A Few Responces to Last Issues Article on Cross Game Alliances.

Dave Ditter--"In any game there is one essential need at the start. That is the ability for any player to win. More often, than not, called fairness.

Any cross-game alliance violates this principle. If there is any ethical question on "Diplomacy" it resolves around this occurance. I for one think cross-gamers are weaklings, bad diplomats and (the worst) unethical!! (I have other, more descriptive terms given in oral arguments).

When I start any diplomacy game I start on my own. Any alliances are weighed by comparing letters, offers, tactics and the entire play of the board in general. That is some alliances force you to make other alliances.

I can understand some bad players, maybe getting a cross-game alliance going, but what really upsets me is when two good players set one up. With just average letter writing and crafty, coordinated moves they have tremendous odds at winning the game.

Stop and think that it takes 3 countries to stop and counter the combined attacks of two. Couple this with the fact that (more than likely) there are one or two countries behind, next to or between the 5 involved countries to throw the game in the cross-gamers favor. (Again with a little intelligent cross-gamer letter writing.)

Any time a cross-game alliance is set up the rest of the players suffer. It really makes the game unenjoyable.

- It removes these possibilities from the game:
- 1. That one ally will stab the other.
- 2. That with good letter writing the above will happen.
- 3. If you're unaware of it: a) you can be effectively set up and stabbed, b) you can be out numbered by it, c) Sometimes you have much to offer and tactically you'd be the wisest choice for an alliance—which isn't possible with cross-gamers.
- 4. It's no fun crying wolf and carrying a grudge throughout. It takes certain, enjoyable dimensions out of the game.

I am sure that there are other reasons that people have. I'm convinced that spontaneity is a necessary part of "Diplomacy". I enjoy starting a new game with new faces and styles. When I discover cross-gamers it ruins the game and the fun.

There is no solution around cross-game alliances. I do think that the cross-gamers are unfair and should simply play other cross-gamers like 4:3, 3:3:1, 2:5, 2:2:3 ratios concerning countries. Jerry, maybe you can start a new varient.

I've often thought of simply sending a list of my past games to the GM of a new game and ask not to be put in a game with any or some of the players. (Whether I won the game or not.)

Oh well, I'm talked out. (Maybe I can discuss it with some of you at DipCon.)"

Bob Sergeant--"The point to Diplomacy is indeed winning. However, we're trying to win $\underline{\Lambda}$ game. We are supposed to be trying to win by being just a little more clever, a little more misleading, a little more adept than the other 6 people in the game.

By utilizing pressure by threatening to stab in another game, you are bringing an advantage into the game that the other players are unaware of and cannot deal with. Even if the other players knew that the two players in the game were allied in another game, they would have no reason to believe that that would influence the game, other than the natural tendencies to ally with players you know-

If you use cross games threats, and you win the game, you haven't won because you were more clever, you've won because you happened to be in another game which a second player didn't want to lose. I don't play cross game alliances. I will ally with players I have fought before and I will attack players I am presently allied with. Because I feel that the pointo fo Diplomacy is to try to take advantage of what's happening in this one game to do my best in this one game..."

((Thank gentlemen. I really couldn't have put it into words better myself. In fact I have begun finding out just exactly who is in the game before I sign up for it. I enjoy meeting new people and playing new games without having to fear reprisals in another game--JHJ))

Support Your Local GN

I am going to use this space to offer a few suggestions on how you can make my job easier, and possibly that of other GMs.

It is very important and extremely helpful if every player would attempt to separate his moves, if he is in more than one game in a zine. (are you reading this Leland) It doesn't have to be on separate sheets of paper, but that is best, but at least try to leave some space between orders and try to use a large space of paper for your orders. Let me explain. This is how I handle my games, and I assume that other GMs do the same. I have a filing bin which is separated for each game and as the orders come in I put them into their respective file. Then after half of the orders are in I put the moves down on a work sheet. So the first problem arises when I open the mail. If all of the orders are on one page I am forced to tear the pages apart, cut them in some instances, and then file them. It's really no big thing but any help that can be given would be appreciated. The most important part that the players should be concern with is if they put their orders on small strips of paper. Things have a tendency to get lost in the bottom of the filling campartments. Therefore the orders may get losted and if there should happen to be a little press I may not see it hence it doesn't get printed.

Another thing to remember is try to us a separate piece of paper for comments to me, Diplomacy letters and/or articles (especially never put it on the back of the page of orders.) I enjoy hearing from you and whenever possible I want to try and answer your questions and/or comments either in the zine or by letter. Now questions on the back of orders have a tendency to become forgotten when they are on the back of the orders. What I do is put all correspondence on the peg board above my desk so that I can see it until needed.

Should you move make sure that I see your COA. Don't expect me to notice it on your envelope. Write it inside somewhere.

If I make an error in the game try to tell me immediately. I'll always try to correct any errors in time so as not to slow up the game. Don't expect me to see it or that someone else will tell me. Call me stupid or whatever but let me know ASAP.

Finally, don't get upset if I don't answer your questions or letters immediately. Primarily in the first week following a deadline. After spending all day Saturday and the morning of Sunday working on the zine I am just about Diplomacized out. But I will get back to you or get your letter to the proper person.


So if you follow these basic guidelines you will be a better person and we can have peace without dishonor.
