The First Official LDNS Players Rating:

This system is not totally comprehensive but I think that it is fairly fair and even if it isn't its fun for me to do.

So here is how the system works: The basic number is found by dividing your total number of supply centers by the number of Fall turns played. Multiply that number by 2. Add to that the number of players that you are doing beter than. Now divide that number by the number of games you are in as the original player. For the winner points they run like this: Company of the second

Winner: 6pts

2 way draw: 3 pts cach 2 pts each 3 way draw: 4 way draw: 1 pt each

5 way draw: 0.5 pts each

6 way draw: 0.25 pts each

7 way draw: 0.00 pts

That number will be divided by the number of games and added the the first number that we arrived with from the above paragraph.

These points are not divided by the number of games and Bonus Points: are added after the above figuring is done.

Should you complete the entire game win lose . or draw: 0.2 times your points for that game.

Should you lose all of your units but have played the entire game, at least until you were out= 0.1 pointw per Fall turn. You lose 0.2 points every time you NMR.

Standby's: Counts if it is equal to or better than your current standing.

Adds one game to your game number total.

Resign: No charge.

# Reprint from LDNS #1 (with a few additions)

#### DIPLOMACY DEFINITIONS

Some of the beginners to Diplomacy have asked for a dictionary with the meanings of some of the terms used in Diplomacy play. is such a dictionary.

Alliance: When a player says that he wishes to form an alliance this means that he is planning to invade your homeland in the Fall. This practice started when an overly paranoid player felt the mailman was reading his moves and passing them on to his opponents. Civil Disorder: The best way to describe this is by using it in a

sentence; "Civil, disorder was to Brest, not Picardy."

COA: "Can't Offer Alliance". A GM may put at the bottom of the moves that a player is COA. This means that he has been proven untrustworthy and any agreements that you have with him should now be ignored.

Coastal Creep: You will find this often throughout your Diplomacy play, especially when playing with someone from the West Coast. As soon as he stabs someone everyone will be calling him a Caastal Creep.

DipCon: A Disease. Symptoms are a strong desire to stab someone face to face. Only cure know is a long trip. diseased went to California. This year many of the

Dippy: A term used to describe a person who stayed up all night trying to figure out whether to move to Denmark or Holland. This article could also be termed Dippy.

GM: An abbreviation standing for Glorious Master. I am a GM.
Lepanto: This is an Italian word for "Peace". You will hear this word often when playing Turkey. When you hear that the Italian is using a Lepanto opening welcome him with open arms, especially when I am playing Italy when I am playing Italy.

Neutrality: See alliance.

Non-agression Pact: See Neutrality.
Postal Service: A German phrase for "slow movement".
Zine: A shortened form of the word newspaper.

THE TURKISH EMPIRE will continue to fight the Austrian invaders as long as one unit is intact. A draw with Austria as the partial winner is unacceptable.


PARIS: The French government has no choice but to declare war on underhanded, notorious Turks. You will pay in blood for your slanderous remarks about our cousins.






