- 4. Want to know how you rate? If you have finished a game of Diplomacy, you'll find your name in the Pfennig/Halbpfennig ODD rating list, published by John Mc Callum, PO Bx 52, Ralston, Alberta, Canada. Another excellent zine, worth your investment!

5. Edi Birsan has asked for players to RATE what position they feel is best, 2nd best, etc in a Diplomacy game. I, unfortunately, do not have room this issue to reproduce the form, but if you answer the questions, which appear below, send themto me with your orders, or directly to Edi Birsan 48-20, 39th St., Long Island City, N.Y. 11104.

- I. Rank the most desirable results in a Diplomacy game from 1-13. 1(most desirable), 13 least desirable. The 13 results are; Win, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 2 way draw, 3 way draw, 4 way draw, 5 way draw, 6 way draw, & 7 way draw.
- II. For each of the 6 statements below write "strongly agree", "Somewhat Agree", "Disagree Somewhat", or "Strongly Disagree"
  - 1. If I can not win a game then the best ting to do is to try to stop the front runner by stalemating the game.
  - 2. I will not turn on an ally even if it looks as if he is going to win and I am going to finish second.
  - 3. I will not stab an ally evne if it looks as if he is going to win and I am going to finish third.
  - 4. Once a player has attacked me in a game I will not ally with him in that game, even if it means letting another player win.
  - 5. Most players will try to finish as strongly as possible in a a game, even giving up the chance for a stalemated game if it means they can finish second.
  - 6. The distance between finishing second and finishing third is the same as finishing fourth and finishing fifth.

To correlate the date please supply these facts:

- 1. AGE, 2. Years in Postal Diplomacy, 3. Years PLAYING Postal Diplomacy, and 4. # of games completed postally. Comments to Edi are welcomed!!
- 6. SO THE ROHAN SYSTEM ISN"T ALL THAT BAD AFTER ALL!. In our last issue we asked if players cound find their way around in my notation and whether my system was better than others in use. 10 people PREFERED revised Rohan to other systems. Only 3 found it worse, claiming they had to learn a new system. Further comment is expected/welcome, of course!
- 7. DEADLINES to become uniform! Currently your poor editor is just up against it! LD 34 was late because of DIPLOCAN V, this issue is late because I couldn't use the press last weekend (it's not my press, you see). The only way I can keep on an even keel is to keep the deadlines the same for all games, regardless of season. However, I am going to begin requesting conditional builds with fall seasons and conditional springs with winter builds. Note that this is NOT a requirement! If I get conditional builds and/or conditional springs from all players I will publish 2 seasons at once, but only then!
- 8. I'M GOING TO MAKE A PROMISE I HOPE I CAN KEEP! Next issue will include a revised mailing list and revised houserules, I hope. That will cost me 16¢, ugh!, so I may blanch at the last moment. After all with a circ. of just under 150 that an additional \$12!
