



THE DIPLOMACY SCENE

- I. the IDA elections;
 - 1. Ballots for this election are now in the mail! There is still time to join and vote, if you do it now! Membership is \$2. For it you will get the DIPLOMACY REVIEW, reduced fees to conventions and many games, plus discounts on other IDA projects to take shape in 1973. Join by sending your money to Walt Buchanan, R3, Lebanon Ind. 46052
 - 2. Who is running, who do I recommend?

As some of you may guess I favor good old Lenard. Why? I have much more club experience that either Edi or Rick. I am president of the IFW which has produced a 24 page photo offset magazine, from a 20 page mimeo and risen from 170 members with a \$1,500/year budget to a club of 540 members with a \$6,500/yr. budget. I have published LD for 1½ years longer than Edi's ARENA and have GM almost three times as many games.

This experience in wargaming gives me a large edge in charting the future and the projects of this new organization. I know that the hobby is looking for a major professional publication of general interest to new players and old hands at the game. I know that such a projected publication can be a continuous source of revenue for years to come. I favor a workable system of enactment of legislation. One in which each project will have to be seperately funded so that the treasurer and the president can withhold funds if the project oversteps its budget without justification. Edi Birsan would tie the idea of a piece of legislation to its budget. The spirit of legislation and intent can not be spelled out and funded in one single bill because new legislation whuld then have to be passed for every new funding of the project.

I do not believe IDA should sanction one system for rating players unless that system would gain a 2/3 vote of all the members of the IDA.

I will pledge you two complete years of service in the IDA, and the biggest and best Diplomacy convention ever, here in Chicago in the summer of '73.

I have the support and the endorsement of both Walter Buchanan and John Boyer. Vote today!

2) Secretaries; I can not, in all fairness, comment of regions on the IGS in 1972 & 1973. Mr. Larry Blandin has shown a growing concern for the Diplomacy community and expressed that view through the publication in MUSINGS. Chic Hilliker has just begun in the hobby, and while his first efforts are excellent, they are but first efforts. Mr. Blandin's longer experience in the hobby gives him the edge.

AT LARGE SECRETARIES: Here I favor Mr. Doug Beyerlein for his continued work in the hobby and my personal opinion of him as a person, having met him a DIPLOCON V. The second choice is more difficult. By John Biehl has shown his good work as Western Regional Secretary. This work, in office in the IDA, sets him above his other two challengers.
