DRAWS IN DIPLOMACY

In the short time that I have played dippy, I have noticed a large controversy over drawn games. Most people would seem to deplore this type of game ind, at least publicly, yet the drawn games becomes more and more prevalent. Why?

Look at chess for a moment. In tournament play, especially among grandmasters, a draw is a way of life. Players who win the first game or two in a series frequently go for the draw in succeeding games, hoping to hang on and win.

As in chess, a draw in Diplomacy may be formed either when a true stalemate position occurs, or when a player asks for a draw. This is slightly harder to achieve in Dippy as all remaining players must vote unanimously to achieve the draw.

Draws...con't.

Most players agree that once a stalemate position has been reached the game may be satisfactorily ended in a draw. (After all, what else can you do?) It is the voted draw that has come under criticism. While I agree that a game should be played out to a reasonable conclusion to determine if any of the victorious allies will stab one another, I see nothing wrong with 2 or 3 allies who have fought together throughout the game declaring a draw when all other threats have been removed. All it means is that these players have an alliance and are honorable enough to keep it and not stab each other.

As in chess, where tournaments are designed to accommodate draws, Dippy tournaments and rating systems have to take draws into account one way or another.

Whether we like it or not, draws are here to stay, and will be common. Even though the rare solo win is what a player should strive for, a person who keeps stalemate lines in mind in the latter stages of the game will be more successful, at least in the ratings, in the long run.

((No arguement here, Paul. A couple of additions though. I am personally against a draw that includes a country that has no business being in the draw, that being a 1, 2 or 3 center country. Also I am very anti-player ratings. Some people do some very odd things under the guise of ratings. Thank for the article Paul, this is a free issue for you.))
