\* Note that I had printed the incorrect address for Peter Keleman in the issue of NEOPHYTE starting this game. Also I sent it to the incorrect address and therefore it arrived late. Peter did send in moves for the other game in NEOPHYTE but not this game. I feel that conditions, oversight and/or the PO have placed Keleman at a disadvantage in negotiations (since none of you had his proper address) and in getting in his move, as the chance of his missing the game announcement also exists. Lastly, the entire game would be compromised by this early miss--and in fact the smoothness of the game would be destroyed. Needless to say some players might also get an advantage from a missed spring move by ANY country in sp '01. Thus I have allowed a neutral substitute to make a series of moves for Russia that do not infringe upon any other's borders. Peter Keleman is hereby notified that he must notify me by October 27, 1971 if he intends to continue. If he does not a substitute will be assigned and the fall 1901 deadline extended.

notes on move notation: The final position of your piece is shown in capital letters. Thus A BOH-sil would mean A BOH did not move successfully to silesia, whiel a boh-SIL shows it does succeed to Silesia. a boh-sil would imply that it did not succeed to sil and was dislodged from bohemia. Support is noted by (S) or WITH for successful support (s) or with for unsuccessful support, i.e. support was "cut". Convoy is shown by (c) or C depending of failure or success. NTH=north sea, NWG= norwegian sea, NAO= north atlantic ocean, MAO= mid atlantic ocean, tyo=tyrolia, lyon= gulf of lyon, both=gulf of bothnia, NWY=Norway, Other notes may be found inthe house rules.

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
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
