Berlin (Nov

Berlin (Nov 12) On November 11 (ill-chosen day) the government of Germany received a declaration of war from the government of England. This declaration was given as a consequence of the German fleet's attempt to enter the north sea. When pur ships found this body of water already occupied by the British Navy, they returned to their base in Holland. As a result, England declared war on Germany.

Munich: news of the declaration reached Baron von Mishaufen in the didst of an official tour of Munich beer-halls. He declared, "Since perfidious albion has seen fit to instigate a conflict over trifles, let it be known that we pick up the gauntlet! We will prosecute such a conflict with full vigour! Since our neighbours the French, who so kindly assisted our fleet, recognize England as our common enemy, we will co-operate with them to subdue the British dogs... Did you hear the one about...?"

Ottawa: The Kaiser was in conference with the Canadian Prime Minister when word of the war reached him. His official response was, "you don't say!" When asked if he planned to cut short his North American tour, he replies, "my ministers are fully capable of handling such minor matters. Now, pierre, about the Grand Ball... Does Margaret have a Friend?"

Berlin: "As a result of certain fithless actions on the part of the new government of Austria, Germany no longer considers herself bound by any agreements made with the previous regime."

Paris, Nov 22 1902 Today Foreign Minister Michael Stroz announced that he hoped that peaceful relations could be continued with the government of Italy. However, he also warned Italy and all other nations in the Mediterrean that the Gulf of Lyon is French territorial waters and any movement there would cause war.

Nov 22, 1902 Official communique to Vietta, Austria:

From Paris, France.
Mr. Bell: BULLSHIT!
