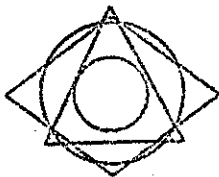

ROD WALKER & GORDON ANDERSON

In BRENWON 95, one of the top postal Diplomacy "political" magazines, we find Rod talking about good old Gordon Anderson. Lord knows the hobby, as a whole, is mentioning this subject, so why not?

Rod takes the position that Gordon's CITEX/"DipCon" should be boycotted because:

- "1. Twice in as many years he has tried to blackmail the IDA into making him their Editor despite the fact that the vast majority of the members want nothing to do with him. He has lied, cheated, threatened, and bullied in vain effort to get something for nothing."

- "2. He has paid off DipCon debts (cash prizes for DipCons VII and VIII) with bad checks and/or flimsy excuses. His latest trick in that regard is a clumsy attempt to place the blame on none other than the game's inventor, Allan Calhauer. He pretended that he had applied for a trademark for "DipCon".

- "4. Anderson has published the most unbelievable and scurrilous lies about some of the best people in the hobby...including John Boyer, Gail Weiger, Ed. Birsan, Allan Calhauer, Walt Buchanan, John Root and others."

"His behavior is utterly antisocial, negative, destructive, and selfish. The hobby owes him a vote of "no confidence". We have at our disposal one powerful and effective weapon. I urge you to use it. **BOYCOTT "CITEX-76"** Pass it on."

In an earlier paragraph Rod says; "I am further asking that you get everyone you know to do the same, ((boycott Citex/DipCon)) especially any business firms which might otherwise be wasting their time and money getting involved with a losing proposition."

We all know that boycotts can be effective, and legal (Cesar Chavez vs. lettuce and grape growers, o.g.). Yet the line between legal boycott and liable can be a thin one. I would ask our "lawyers" to define these points for us and tell us their opinions of what we may/may not say in print.

 ABOUT THAT PUBLISHER's Handbook.....

Rod Walker says; "I have some positive things, some negative things, and a definite thing to say about it ((the Handbook)). The definite thing is; buy a copy, by all means!"

"Len is, God knows((but He didn't tell!)), not the best writer or speller. I winced when he said that most of the Handbook had to be written by himself because input was spotty from others. ((Thanks!)) The final result was not the literary disaster I had expected...it's not bad at all. The best bit is in a section where Len advises everyone to brush up on grammar, spelling, syntax and like that (without making a single error (um, a single major error) himself), and ends with a quotation... "The pen, having (sic) writ,..." Oh, well...."

"Quite frankly, this little (28 pages) booklet((remember it is photo reduced so it is equal to about 45 pages of mimeo/ditto)) is the most informative thing I've seen in the hobby. Ever. It may not tell you everything you need to know about publishing, but I can not tell you anything it has left out. At \$2.50 ((\$2 for IDA members)) it's a frigging bargain. The articles it contains are thorough, informative, and even interesting. The layout and presentation is about as good as I've seen anywhere in the hobby: it's clear and readable, not at all crowded or jumbled. Len has devoted a great deal of care to making this a most presentable and worthwhile booklet. He has succeeded.I strongly suggest you get one now. If good work goes not unrewarded, this will be a sell-out before the end of the summer."

BLUSH!

I still have to make a few comments. I chided everyone about correct usage and proofreading when I KNOW I am one of the major offenders. From reading LD you can tell that I do not proofread very well. I usually mail the issue and then sit down to read it--moaning at all of the typos--which is what most of the errors are.

In doing the Publisher's Handbook I proofed the material 4 separate times before I typed it. In this way I got out many of the errors. As I typed I went back over (almost) every paragraph and corrected typos. While there are still 2-3 typos per page/at least/ it is much better than my usual effort. I was aware that when I took on this job I could not write the booklet on the typewriter--which is what I do with LD (you say you can tell that!).

I SHOULD have put in another 10 hours in getting all of the bugs I could find out of the copy before it went to the printer and then have someone proof that. But I had put in 135 hours already and it was already VERY late! So I went ahead and sent it to Walt. The only major layout errors I have found are a few places where "Continued to page, or continued from page X" have been omitted. This produces only a minor problem in reading 3 of 28 articles.

I suppose one short story should accompany this. I had invited Rich Swies over to my apartment to help me proof the booklet before I had typed a great deal of it. We had dinner (and a bottle of wine--alot!). After dinner, we were both a bit high, we were to proof the Booklet. We decided to cast lots to determine what we would do; Proof the Booklet, Go out and drink or buy another bottle. Proofreading won and buy another bottle came in second. So we went out and drank.

Sorry about that!

We have sold 17 so far and given out 13 for review. Only 265 left. Better hurry!! Booklets WILL be available at Dupon (Baltimore) and Gordon (Lake Geneva).

From Lew Pulsipher

The following was sent to me with the note: "Print all of it if you print any of it. ...otherwise I'll have to go through DR." Isn't that a fun way to get your material printed? Lew can't seem to tire of seeing himself in some authoritarian role. He is singularly indefatigable in giving us his opinion under the banner of truth.

In LD #66 I printed an article on Diplomacy Conventions. Walt Buchanan has said he will reproduce it in DIPLOMACY WORLD as rebuttal to Lew's article on conventions. As many of you may know Lew also syndicates a column in PAROXYSM, IMPASSABLE, THE POORST ARMENIAN and SECURUM. I could submit material there also to refute/rebut Lew's opinions but then I would just add to the problem Scott Rosenberg recently denounced with the statement: "We would also all be much better off if Sacks does not write a 4-page reply to this, as I know he will, and then Lew will write 5 pages responding to that. Lord help us all!"

Lew now wants me to take pages in LD to add yet another forum to his empire. I would then reply to that and so forth. I am not in agreement with the reply Lew has sent me but I do not intend to go on here with such a debate. Let Lew use DR, DS, IMP, PAR, TPA or SPEC. LD is closed to him. This is my magazine and it is and will be used for my opinions. I seriously doubt if there can be 5 readers of mine who do not receive at least one of the 6 publications listed above. Do you want to read the same DEBATE 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and then 7 times????

I have replied to Lew's "criticism", once tongue in cheek in SPECULUM and once seriously in IMPASSABLE (next issue). PAROXYSM does not want any part of it and I have not seen anything in TPA so I assume Scott has let it blow over too.

I HAVE ABSOLUTELY NOTHING PERSONAL AGAINST LEW. I think he is too opinionated, too verbose and too sure he is right. What is ALL that I disagree with him about on general principle? I think Ron Holly is in too many games. I think Lew has too large a forum. Does that make me bad?

DIPLOMACY SCORE

For those of you who do not already know it DIPLOMACY has been sold to the AVALON HILL COMPANY. In a recent note Edil Bluman says he's going there on the 8th of March to have a long talk with Don Greenwood (and probably Tom Shaw) about the hobby and AH.

I have had quite a number of dealings with AH in past years when I was associated with the INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF WARGAMING. At that time I found Tom Shaw a very easy person to deal with. He enjoyed the hobby of wargaming and did all he could to foster it. Tom and I have met on a number of occasions in Chicago and in Baltimore. I have met Don Greenwood and he too is an avid wargaming, being former editor of PANZERFAUST before going to work for AH.

AH has always been very good about "variants" of its games and thus I do not fear amateur use of some of the DIPLOMACY treatments. I also think that AH will help the hobby as much, if not more, than G&H did. One does not cut off one's nose to spite one's face! The hobby of wargaming (that is the hard core hobby) has done a lot for AH both in sales, in new talent, in ideas, in conventions, etc. AH has gotten a great deal of free publicity, almost all of it felicitous, from gamers and organized hobbyists. The Diplomacy community, for all of the debate and discussion (on occasion) is likely the MOST organized in the wargaming world. AH has at its disposal a number of IHM treatments already established by LONG tradition. AH is not about to throw that away.

Calm your fears!

In IMPASSABLE #62, here today, we find more comment about the Publisher's Handbook. John says: "This offset handbook for publishers is very well written (though much of it by Len Lakoff) ((Do you get the feeling that I am being told something by all of these kind remarks?)) and is a bargain at \$2.50/\$2. This has EVERYTHING you would need to know about publishing a postal Diggysine! Highly recommended, even for us established publishers! As a result of reading it, any future games in IMPASSABLE will use subscription payment rather than the old lump sum system."

IMPASSABLE also has plenty of news and games. Recommended. John Boyer, 117 Garland Dr., Carlisle, PA 17013 10/82.

...then there is this CHASTLY picture of me in TURNABOUT! I was reading the issue on the "L" on the way to work. A lady sitting next to me looked at the picture and then held her hand to her mouth--she looked up at my face and fainted. See, it's not lifelike!

Also here today is SPECULUM #30. It's back page lists all of the zines that use to be reviewed therein before the zine started to fill with politics and opinions. It seems to me that the two pages of reviews were FAR MORE beneficial to the hobby than the great amount of letters and columns now in SPECULUM. Others may disagree of course.

In the issue is the text of the form letter sent by Gordon Anderson to us on the Council. The first paragraph seems to vary but the 11 points made by Gordon seem to be the same. The opening of Dave's copy tells us that we should not listen to Rod Walker concerning the Diplo trademark. The reason being that "Rod is not a lawyer." Gordon, do you stand before the bar?

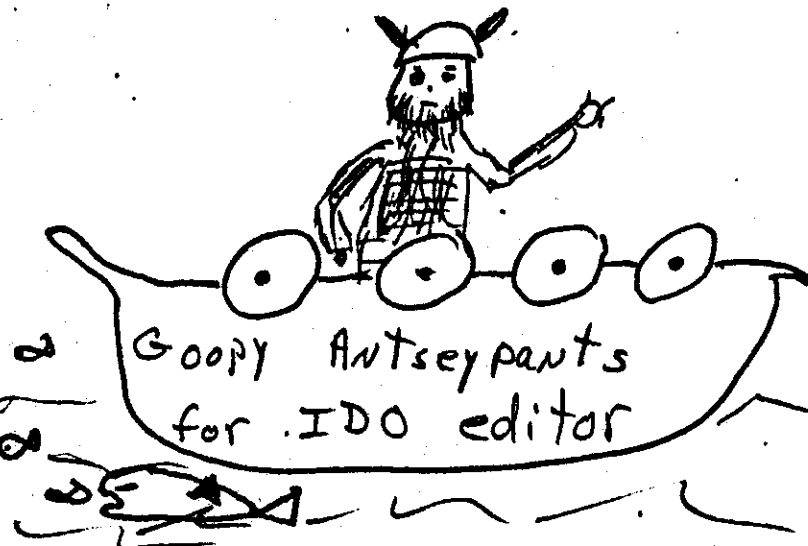

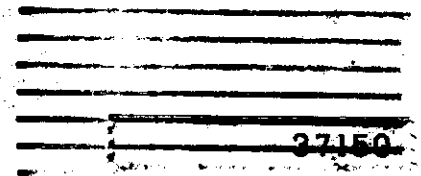
