Berlin: In an attempt to reconcile relations between their two countries, the Kaiser recently held a conference with Omar II. command of all French military forces according to reliable reports received here. The meeting between the Comptess and Mr. Prithurd was very cordial, plans were made for future meetings in Paris, Washington, Tibet and any other place where hotels were cheap.

Berlin Dec. 2, 1901 Meetings between le ambassadeur de Allermagne Herr Cote and de duc ce canard were very profitable. During the meeting the news arrived of a hostile English fleet off the coast of Belgium--immediate plans to protect our Belgium neighbors from aggression were formulated.

turned to a mob, and by 10:00 fighting broke out when the city
police attempted to disperse the rally. By midnight the situation
had degenerated into a guerilla-type street fight, with bands of
youths roaming the streets looting and clashing with ploice squads.
Sniper fire was heard. Morning ended the disruption, but a toll had
been taken, 19 persons killed and 78 hospitalized. Among the dead
were 4 city policement.

THE VATICAN-(11 May 1901)-Pope Deplores Riot
Pope Pius IX today held a press conference on the recent riots that
have swept Rome for almost a week. In his speech the Pope called for
an end to violence and bloodshed, but also emphasized that the government must also make concessions to placate the revolutionary
elements causing the riots.

Ankara-Jan 14th, 1900 (AsMP)

His Mightiness Omar Hamid II declared today from the Gold Topped Mosque of the All Holy Allah that Turkey has great forebodings about the coming war. Said His Greatness: Turkey will be called upon to send the flower of her youth against the powers of evil. They must be staedfast and resolute in their actions. The HUN is attempting to crush the freedom of certain peoples. Turkey will not stand by and allow this to happen. The Sultan continued: While the insidious aged ruler of the duplicity of a monarchy raves on and on about free dom he plans to grab these countries. The Sultan received an hour long ovation from the millions of people who jammed the new Omar Hamid II Stadium.

Just because they have no boots does not mean that they cannot march 65 miles a day. In fact the Emperor continued: Ou troops will enter Venice on the first day. Rome will fall on the second day, Naples on the Third and we will then commence building our fleets on the fourth and they will set sail for Apulia on the fifth. I shall myself lead the Victory March in Tunis on the sixth. We shall rest on the seventh as all the work will be accomplished.
