"That four students should die, shot to death by our own National Guard, is simply one of the more obviously appalling evidences of the state into which our nation and the world have fallen. It is correct to caution against making these four the chosen martyrs of the cause of peace for has anyone thought to martyr six black youths recently killed in our nation? For white youth to be shot down on our campuses, we stand aghast, yet blacks (and whites) having been dying for years in our nation under far less tense circumstances. Where were we then? What have we done in reaction to this? The world has become so accustomed to death by violence that we can accept almost anything, short of allowing white boys and girls to die on a college campus.

"The killers (they are that if nothing else) are very definitely "humans just like the students that stood before them" and just like everyone in the entire world. However, power and weaponry put just a bit larger burden on us which does not excuse anyone for being "human". Power and weaponry simply serve to illustrate the extent to which unconscious anxiety, hatred, frustration, and look of internal peace, self-knowledge have grown. A rubber bell thrown against a building makes

a 'thud'; a rock makes a chip in the brick; a bullet knocks off yet a larger chunk; a homemade bomb may blow a hole through it; a larger explosion may collapse the whole wall; a modern weapon may destroy the entire structure as a small part of its destruction of blocks of structures. Can the impulse behind the initial 'throw' not be the same in all of these cases? You may defend the 'higher' weapons by noting that few have the power to use such weapons and that they are guarded by a very extensive system of safeguards, etc., and controlled by groups of carefully elected/appointed people.

If five men agree that one man they all hate be killed and they all carry out the murder, is it justified simply because it was a group decision? Is it the kind of destruction or killing which justifies destruction and killing? In war we kill our enemies because they are trying to kill us — 'murder' is killing a person who is not your enemy according to the rule of the majority as expressed by law. You may hate your neighbor who has stolen your wife, cheated you out of much money, and lied about you but you may not kill him for he is not your enemy (you must go to court); but you may willfully kill a Vietcong soldier whom you have never seen before (and may not even see until you go over to inspect his mutilated, bullet-ridden body), for he is your enemy and the government has said so.

Is this all too simplistic? Truth is VERY direct and simple as it is simply the confused mentality of mankind which supposes that complexity represents truth. And truth is not something we can legislate through majority rule. Truth may be absolute but it is attainable only by the individual soul; a miracle or a revelation is a miracle or a revelation only to those who belive in it or experience it; so it is with truth. We can easily refuse to accept 2 + 2 = 4; we can insist that red is green—we are then considered fools as the majority has accepted these facts to be truth. But it is NOT simply that the majority has passed judgement that these facts be true. We should (must) accept them because they bring much good into our lives which we would lose were we to deny them. That is a more adequate criterian for truth: does its acceptance bring more good into the world (even if it is not necessarily good for the lone individual)?

The problem in the world which 'education' has been held up as a solution for is very simply that individuals have surrendered their duty to make judgements to groups who make them for them. Simple moral integrity has been lost. People have become 'afraid' to make moral judgements OF ANY KIND even when they affect their own personal lives! That a body of men located in a nation's capitol (or a lone individual entrusted with the leadership of that nation) make a decision does MCT validate the decision on moral grounds any more than fifteen Nazi leaders agreeing on the extermination of an ethnic group validates it. THEY were wrong—we say—because we do not accept their moral standpoint. It is a simple matter to take no standpoint whatsoever OR so we think. However, it is far more dangerous to accustom oneself to abstaining from making judgements since it does two things: weakens compability to make such decisions when we may be forced to do so AND contributes to a collective attitude of non-involvement which simply breeds moreand more moral disintegration as fewer and fewer people take the initiative to work for 'education'.

And 'education' is a noble word in our day and age, is it not? The USA is the most over-educated nation in the world for it has educated itself to the point where people no longer feel the need to be educated! We are now at a point of scientific development where specialization leaves each man hopelessly dependant on each other and yet curiously inconsiderate of how one another are doing everyday until a clash comes about. Then we wonder what has gone wrong and insist it is a lack of communication, etc. We are right and it is sad since we live in an age where everyone has more knowledge available to him than any 10 men a century ago! We are uneducated simply because we are over-educated; we are numb to the world around us simply because we have been bombarded from out very birth by the details

of that world in a mever-ending stream. We are satiated by the world and it is time to simplify our lives and to understand what we, as "humans", are all about.

We have to learn to 'know' one another as effectively as we have come to know the world around us. We have to educate ourselveson a spiritual level to the intensity which we have done on the material level -- for the two are NOT antagonistic. Truth is NOT really relative. If science can show that the world and universe were not created in six twenty-four hour days, then we are blind to accept a spiritual education which says otherwise; yet we are equally as blind to refuse to accept the possibility of things existing which our science somply does not comprehend because of this lack of comprehension. Sciende cannot solve our problems of learning to live together as one people -- it can, of course, provide us with an infinite number of ways to isolate ourselves from one another, making learning to live together useless UNTIL we are faced with the absolute necessity to deal with each other on a one-to-one level. By then it is too late as we are powerless to do so even though science has made it physically possible to do so through communications systems so vast that it would make people of a mere half-century ago speechless. But if we are incapable of communicating to even our friends out of fear for our own 'security', then what hope have we. Why have issues like sex, racial prejudice, religion, etc., divided us for so long? The fear that there is a mass standard to which we must adhere, else be considered 'strange', is one answer. If we really allow ourselves to be understood by one another, there is little we can afford to hide from one another--privacy is one of this nation's most treasured possessions.

And so we come back to Kent State where guns and rocks separated people who hadn't the slightest idea what one another were really like except that they were the 'uniforms' of the enemy'. What would any of us be like in a trench, facing a man who had as his goal your destruction? War puts us in the unavoidable position of killing unless we do one of two things: run or allow ourselves to be killed without opposition to the enemy. It is the decision of either a coward or a fool no matter which you take; that is the decision of our nation.

But it is not the decision of a group which will change the world. It is the ACTION of a group made up of individuals who have, one-by-one, made a decision to work together. The problem with the world is us and no one else. I am a CO not only because I have philosophical (and as a Baha'i, religious) opposition to war but also because I have become aware of the tremendous potential for destruction in frustrated, dissatisfied people who take the easy way out by resigning themselves to a group decision. I emphasize 'resigning' as they are not often conscious acceptors of the moral decision which they carry out. They are uncommitted people who allow themselves to follow the flow of social pattern because they haven't the strength to resist it. Are they 'evil', 'pigs', etc? Of course, this is a happy habit of the world today: to label people, making it easy to categorise and hence superficially understand and 'put away' people. Our education has brought us to the state where we are much like psychology in that it knows what abberations are 'sick' but cannot define the 'normal'. We know what is wrong when we see it demonstrated in extremes before us but fail to recognize the subtleties of it in early stages or distinguish between the 'sick' and the 'different'.

Education is what we need but it will have to come from many more sourses than the schools since they are, by their very nature, dedicated to the academic/material development of youth. They dannot, and must not, make moral judgements for people. They could be made more efficient dispensers of the menas for preparing people to make decisions for themselves—this might result in a 'regression' of factual abracadabra on standardized tests, etc. But it just might bring us all into closer, more direct and meaningful contact with one another if we recognize that our only goal in AIL areas of life is to have one another understand what we

are and represent rather than simply accept it on face value for the expediant fulfilling of our desires.
