The crime was committed - the witnesses testified - the execution is ordered and carried out. No, I'm not talking about Robert Alton Harris, who became the first person executed in California in 25 years (and who may very well become the last person executed in the gas chamber at the state prison in San Quentin, located about a mile from where this is being typed); that was more a case of "the crime was committed, the conviction and sentence are automatically appealed, the sentence is upheld, the execution is ordered, the defense tied up the case with every appeal imaginable.

for 12 years, and the execution is carried out". I'm referring to your typical California inner city (although this probably applies to other states as well): the witnesses testified against a drug dealer, and the dealer (or his "superiors") order and carry out the execution against the witnesses - or, more likely, the witnesses' families. There is no doubt that *this* death penalty is an effective deterrent; fewer and fewer people are willing to testify.

Irony of the times: back in 1978, Dan White, who assassinated San Francisco's Mayor and one of the city supervisors, was convicted of manslaughter (and acquitted of murder) and sentenced to about five years in prison. The sentence resulted in a major riot that included twelve police cars being turned over and burned. Eventually, White was released - and later committed suicide (by asphyxiation, no less). Had he been found guilty of murder and sentenced to death, chances are he'd still be alive...

Irony #2: a few years ago, California tried to change its method of execution from cyanide gas to lethal injection, but the ACLU lobbied against it - almost certainly because it's a lot easier to delay an execution on the grounds that gas is cruel and unusual punishment, which is exactly what the ACLU tried to do. On top of that, they got a judge to order that the execution be videotaped as evidence in a lawsuit that is attempting to have the gas chamber declared an illegal form of execution. (Nothing new about this; the gas chamber replaced hanging in the 1930s.)






