INFORMATION

The Deadline for the Winter Seasons in all applicable games (dependant on any retreats) is by 4pm on Wednesday January 8, 1975. Calls between Noon and Midnight only.

The Deadline for the Spring and Fall Seasons in all applicable games (dependant on any retreats) is by 4PM on Wednesday January 15, 1975.

## WHAT SHOULD I. D. A. BE DOING?

1. The I.D.A. should make immediate contact with new publishers, offering them, free of charge, a booklet on what a Gamemaster should know about procedures in conducting PBM games. The I.D.A. gamemasters would help in this project by acting as personal liaisons with the new GMs.
2. The I.D.A. should NOT be paying the Editor \$200/year while no one else gets a 'salary'. Additional moneys could be provided for a typing and mailing staff, but not just for the personal use of one person. Throwing money at someone will not guarantee his services or his quality.
3. The I.D.A. should be doing its Handbooks via photoffset reproduction so that the final copy could be sold via PBM catalogues, dealers, hobbyshops etc. Word of mouth advertising is ineffective in reaching NEW Diplomacy player sources.
4. The I.D.A. should structure its affairs so that equal participation may be had by ALL its members. Since our two main membership groups exist in Europe (mainly Great Britain) and North America a publication from each of those areas, sort of a "Diplomacy Reader's Digest" could be established in England and the U.S.A. The purpose of the DRD would be to reproduce the top features and news from the magazine s in those two major divisions of our membership. The two products can then be bulk mailed from Britain to the U.S. and vice versa and distributed from their destination.
5. Sample copies of the Diplomacy Review should be being sent to all 'new blood' so that the I.D.A. can bulk mail its North American issues. This doubles the

- interior content at no increase in postal costs.
- 6. The I.D.A. must clean up the Gallamer Award process so that the voters are made more familiar with the material on which they are voting. Important polls and frequent questionnaires to the membership would make the member feel that he is an active part of the organization.
- 7. The I.D.A. should be advertising Diplomacy publications on an ad for ad basis. This policy could be extended to wargaming publications also so as to increase information on the organization.

All of these things, and many others, should have been done by now, but Edi Birsan has not done them. The I.D.A. needs a change. It does not need a president who will do little to help the organization, who will hinder free comment in the Diplomacy Review as Edi Birsan has, and who has made few innovations in making the I.D.A. a better service organization.  
 May I have your vote?


Games for experienced players, other than the one opening in this issue, will not be conducted in LD. There will be a winner's game in LD (ZN) for those who have won a novice game in this magazine.

#### General notes on procedures;

1. Moves proposed in moves are acceptable only during the hours given each issue. Moves given to anyone but myself are acceptable ONLY if followed up by a signed set of orders postmarked within one day of the telephone call.
2. Unordered units, if dislodged, are disbanded.
3. A player will be removed after two consecutive misses of moves (Winter is a 'move only if a retreat and/or adjustment are required. If failure to retreat obviates an adjustment then a miss will not be counted.) and on the next move a substitute will make moves.
4. If a Gamesmaster error is located in the text of a game it must be reported AT ONCE. A deadline WILL NOT be extended due to GM error if the error is reported within the 7 days before the next deadline and the error will not be corrected. Errors that do not effect the course of the next move will be corrected if possible. It is the obligation of EVERY player to note GM errors. ((This ruling is made so that a player(s) can not take advantage of the deadline and use it to obtain information from other players after the deadline to find out that the deadline has been extended.))
5. Acceptable moves after the deadline. Telegrams, Mailgrams and phone calls are NEVER acceptable after the deadline. Letters posted 5 working days before the deadline will be accepted after the deadline due to extraordinary delay by the POSTAL SERVICE if they arrive within 7 days of the NEXT deadline.
6. It is the player's responsibility to notify the GM of any and all address changes. A change within the text of a magazine or personal letter may be disregarded.
7. Orders should contain the Boardman #, date, Country Assignment, Season (Year) and MUST contain the player's signature. Unsigned orders will not be followed.
8. If multiple sets of orders are received the one with the latest date (NOT POSTMARK) will be used. Undated sets will be disregarded over any dated set.
9. Sealed orders are requested from all players. The orders must be specific for each game in which the player is playing and will be used up if they are required due to a missed move.
10. Trophic retreats and adjustments speed the game and are encouraged, but they are NEVER required.
11. The GM will not list possible retreats when a unit is dislodged (D...). I will attempt to note Dislodged and Annihilated units (D&A) but be sure to see that I am accurate and correct. Any OBVIOUS Gamesmaster error will be expected to be corrected by all players and the deadline extension will be granted for such an error.




