1978 Analysis by Eric Verheiden

The only development of significance this season was the apparent rapprochaent between Turkey and Mitter's Italy. Italy of course has little choice in the matter, but Turkey may well have and that makes

next season of some interest. In a surprise stab, Turkey could well take all of Italy's home centers, leaving him with Tunis and one mischief-making unit. What would Turkey lose? Very little, actually. The west belongs to England and Germany and Italy is of limited usefulness in Austria, where help might be useful. A deal with Russia would come close to sealing a stalemate and this is all Turkey can reasonably hope for.

In the west, France's fleets will serve as a temporary dividing line between east and west until Spain and Portugal fall. No changes in the alliance between England and Germany are expected, however two builds for England will balance the forces of the two allies. The main potential destabilizing factor for the western alliance would be success in the east. Germany does have a chance of breaking the eastern lines, but the tawtics must be very precise and all pooprtunities exploited the the fullest to prevent Turkey from stabilizing the eastern lines permanently — and then to ward off a faithful English ally if the game degenerates into a free-for-all.

THOSE LIES, THEM DECEPTION, AND ALL SORTS OF NEFARIOUS SCHEMES or How Many Times Can You Lie and Thy?

Just how many times can we do it? Lie! Yes lie. Also fib, tell untruths, present misleading facts, blend facts with utter tomrot, confuse the issue with untrue inuendo, recind a previous lie and then reuse it again in a different guise, and all sorts of things like this. How many times can we lie to a person or persons and still be playing the game according to the Guru Alan B. Calhamer? The answer to this is personal to each of us but, like a democracy, we are each entitled to our own beliefs and pursuit of diplomatic happiness. No rule exists which state, Thou shalt not overlie or multifib."

We are not dealing with a game of mere tactics-by-mail. (See my article in DIPLOMACY WORLD entitled "Funny Animals" Vol. 3 No. 4 Winter 1976). There are people and personalities out there. Writing The more the better. One cannot influence anything on is essential. the map just by sitting home and dashing off the moves periodically. To ones allys (of the moment or seemingly permanent) one needs to maintain the link of communication just so as to let it be known that anything, something, everything or nothing is going on diplomatically. Complicated strategies might have to be hashed out. Silence between allies is poison. "Why isn't he writing to me? I smell a stab!" In an effort to prevent such occurences frequent writing, taking into account the type of player, is necessary but the truth must play a heavy roll. No real lie or fibbaroo should pass ones pen. Lovalty and truth are needed to offset the lies sent elsewhere. This brings us to the raison d'etre of this article.

The enemy. After the doublespeak of 1901 and the clash of interests you get one, two or (omigawd) three of these as neighbors. In fact they don't even have to be neighbors. Certainly nobody would believe that one must tell ones enemies anything but misleading blather. Because Keplomacy is communication, silence is poison and we can't let our opponent(s) know what's coming off we must wielt the weapon of untruth as often as is deemed necessary.

Untrue communication can be used as a tool to 1.) mislead, weaken communication between two enemies, 2) infuriate an opponent into irrational moves, 3) raise the hopes of the most threatening enemy then dash them (repeatedly if necessary and possible), 4) cause an adversary to always expect a lie and a negative move so that the opposite can occur safely, 5) keep the channels of communication open to the opposition so that a reversal of policy is possible, even if it be a remote possibility, and 6) keep the whole game open to the shifting sands of time, through, trust, distrust and innumerable shades of gray regarding perception.

Motive is important. Pure vindictive lying as a bug-a-boo of considerable proportions. The only acceptable motive for lying and nefarious scheming is profitablify. This is the goal. It doesn't matter if you are a player who believes in gobbling up every available center as soon as possible or if you are the buttoned down soul who doesn't see any long term safety in growing very rapidly. The goal of growth is the reason for the hodge-podge of untrue hooey that flows from your pen. If it keeps your enemy at bay, GREAT! If it befuddles him while

he is obviously going to be blotted out its NEEDLESS. Any grudge carried over from another game is reprehensible.

Nothing, lastly, exists in a vacuum. Lies are wonderful but they are non-existant without their counterparts truth. Diplomacy is then a scale but its a scale of four parts. Truth and untruth balance each other. Communication and timing balance each other too and all four also balance one another. All tactics and strategy come from these four elements. One must always do each one of the four.

In quich summation Always lie

Always tell the truth
Always communicate

Always do all of the above for the right reason at the right time.

You may do as much as you want as long as you do all four equally.
